School Sport Coordinator Report 2010-2011

Report to the 49th June Meeting of the Prince Edward Island School Athletic Association. The past year has been challenging, interesting and successful. While there has been some change, the organization is moving forward and it has been business as usual, School Sport has continued on through the tremendous support of the membership and volunteers.

The organization administers school sport in the Province for 65-member schools, participating in 14-sports and competing for some 90-championships. While there are championships, the organization focuses on competition among all member schools. Success is not measured by wins, losses, or records; it is determined by the values and life lessons that result from participating on a school team. It is incumbent upon each school to ensure that all their student athletes have a positive sport experience fostered by sound athletic programs and quality coaching.

Highlights of the year included:

1. Partnership with Dairy Farmers of Canada and the associated Up Your Game Program that has been renewed for a subsequent year.
2. The release of the Physical Education Safety Guidelines K-12. A resource that will present some challenges as we move through the implementation process.
3. Prepare to pilot the Coach in School Module; a joint project with the Coaching Association of Canada, which will address coaching certification.
4. Development of a new PEISAA Website.

 - b. We need to have a back up timing (stopwatches) system in place .On that note, UPEI has offered to have a web cast in place next year, so if the timing equipment fails we can review the tape for a time.
3. We had very few incidents of official abuse this year, but there were still situations that the PEISAA does not want to see happen. We need to continue to promote fair play and sportsmanship in our schools. Our Officials deserve to be treated with respect and if we want to encourage new recruits we need to ensure they are appreciated.

4. 2010 SEASON IN REVIEW

The senior soccer league concluded on October 30th with the Provincial championships being hosted at UPEI and Cornwall Turf fields under extremely cold, wet, and snowy conditions. Thanks for the help with hosting these events goes out to Trevor Bridges and Rick MacKinnon.

This year we had 24 teams participating at the senior "A" and "AAA" level with approximately 450 student athletes participating. Overall, I believe the league went well. There were many close, exciting games. This is a good time to recognize the contribution made by school administration, volunteer coaches, officials, official assignors, and the players who work so hard to entertain us. Again, without the help of the PEISAA, especially Walter MacEwen and Rick MacKinnon, the leagues would not run as smoothly. Thanks, guys.

A big thanks also goes to Glen Miller, and Richard Petipas, for assigning referees for the season.

Again this year, Paperflow has provided support as the school soccer sponsor. Thanks to Sam Jeyes for his continued support.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR 2011 SEASON

Again this year, as I stated last year, there should be no reason for teams like Charlottetown Rural and Col. Gray to be playing 4 point games against each other. Other scenarios had 4 point games between teams that have less than 30 - 40 minute travel times. To make the league more credible, I believe fewer 4 point games and more 2 point games be played.

There **cannot be any league games scheduled or rescheduled for the Friday** before the Monday play-off games. This was, I'm sure, a nightmare for those booking buses for Monday's games. We, as an organization, and well educated people can figure out how to get our games in before this time to allow for scheduling to happen before students leave on Friday.

Rescheduling games have to be on the top of importance when they get canceled in the first place. Leaving them until the last minute is not a responsible way to run a league.

This year was a better one than last for reporting games. I feel if teams report games on the web page and visiting teams check up on the reporting team, there should be no reason to fax results. So I am recommending that game sheets only be faxed if there are cards or referee write-ups. Otherwise, they can be held at the schools for future reference.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

A) SCHEDULING

With four midget teams a Triple Round Robin league appears to be the right number of games. The first round- robin of games is in the format of a tournament and is held at the beginning of the midget season. Therefore the midget teams will only travel for three away games for the rest of their season. The Sr. High School league with the addition of Col Gray played a Home and Away league. To help with scheduling, two league games were played at the first of Rural's and Montague's tournaments. Also being able to play on the Turf with lights might help out with transportation as teams can play later games under the lights and even some double headers with teams. Four teams would like to host a tournament next season, that being the case, more league games could be played at the start of each tournament. (Full time of 35/35 to be played).

B) PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Midget Provincial Championship was held on the Cornwall Turf field on Thursday, Oct 28th and Senior High School Championship was held at UPEI Turf field on Wednesday, Oct 27. The reason for this was in case the UPEI Field Hockey Team was attending the OUA Championships in Ontario on PEISAA Provincial Championship week-end. This change in schedule was made so the commissioner, Barb Carmichael, coaches- Carolyn MacLeod from Rural, Charla Currie from Col Gray, Eliza MacLauchlan from Stonepark and a number of umpires -would be able to attend the Provincial Field Hockey Championships. At the All Star meeting all high school coaches are in favor of finals on Wednesday and semi-finals on Monday as long as the Convention is not problem for practice the week before. Scheduling of the Cornwall turf field was somewhat of a problem for time but we were able to schedule both games. UPEI worked well with the scheduling of the high School championship game from the down pour of rain on Wednesday to the most beautiful day of the season on Thursday, Oct 28th. Scheduling the championship games in the middle of the week also gives the teams extra days in case of

bad weather.

