Report to the 49th Annual Meeting - Prince Edward Island School Athletic Association.

Here we are one year later . . . there have been reviews and reports; the learning curve has been intense. It has been an interesting year of process and transition for the Organization. While there has been some change, it has largely been business as usual, School Sport has continued on through the support of the membership and volunteers.

The concerns, which were identified of the organization through the ACA Report, have been addressed. These included accountability, authority, structure, and vision.

Through the leadership of Walter MacEwen, Counsel Nichola Hewitt, and the contribution of an SAA governance committee; a Minister's Directive was drafted.

Subsequently, the PEISAA has become a legal entity, the "name" has been registered, and a Rules-Guidelines-Policies document restructured. The PEISAA has the authority to administer School Sport in the province.

Highlights of the year included;

- The release of a School Coach Module; a joint project of the Coaching Association of Canada and the Canadian School Sport Federation, which will address coaching certification.
- A new era in Track & Field with the move to Alumni Canada Games Place.
- Flag Football garnered sport status and witnessed the presentation of SAA football awards for the first time in 30-years.
- Utilized the great venue; the Slemon Park Canada Games Facility for two Championships.
- Established a Media-Publicity commissioner role to raise the awareness and profile of School Sport.
- Publication of a PEISAA Newsletter, which is published three times per year.

Challenges or projects that are on the horizon for the Executive and Organization;

- A celebration of the organization in 2011 as the PEISAA reaches the milestone of its 50th Anniversary.
- Planning establishing a vision for the organization both short and long term.
- Sponsorship is a sensitive issue, which may need to be addressed.

Walter MacEwen for his leadership with the governance committee and mentorship.

5. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

The website continued to facilitate score keeping and scheduling, etc., although we all realize that there is room for improvement, the website is a definite asset and I look forward to seeing more changes and comprehensive pages next season – Great job and congratulations to our web technicians!

Compared to last season, where some schools needed to be reminded of the rule concerning changing and exposing bare skin on the court between warm-up and game time, this was not an issue this season. Thank you to all whom helped reinforce this rule in all of our Island gyms.

Thank you to officials for their work this season. A reminder to please help train score keepers and have officials verify and ensure that all information is documented on official score sheets, including date, competition (A, AA, women or men), school names, etc. which facilitate the commissioner's job immensely in keeping accurate statistics. Officials need to make it a priority to complete the entire score sheet before they sign off; ask coaches/ captains/ ADs to quickly go over score sheets and fill in any missing blanks before leaving – thank you for your co-operation!

Thank you to our major corporate partners; PEI School Milk Foundation, RBC Financial, Subway, Comfort Inn. U.P.E.I., and Holland College without whom, it would be very

difficult to provide such a rich sport program to PEI's high school athletes.

Thank you to all PEISAA executive members, athletic directors, volunteers, coaches, parents, school staff, bus drivers, student councils, leadership classes, and everyone else involved who so generously devote their time and energy to help and support and enhance our school sports and ultimately the young developing athletes' overall experiences.

A special mention to PEISAA's School Athletics Coordinator Rick MacKinnon. All your time and energy and hard work are all very much appreciated. We recognize that your responsibilities are very extensive and most of it is done without any recognition.

Congratulations for all that you have accomplished thus far! Rick, you are very much appreciated.

5. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

More training clinics for officials and better communication to ensure consistent level of officiating throughout the season, appropriate to the level of each league division, to support and encourage the development of good ball-handling techniques by young players (so that they do not develop bad habits).

During the Championships, there needs to be only one main entrance and if people try to enter from another door, a guard needs to be present to redirect them to the main entrance. The main entrance needs to be manned prior to the warm-up of the first match and for the entire duration of the Provincial tournament. Volunteers at these tables need to exert a high level of leadership so that they are not shy or afraid to ask people to pay the entrance fee. The entrance fee helps in paying for officials, etc.

Despite high transportation costs and busy schedules, it would be ideal to play 2 pt matches only, instead of some 4 pt matches. Heightened pressure and stress are a result for these young athletes and coaches, and especially when the match is tight, the second 2 pt match would be better to really accurately illustrate the teams' performances. 4 pt matches should be avoided, especially at the beginning of the season. The season is already very short, 4 pt matches lowers the young athletes' floor time, and allows them less time to play!

