Chairperson's Report 2016-2017

First and foremost, I would like to praise Craig Watson, the Prince Edward Island School Athletic Association (PEISAA) School Sport Coordinator, the PEISAA Executive, commissionaires, member schools, and all other paid employees and volunteers for their dedication and hard work fostering an educational learning environment through sport to our Island students.

Over the past year, I felt that our association has been doing a terrific job in being proactive when dealing with policies and procedures. Any issues that were discussed at the executive level, the Zone representatives and other members have thoroughly discussed and made a decision that would benefit all schools as a whole. Moving forward, I encourage our Zone representatives to continue communicating effectively with their zone schools. It is imperative all schools feel a sense of connection to the PEISAA.

As the Association moves forward, I feel there are two areas that need to be further developed to ensure long-term stability. First, a strategic plan should be completed at the earliest convenience. This will provide the executive with a plan that will aid decision making. Currently, no new sports will be added to our calendar until a strategic plan is completed. Second, the PEISAA will have to be creative on ways to generate more revenue. We have lost some financial contributions from our sponsors over the years and this money has been primarily used to offset our yearly operational budget. To keep our member school fees controlled, money will have to be generated by other means.

I am pleased to announce that in September 2017, our School Sport Coordinator will be releasing the most current policy and procedure handbook to all member schools. Updating our policy and procedure handbook has been a long process. Policies and procedures have been added and omitted, Minister's directives have changed, new age categories were added to some sports, the age classification Intermediate is now referred to intermediate, and the list goes on. Having our policy and procedure handbook updated will assist the delivery of school sport for member schools. Also, the PEISAA is currently working with the PEI Government to explore the possibility of them taking over our web page. This will enable the PEISAA to use in-house technology compared to outsourcing this need.

I look forward working with all PEISAA stakeholders again next year. The PEISAA develops so many sporting opportunities for our Island students at a minimal cost. Everyone who is involved, understand the importance and power of our Association. Our students are certainly fostering 'education through sport'.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

- This season of Senior Men's Baseball went fairly well. Four of the teams were of roughly equal ability, while two were poor. However, both semi-final games were excellent.
- I continue to feel that some schools perhaps treated baseball with a little less importance than other sports. I understand that it is a "minor" sport in the PEISAA, but some issues were very frustrating – teams knowing when playoff/medal games were scheduled, but indicating they couldn't field a team until the afternoon of for example – and I would expect some schools would not act this way if it was another sport. Again, this wasn't the case for the majority of the schools, but it was for a couple, and that created headaches and issues.
- The Community of Morell and Community of Tignish did not charge anything for the use of their fields, which was very much appreciated!
- With all of the schedule changes throughout the season, the school Ads were extremely patient, understanding, and accommodating. I would like to thank them very much!

5. RECOMMENDATIONS

- While I release schools could not post results on the SAA website due to some issues with the website and its company, I would recommend this issue be attended to immediately so that for next season, teams can directly post results on the website for baseball. Several schools and coaches were poor at getting necessary results (score, pitch counts, top batters, etc.) to me in a timely manner, and to be honest, I still haven't gotten anything from one school. If teams don't post on the website in a timely matter, they will get hounded by both Walter MacEwen and I, hopefully leading them to be more prompt on this issue. I was disappointed in some teams' efforts in this regard, and there did not seem to be an improvement over last year.

- Two forfeits were awarded this season (a 7-0 forfeit win for Souris over Charlottetown Rural – which was rescheduled after Charlottetown Rural wished to forfeit this game earlier – and a 7-0 forfeit win for Three Oaks over Morell in the bronze medal game). It became clear to me that neither of these teams had an over-abundance of players. With the demands of other school sports, hockey, football, and a plethora of other activities, I think it's key for each team to carry approximately 15 players. 11 or 12 players is not enough. I don't know if the PEISAA has any power to issue mandatory roster numbers, but if so, it would be something to look in to.

PEISAA Senior Soccer Final Report 2016-2017

1. SPORT PARTICIPATION NUMBERS

Male 13 teams and approximately 230 players **Female** 12 teams and approximately 215 players. We are down one male and two female teams this year, all at the A level, which also translates into approximately 45 fewer participants.

2. GENERAL COMMENTS

The 2016 Fall Soccer Season was once again very entertaining and generally each division had its share of competitiveness.