OFFICIALS

Eight officials umpired this season: Ann Marie Ryan, Terri Bontemplo, Charla Currie, Ellen Andrews, Lacey MacLauchlan, and Amy Rawlinson. We hope we can keep the university girls umpiring and still add a few more to the list for the Summerside and Montague areas. Thanks to: Krista Hickey in the Summerside area, Ann Marie Ryan, and Charla Currie in the Charlottetown and Cornwall areas There is a need for umpires in the Montague area. An Umpire clinic will take place by September 2011. The community umpire clinic will be for University players and renewal clinic for other umpires.

D) COACHES: This school season we had sixteen coaches working with the nine teams. Seven of the seventeen coaches were first or second year coaches. Through the PEIFHA, Sheila Bell will offer a Community Coaching Course and PEIFHA will bring in a coarse conductor from Nova Scotia to also run a comp/(level 2)

E) ATHLETES

The midget players have greatly improved their skills and this is due to playing on the turf fields for the last four years. This is now carried over to the high school program as more games are being played on turf and younger players are now in high school. There has been an increase in the number of players per team. Most teams had 20 to 22 players per roster. Due to turf fields fans are finally able to enjoy the game....as there are fewer whistles and the game is much faster. The new self pass rule has also added to the speed of the game.

H) GENERAL:

The All Star meeting was held Friday, Oct 17th of Teachers' Convention- at 7:30am. The coaches thought this was a great idea since coaches (that are teachers) are in Charlottetown attending the convention. Also, having the All Star meeting before Provincials, means we can hand out certificates at the Provincial Championships.

The commissioner should be present at the All-Star meeting as this is a good time to discuss concerns. Example: The senior high schools would like to play more of their league games on the turf. Hopefully with goal nets in place for 2011, Three Oaks will have an opportunity to play home games on Summerside's new turf field. The two high school semi-finals were played on the Cornwall Turf and the championships games on the UPEI Turf. High school coaches requested to have semi-finals on turf. In 2007 East Wiltshire Junior High School moved their home games to Cornwall Turf Field, as did Stonepark Junior High. Stonepark moved their home games to UPEI Turf Field. This

move to turf fields has greatly improved playing conditions which in turn improved their play. Junior High schools had 15 of their 22 games on turf. Again once the goal problem at the Summerside turf is fixed for 2011...midget will play only 3 or 4 games on grass. High Schools had fewer games played on turf. Hopefully with the opening of Summerside's New Turf Field there will only be a few games played on grass.

* MUST PLAY AS MANY GAMES AS POSSIBLE ON TURF FIELDS- as this greatly improves the game.

Finally, the addition of Col Gray Field Hockey Team to the PEISAA league is wonderful!! I am sure in the years to come we will see one or two Junior high Schools added to the league.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

The season began with the “scheduling meeting” in mid- November, 2010. In attendance were the Athletic Directors and Rick MacKinnon. It was decided to stay with a seeding system for the Boys teams and the AAA Girls. formed a four team league. The AA-Girls maintained a seeding process. Teams were to play a minimum of ten(10) games against at least five(5) other teams. A three(3) division playoff would be held to determine provincial champions. If a school wanted to compete at a higher or lower level for Provincials, they must apply to the PEISAA by Feb.1. Athletic Directors put their schedules together and had these put on the PEISAA website.

The Leagues commenced on Nov.24 with thirteen(13) female teams and thirteen (13) male teams. Over 150 league and 50+ tournament games were played with lots of rescheduling needed because of weather.

A seeding committee was formed, this group met four(4) times during the season..at the end of December, Januaey, mid-February, and the end of February. The regular season ended on Feb.24. The playoffs ran from March 2 to March 9 with a few changes due to school cancellations.

The season concluded with the annual All-Star games. These were held at Charlottetown Rural on Monday, March 14 (AA) and Tuesday, March 15 (AAA)

As my sixth year as Commissioner is now over and I reflect back on the season, it still amazes me how smoothly our league runs. I had no player incidents to deal with again this season. Certainly a reflection of the quality athletes, coaches, officials, etc...