I propose that the week before the PEISAA Championships that the second place teams in the east and west host the third place teams in each league. The two first place teams would get a bye to the provincial championships. This would add more importance to the zone championships. After playing the zone semi-finals, the winners would play with the winner of the final going to the provincials and the loser having to play a provincial quarter-final. The two zone semi-final losers would then play with the winner of the match getting another chance by playing the other league's second place team.

I think all uniforms should have number on the front as well as the back. It is a huge advantage to teams with no front numbers as the opposition will have a difficulty identifying setters, blockers, etc.

Despite what Volleyball Canada proposes, I believe the PEISAA should stay the course with the libero being allowed at all levels and the 12-sub rule being also used at all levels. I also believe we should continue with allowing the over-hand contact on serve reception provided it is done cleanly.

Sometime in the 2009-2010 school years, coaches should get together to discuss recommendations from all volleyball commissioners with the purpose of getting ready for the 2010-11 season.

A) SCHEDULING

A Triple Round Robin for the midget league appears to be the right number of games. The first round- robin of games is in the format of a tournament and is held at the beginning of the midget season. Therefore the midget teams will only travel for three away games for the rest of their season. The Sr. High School league is a Triple Round Robin. The reason for this was that the UPEI Field Hockey Team was attending the OUA Championships in London, Ontario on PEISAA Provincial Championship week-end. This

The All Star meeting was held Friday, Oct 16th of Teachers' Convention- at 7:30am. The coaches thought this was a great idea since coaches (that are teachers) are in Charlottetown attending the convention. Also, having the All Star meeting before Provincials, means we can hand out certificates at the Provincial Championships.

The commissioner should be present at the All-Star meeting as this is a good time to discuss concerns. Example: The senior high schools would like to play more of their league games on the turf. Hopefully with Three Oaks new turf field their games will be played on turf in 2010. The two high school semi-finals were played on the Cornwall Turf and the championships games on the UPEI Turf. High school coaches requested to have semi-finals on turf.

In 2007 East Wiltshire Junior High School moved their home games to Cornwall Turf Field, as did Stonepark Junior High. Stonepark moved their home games to UPEI Turf Field. This move to turf fields has greatly improved **playing conditions** which in turn improved their play. Junior High schools had 15 of their 22 games on turf. With the opening of the turf field in Summerside for 2010...midget will play only 3 or 4 games on grass. High Schools had 12 of their 22 games on turf. 4. GENERAL COMMENTS

The 2009-10 Senior High golf season experienced a drop in participation as the reality of travel issues resulted in many schools reducing the number of students involved in golf. This , unfortunate situation, needs to be addressed if golf is to maintain its historical trend of increasing participation each after year. 10 high schools were involved in the qualifying tournaments with 7 moving on to the Provincials hosted at Brudenell. A schedule was sent out to all schools prior to the season and schools were asked to indicate which tournaments they would participate in 1 week prior to each tournament.

The championship qualification format used in 2008-09 was used again this year and resulted in 33 men and 3 women being involved in the championship. The championship was hosted at Brudenell River and the facility was again provided free of charge. Mark Derry and his staff must be thanked for their willingness to help facilitate the championship.

Thanks to all the coaches for the time they put into this year's golf season as well as Paul Steele at the PEISAA office. Thanks to Paul Murnaghan and the Holland College golf administration program for helping to facilitate the senior golf championship. There involvement has really increased the PEISAA's ability to host a good tournament for the students .

5. RECOMMENDATIONS

Maintain the administration of the tournaments with the golf commissioner.

Maintain the championship qualification format, but increase the female qualifications to two tournaments.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

The season began with the "scheduling meeting" in mid- November, 2009. This was held at Ch'town Rural High School. In attendance were the Athletic Directors, Rick MacKinnon, Walter MacEwen, and myself. It was decided to stay with a seeding system. Teams were to play a minimum of ten(10) games against at least five(5) other teams. A three(3) division playoff would be held to determine provincial champions. If a school wanted to compete at a higher or lower level for Provincials, they must apply to the PEISAA by Feb.1. Athletic Directors put their schedules together and Rick and Walter had these put on the PEISAA website.