The **A Men's** league had a two-way tie for first place and a three-way tie for third. Col. Gray finished first in the tie-breaker over Souris. However, Francois Buote would eventually come from third place in the league to win the A Men's title in Penalty Shots (2-1) over Col. Gray. In the Bronze Medal game, Souris defeated a short-handed Morell team 1-0.

The **A Women's** League was dominated by Kishora (Kensington and Kinkora combined team). Kishora completed the season with a perfect 6-0 record. Below Kishora was a log jam of 5 teams separated by only 4 points. It was a very competitive league. In the Championship game, Kishora defeated Charlottetown Rural 3-0 to complete the only perfect season in the senior soccer league this fall. The Bronze Medal game was won by Montague by way of a 3-1 victory over Souris.

In the **AAA Men's** division, Bluefield went undefeated in League play with nine wins and only one tie. Second through sixth place was separated by only 5 points. The playoffs were very interesting as number 6th seeded TOSH defeated Montague and the number one seed Bluefield to make their way to the Championship game. Joining TOSH in the Championship game was fourth seed Charlottetown Rural after they defeated Westisle and upset Col. Gray to make it to the final. In the final, Rural scored in the second half to win the Gold Medal on a 1-0 victory.

In the **AAA Women's** division, Charlottetown Rural went undefeated in the league play with a record of 3 wins and 5 ties. The League was very close with 9 ties and only one game decided by more than 2 goals. The number five place Col. Gray team defeated number 4 Westisle in the 5/4 placing game, setting them up for a matchup with Charlottetown Rural in the Semifinal game. That game proved to be a challenging game for Rural as they could not defeat Gray in regulation. However, tied 1-1 going into overtime and having the edge in play, Rural took the momentum into the overtime and scored an early goal and hung on to move on to the Championship game. In the other semifinal game, TOSH upset Westisle by a score of 4-0 to

move on to the championship game. Charlottetown Rural and TOSH provided a very entertaining second half for those in attendance as they were tied 0-0 at halftime. Within a period of 8 minutes there were 5 goals scored – three for Rural and two for TOSH. Rural would hang on to retain their Gold Medal with a score of 3-2.

Many thanks go out to the referee assigners, Cory Deagle in the East and Trevor Bridges in the West. They did a terrific job making sure games were covered. Hats off to our officials for getting to the fields in “light hours,” we realize how difficult it is to get to the field at our kick-off times. Other thanks go out to Comfort Inns, the Town of Cornwall, The Department of Education and Early Childhood, Craig Watson (PEISAA Sport Coordinator), The School Milk Foundation and the many coaches and players who provided many hours of entertaining soccer this fall. Thanks also to members of the PEISAA Executive for helping out with decisions that needed to be made throughout the season.

There were fewer rescheduled games this season over last season, with the exception of the “Evacuation” day on September 21st. There were 78 regular season games and 21 playoff games this year. There still needs to be better preparation before attending these meetings as some games were rescheduled due to conflicts with school schedules. There were one or two because we could not get an official assigned to the game, which is also unfortunate.

Getting results on the web site was very good this year. Only two or three times did I need to send emails to teams for results on the following day

3. RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Next fall, I will attempt to send out a schedule before the meeting. This will allow AD's to look over and bring back conflicts. On that note, AD's need to be more aware of schedule conflicts so we do not have to reschedule games. I will attempt to have teams that travel the furthest play their longer trips in September, when the evening light is later.
2. I would like to see the AAA leagues have more meaning and play more games. There were 2 AAA women's teams that played 4 league games worth 4 points each. I feel this is not much for the players to put value in the league.
4. This was added last year, the year before, and the year before, but not addressed in a couple schools:

In speaking to the referee association, there are some concerns with fields that have benches on each side of the field. This is not a good situation as one team tends to be sitting with a group of parents and/or students on a set of bleachers. It has been asked of me to recommend each school provide two benches on one side (opposite side from fans) so the teams can occupy one side and the fans the other. This is a FIFA standard and we should follow suit.

5. Although, we attempted to book Cornwall and UPEI for play-off games, it is not possible to have all games there and probably not ideal for games that have two teams that are travelling from the same area of the province. However, we had a playoff game cancelled due to a lack of officials.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

- 2) We are getting to a spot where I believe it is worth looking at combining East and West leagues for the AA divisions. A three team league does not make for an ideal season. The other option is mentioned in point number 4.