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

I strongly believe we need to eliminate classifying teams by the number of students in their schools. If we continue to use the seeding system, schools have to agree to remain where they finish in the final seeding, for placement at Provincials. It shouldn't matter on the school size or if it is the second team from a school.

I also want to see our current Provincial Playoff divisions change from AAA, AA, and A to Division 1 (top four teams), Division 2 (teams seeded 5 – 8), and Division 3 (#9 – 12). If this needs SAA approval, then this can be brought forward as a resolution.

If schools don't agree to these, seeding is a waste of time and we will have to back to the old "AA" and "A" Leagues which forces schools to decide before the season starts which league they will play in.

4. **General Comments**

The 2011 school gymnastics season ended on Saturday, February 19th with the PEI School Athletic Association Provincial Gymnastics Championship at Kensington Intermediate Senior High School. The championship was hosted by St. Louis Elementary School.

Montague Consolidated. won the Pre Novice Boys team title. West Kent won the Pre Novice Girls and Novice Girls team titles. Spring Park Elementary. won the Novice Boys while M. E. Callaghan Intermediate won the Bantam Girls team titles. The top five scores on each events were used to calculate the team standing. Individual awards were also given to the top six vault /floor routines and top ten all around. A total of 299 gymnasts participated at this years event. This was a decrease of 26 gymnasts from last year.

On Saturday morning the competition started and finished ahead of time. A total of 140 gymnasts participated with 77 Pre Novice Girls and 63 Pre Novice Boys. Decrease of 17. On Saturday afternoon, another big crowd watched 115 gymnasts perform in the Novice Boys & Girls categories There were 44 Novice Boys and 71 Novice Girls. A decrease of 16.

In the third competition, we had a total of 44 gymnasts participate in Bantam Boys, Bantam Girls Midget Girls ,Midget Boys categories. There were 2 Bantam Boys, 33 Bantam Girls, 1 Midget Boys and 8 Midget Girls. Increase of 7.

All information and results were posted in the three local papers and two radio stations. Coverage before and after the provincial was very good.

In all, we had a total of 22 different schools from across PEI participate with a total of 299 gymnasts, a decrease of 26 gymnasts. The weather was fairly good for traveling. We had a total of 392 paid spectators.

Our computer program, which calculated the results, came through for us again. Within minutes of the end of both competitions, the results were handed out.

I would like to thank Marybeth Rogers and, Principal Terry Foster for all their help, support and for allowing us to use their fine facility to host our Provincial.

Rick MacKinnon our School Spots Coordinator was on hand to watch the event encourage our athletes and present awards. Thank you Rick for helping me during the day.

I also have to thank all the Zone Managers for holding their zone competitions and sending me all the results and to you, the Physical Education teachers for getting your athletes ready to compete. Great job!

4. **GENERAL COMMENTS:**

The Host School for the 2010-2011 Provincial Wrestling Tournament was Summerside Intermediate. I would like to thank Principal Doug Doyle, the Phys. Ed. Teachers Rob Connell and Trevor Bridges, the leadership group and Rick MacKinnon with their help for and in the event. I would also like to thank Draw Master Tim Murphy and his team, Yvonne Cummisky and Pamela MacEachern, for their efforts during our Provincial Tournament. Thanks to Active Health and Chris McCarthy for his help on the medical side of the sport. Thanks to the WPEI clubs for the lend of their mats, clocks and scales. Thanks to Peter Gallant and SIS for the lend of their sound systems. Thanks also to the Head Official, Johnathan Kemp, the referees and minor officials for their tireless work. Thanks to Milk Sport, Royal Bank of Canada, Comfort Inn, Rudi's Photography and Active Health for their continued support of school sport. Thanks to Subway for providing the meals. I'd like to thank all the coaches for all their support in the sport.

The 2009-2010 tournament revealed, to the officials and I, the improvement on the weighing and pairing systems in the sport. Two items were addressed:

- the bridge between the weight of the athlete during the zone meet and the weight change of that same athlete at the provincial tournament.
- the stress of the pairing component of our officiating system the day of the event.

The last two seasons revealed the new system works well. The goal is to have the athletes arrive to the provincial tournament prepared to wrestle and be aware of their weight class. An athlete who qualifies in one weight must compete at the Provincial Tournament in that same category.

Have all zone meets officiated by a certified official, who would weigh the athletes using a Canada Games scale. The weights of the champions are sent to the Pair Master to prepare the draw for the Provincial Tournament. This allows the athletes to arrive, warm up and compete. This process will also allow the officials to tend to the event at hand.