The Leagues commenced on Nov.23 with fourteen(14) female teams and fourteen(14) male teams. Unfortunately, Kinkora's Mens team dropped out because of lack of committment from it's players. Kinkora's Women's team played out their scheduled games but were forced to miss the provincials for similar reasons. Well over 200 games were played with very little rescheduling needed because of weather.

A five(5) person seeding committee was formed. This included myself, Garth Turtle, Brett Wood, Rick MacKinnon, and Walter MacEwen. This group met four(4) times during the season..at the end of Dec., Jan., mid Feb., and the end of Feb..

The regular season ended on Feb.25. The playoffs ran from March 1 to March 8 with a few changes due to school cancellations.

Final League rankings, playoff results, scoring stats, and Playoff All-stars are included later in this report.

The season concluded with the annual All-Star games. These were held at Charlottetown Rural on Wed., March 10 (AA) and Thur., March 11 (AAA).

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

The 2010 school gymnastics season ended on Saturday, February 20th with the PEI School Athletic Association Provincial Gymnastics Championship at Kensington Intermediate Senior High School. The championship was hosted by St. Louis Elementary School.

West Royalty Elementary won the Pre Novice Boys team title. West Kent won the Pre Novice Girls and Novice Girls team titles. St. Louis Elementary won the Novice Boys and the Novice AA Girls team titles. The top five scores on each events were used to calculate the team standing. Individual awards were also given to the top six vault /floor routines and top ten all around. A total of 325 gymnasts participated at this years event. This was a increase of 47 gymnast.

On Saturday morning the competition started and finished on time. A total of 157 gymnasts participated with 90 Pre Novice girls and 67 Pre Novice boys. Increase of 25.

On Saturday afternoon, another big crowd watched 131 gymnasts perform in the Novice Boys, Novice Girls and Novice AA Girls categories. There were 51 Novice boys, 62 Novice girls and 18 Novice AA girls participating. In the third competition, we had a total of 37 gymnasts participate in Bantam Boys, Bantam Girls and Midget Girls categories.

All information and results were posted in the three local papers and two radio stations. Coverage before and after the provincial was very good.

In all, we had a total of 22 different schools from across PEI participate with a total of 325 gymnasts, a increase of 47. The weather was great for traveling. We had a total of 374 paid spectators. This was an increase of 92 paid spectators.

A total of 24 extra ribbons were ordered to deal with ties on vault, floor and all around awards.

Our computer program, which calculated the results, came through for us again. Within minutes of the end of both competitions, the results were handed out.

A new Novice AA Girls category was introduce as a trial this year. We had 18 females and two registered team.

A special thank you to Rick MacKinnon for helping me during the day.

I would like to thank Marybeth Rogers and, Principal George Aiken for all their help, support and for allowing us to use their fine facility to host our Provincial.

Freddy Matins, Rick MacKinnon and our special guest Hugh Smith were also on hand to give out awards. Hugh Smith, member of the RBC Royal Bank Olympian Program was on hand to watch the event and encouraged the youngsters to pursue their dream.

We can't forget PEI School milk Foundation for their continuous support and of course for the free chocolate milk for all the competitors. I also have to thank all the Unit managers for holding their zone competitions and sending me all the results and to you, the Phys. Ed. teachers for getting your athletes ready to compete. Great job!

5. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

To use a 15 minute general warm up followed by a apparatus warm procedure up two compete one on vault and floor. This will eliminate the 30 minute warm up at the start of the competition.

Unless we use a better way of determining teams moving up to AA levels from each unit for provincials, I recommend that we not pursue the AA level next year.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

The PEISAA/Black Knight provincial badminton championships were held on Friday April 23 and Saturday April 24, at the Canada Games Sports Center in Slemon Park and three Summerside and area schools.

Championship titles in novice, bantam, midget, juvenile and senior boys and girls categories were all up for grabs in singles, doubles and mixed play. Most of our Island schools were represented in zone playoffs, with the top two from four zones advancing to the provincials.