- 4) Once again, with shortages of teams in our AA divisions, we had A teams that could have competed in AA divisions. It isn't possible to force teams but adding a team or two would help our AA divisions greatly, without impacting our A leagues in a negative way.

C) Playoffs

- 1) Playoffs ran very smoothly. Reminder that games should start by 4pm at the latest to avoid darkness if extra time or penalty kicks are needed.
- 2) For provincials, by using both Cornwall and Summerside, we were able to schedule games, based on who was playing, to help reduce travel. This is a great idea.
- 3) This was the second year of not having the quarter final games in the A divisions, and I feel that most are good with this change. The top 4 teams moving on makes the season worth something.
- 4) We had some issues during provincials. Our original schedule of playing the Friday of the teacher's convention got switched very late and instead was moved to a school day. This might be something to talk about with PEITF/PSB in the future to see what the preference would be (missing convention vs missing school). Also, it is convenient for us to start games on the Cornwall turf before 3pm but it is very inconvenient for Elliott River due to parking and bus

issues. We will have to work to make some changes that work for both parties involved so that we can continue to enjoy the facility in the future. (Signage, directing cars to the Rise and Shine parking lot, or employing someone to manage that parking situation may be options).

4. GENERAL COMMENTS:

For the third year, the 2016 intermediate and high school field hockey had excellent weather for league play. No League games were cancelled due to weather nor lack of umpires however due to construction at Maypoint intersection, the new round-a-bout at North River Causeway all field hockey schools had to release their teams early from classes to be at the Cornwall turf to start the game on time. With UPEI turf not available (meant more use of Cornwall turf) I was unable to schedule the league midget tournament and high school tournament. So with a tight schedule, the bomb threat day (Sept 22) made rescheduling of 3 games very difficult. Finally trying to reschedule games around Soccer Club Championships, Hockey tournaments and leadership convention adds pressure to scheduling. Therefore knowing the days players will be out for these events is so important. Hopefully with the return of the midget tournament will help both with scheduling and extra travel.

This season I scheduled both intermediate and high school games (double header) at TOSH and Montague. This cut the cost of umpire travel fees in half for Summerside and Montague (only 4 trips rather than 8 trips).

I also scheduled double header high schools games on Monday nights at Cornwall... although we were rushed to start and finish on time due to construction.

The new Shoot-out competition for overtime replaced the penalty stroke competition at both the junior & high school level for the 2013 season. I believe the shoot-out competition is a fairer method to determine an over- time winner to both the shooter and the goalie. All four provincial championships went into overtime with three games ended in a shoot- out competition.

FHC had changed four rules for 2015. We used only the new Corner Hit rule (which moved from 5 m on the sideline to 23 M line and in line with where the ball when over

the goal line). Two of the three rules were added this 2016 season (Green cards and placement of hits within 5 m of the circle). The fourth rule of playing the ball in the air will not be added due to safety of players.

Thank you to Cornwall, Summerside CG turf for allowing field hockey the time to use the turf. Cornwall had requested new mesh netting for the two goals at Cornwall turf therefore PEIFHA bought new netting for Cornwall (\$340)

Thank you to all the coaches for their hard work as the young players do enjoy the game of field hockey.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. The Intermediate school league mini tournament must return for the 2017 season. This cuts down the number of trips for both Montague and SIS.
2. Before a season starts for 2017 we **must check the calendar** to see the number of days available to play.
3. Schedule of playoffs games works very well so for 2017 season with Senior 4/5 placement game will be played Wednesday, Oct 17, Intermediate 4/5 placement game (Thursday, Oct 18), Senior Semi Finals Monday, Oct 23 at Cornwall, Intermediate Semi-Finals Tuesday, Oct 24th at Cornwall. Provincial High School Championship Wednesday, Oct 25 at either Cornwall or UPEI and Intermediate Championship finals Thursday, Oct 26 at Cornwall turf.
4. The recommendation from 2012 high school all-star meeting was to schedule the 2013 high school and midget quarter final games so that the team winning would have a school day to practice was well received. For 2016 season this recommendation worked well and ***we will continue to do this in the future.**