The new process was a success again this year, based on the input given to me by the officials, my observations and the observations of other experts in the sport. We had little wait times during the tournament, which provided a higher level of engagement from the coaches, athletes and spectators. The pairing team were in top shape to keep up with the demands of the tournament, and not worn down from the intensity of a weigh-in process hours before the event. But, for the success of this system, timelines and deadlines must continue be respected.

5. **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

1. Ensure WPEI continues to build a pool of officials for the draw and the mat.
2. Ensure WPEI has an official at each zone meet, weigh the wrestlers and officiate the event.
3. Ensure the zone rep has access to a Canada Games scale for the zone meet.
4. The zone weight of each wrestler will continue to be the provincial weight of the athlete.
5. Attempt to hold the tournament in Charlottetown for the 2011 - 2012 season.
6. Hold a dual meet/camp prior to the zone meets to ensure tournament level experience for athletes, coaches and officials.
7. Approach WPEI to lend their mats, clocks and scales.
8. Prepare a manual for the sport.
9. Include the 4th and 5th place finishers' names to be sent for the Provincial Tournament in the event of a scratch. The 4th and 5th names will only be considered for the athlete from that zone.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

This rugby season was a very successful one thanks to the hard work put in by the players, coaches, Athletic Directors and referees. Special thanks should be directed towards Darryl Boudreau for his work as the Referee Assignor, Rick MacKinnon for his work as School Sport Coordinator. I would also like to thank Sue Thomson, Trent Ranahan and Garrett Toole for organizing the championship sites for this year. Without the tireless work and preparation that the aforementioned people put in, high school rugby would not have been possible this year.

The play in all six classifications continues to be excellent. In both the A Men and A Women's leagues, the progression of improvement and understanding of rugby from the first game to the last is astounding. Almost every player is playing rugby for their first time and to see the quality of play at the level it is by the Provincial Championships is in direct correlation with the time and effort the coaches and players put in. In the AA Men and AA Women's leagues this year, the level of play was as high as I can remember. I have never seen AA teams that can compete with the AAA teams to the degree that they could this year. This made for exciting championships at Kinkora, where both finals were decided by one try or less. Finally, the AAA Men and Women's leagues were much closer

than they have been in the past few years. For the past three or four years, there have mostly been one or two dominant teams in a given year. This year, it was good to see four or five teams capable of having highly contested games with each other.

This year reporting of games to the website was done very well but sending the game sheets to me was (for the most part) not as good. The standings that I made through the season had to take results from the website because I was always missing gamesheets.

Dividing the teams into A, AA and AAA was not difficult this year because all of the teams involved were very cooperative once the method was set. Getting away from seeding was much needed.

Finally, I would like to thank everyone for making this year - my first as commissioner - as easy as possible for me. The Athletic Directors, Rick, and Darryl were very helpful and because of them I was able to work full time, referee and coach during the season. It was a new experience for me but I hope to be able to continue as commissioner in future years.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS

- A. Some additions need to be added to the PEISAA Rugby Guidelines:
 - i. Standard Sanctions for Cards:
 - ii. 1 Yellow Card – No further discipline
 - iii. 1 Red Card/2Yellow Cards – Automatic 1 game suspension with a review done by the commissioner taking into account the recommendations of the referee and any well known, unbiased, and knowledgeable person at the site
 - iv. Multiple Yellow Cards throughout the season – 3 Yellow Cards during league play by a single player should merit a one game suspension. If this player offends again after the suspension, their position in the league should be reviewed for the safety of the other players.
 - v. Second Red Card in a season – If a player receives more than one red card in a season, their position in the league should be reviewed for the safety of the other players.
 - vi. Team Cards – If a team receives Yellow or Red Cards very frequently, that team should be reviewed (as well as the coaches of that team) for not teaching safe rugby.
 - B. The championship format should be established at the Spring Athletic Directors meeting (unless a team drops out). This year there was some confusion midway through the season because the playoff format had not been set.

- C. "Exhibition games" need to be declared exhibition games right away. Some games were played a AA team and a AAA team. These games ended up being declared exhibition.
- D. Some programs have an abundance of coaches and should suggest they become referees. Most programs do not need coaches, but our league badly needs more referees.

6. The senior high school's AD's should consider at the Fall scheduling meeting to have their Provincial Track and Field Meet over two days, on a trial basis. The intent would be to move a small number of sprinting events and a small number of distance events to the Friday night.