Dakota Cameron from Three Oaks was victorious in senior boys singles defeating Greg McGuire also from Three Oaks 21-10 and 21-19. Westisle dominated doubles play with Whitney and Jenna Gallant finishing first and Sam Sweet and Abbie-Anne Lidstone finishing second. Also the mixed doubles team of Brandon Boyce and Julia Phillips finishing third giving Westisle the title with 13 points. Hailey Pound from Rural defeated Whitney Gallant 21-18 and 21-14 to claim the bronze medal.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

The Canada Games Sports Centre worked very well this year. The Friday night round robin in pools went very smoothly. The singles finals on Saturday was good but seating and being too crowded became an issue during the doubles in the afternoon. Using 6 of the 8 courts for the doubles would be a better idea. This way the two courts in front of the bleachers would not be used. They are very close to the spectators and it is hard to play with so many people so close to the courts. This would increase the seating for the doubles which draws more spectators and more players waiting to play. The draw would have to be changed and the afternoon would become a bit longer, but the teams would have more room to play without using the two courts that are next to the bleachers. Also, they are planning to have more bleachers so seating would be increased. All in all the new venue worked very well and the championships were a success.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

I was unable to acquire a school in the Summerside area that would meet the requirements as The Host School for the 2009-2010 Provincial Wrestling Tournament. So, we held the tournament in the Canada Games Centre and the venue was exceptional. I would like to thank Draw Master Tim Murphy and his team, Yvonne Cummisky and Pamela MacEachern, for their efforts during our Provincial Tournament. Thanks to Chris Beauvais and the Canada Games Centre staff, Colin Banfield (Summerside Wrestling Club coach) and the Atlantic Police Academy for their assistance. Thanks to Timothy Chen for his help on the medical side of the sport. Thanks to the WPEI clubs for the lend of their mats. Thanks to Peter Gallant and SIS for the lend of their sound system. Thanks also to the Head Official, Johnathan Kemp, the referees and minor officials for their tireless work. Thanks to Milk Sport, Royal Bank of Canada, Comfort Inn, Rudi's Photography for their continued support of school sport. Thanks to Subway for providing the meals. I'd like to thank all the coaches for all their support in the sport.

The 2008-2009 tournament revealed, to the officials and I, a crucial need to improve on the weighing and pairing systems in the sport. Two items were addressed:

- -the bridge between the weight of the athlete during the zone meet and the weight change of that same athlete at the provincial tournament.
- -the stress of the pairing component of our officiating system the day of the event.

The goal is to have the athletes arrive to the provincial tournament prepared to wrestle and be aware of their weight class. An athlete who qualifies in one weight must compete at the Provincial Tournament in that same category.

My suggestion was to have all zone meets officiated by the same officials, who would weigh the athletes using the same scales. The weights of the champions would be sent to me where by I would forward on to the Pair Master to prepare the draw for the Provincial Tournament. This would allow the athletes to arrive, warm up and compete.

This process will also allow the officials to tend to the event at hand.

The new process was a success based on the input given to me by the officials, my

observations and the observations of other experts in the sport. We had little wait times during the tournament, which provided a higher level of engagement from the coaches, athletes and spectators. The pairing team were in top shape to keep up with the demands of the tournament, and not warn down from the intensity of a weigh-in process hours before the event. But, for the success of this system, timelines and deadlines must be respected.

5. **RECOMMENDATIONS**:

- 1. Ensure WPEI continues to build a pool of officials for the draw and the mat.
- 2. Ensure WPEI has a head official at each zone meet and weigh the wrestlers and officiate the event.
- 3. The zone weight of each wrestler will continue to be the provincial weight of the athlete.
- 4. Establish an email account for the sport.
- 5. Attempt to hold the tournament in Charlottetown for the 2010 2011 season.
- 6. Hold a dual meet/camp prior to the zone meets to ensure tournament level experience for athletes, coaches and officials.
- 7. Approach WPEI to lend their mats, clocks and scales.
- 8. Prepare a manual for the sport.
- 9. Instill a sticker system to aid the officials in the draw and pairing component of the sport.
- 10. Include the 4th and 5th place finishers' names to be sent for the Provincial Tournament in the event of a scratch. The 4th and 5th names will only be considered for the athlete from that zone.