B) RECOMMENDATIONS FOR 2017

1. **Provincials Championships will be scheduled for October 23 to Oct 26. 4/5 Playoff Game to be scheduled week before (Oct 17th for high school, Oct 18th for intermediate).**
*** Depending on Dates of 2017 Teachers' Convention.**
2. **Reporting of scores by home team needs to be looked at ... as there are MANY problems.**
3. **I will continue to have players not taken out of class early and to cut transportation costs.**

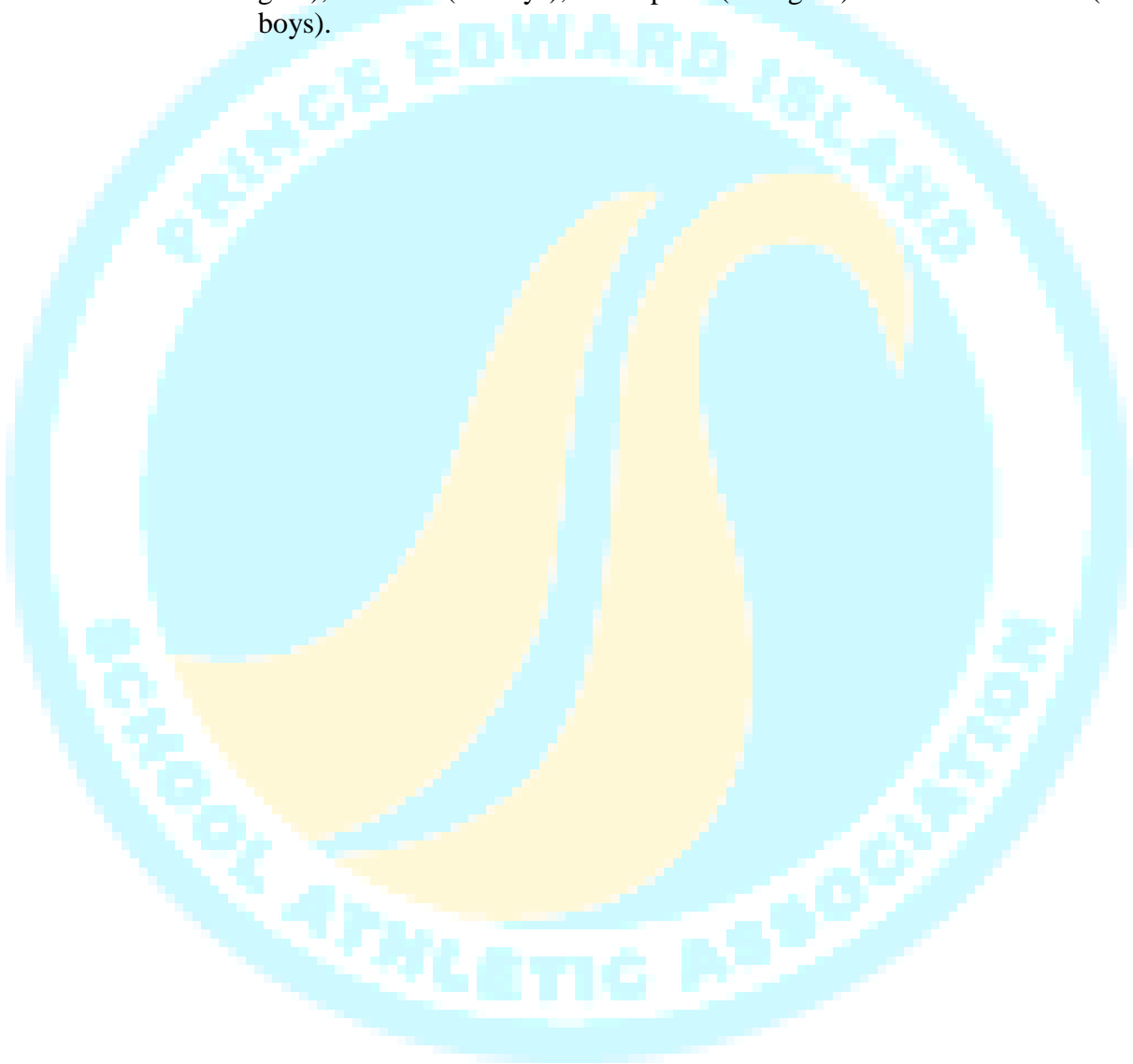

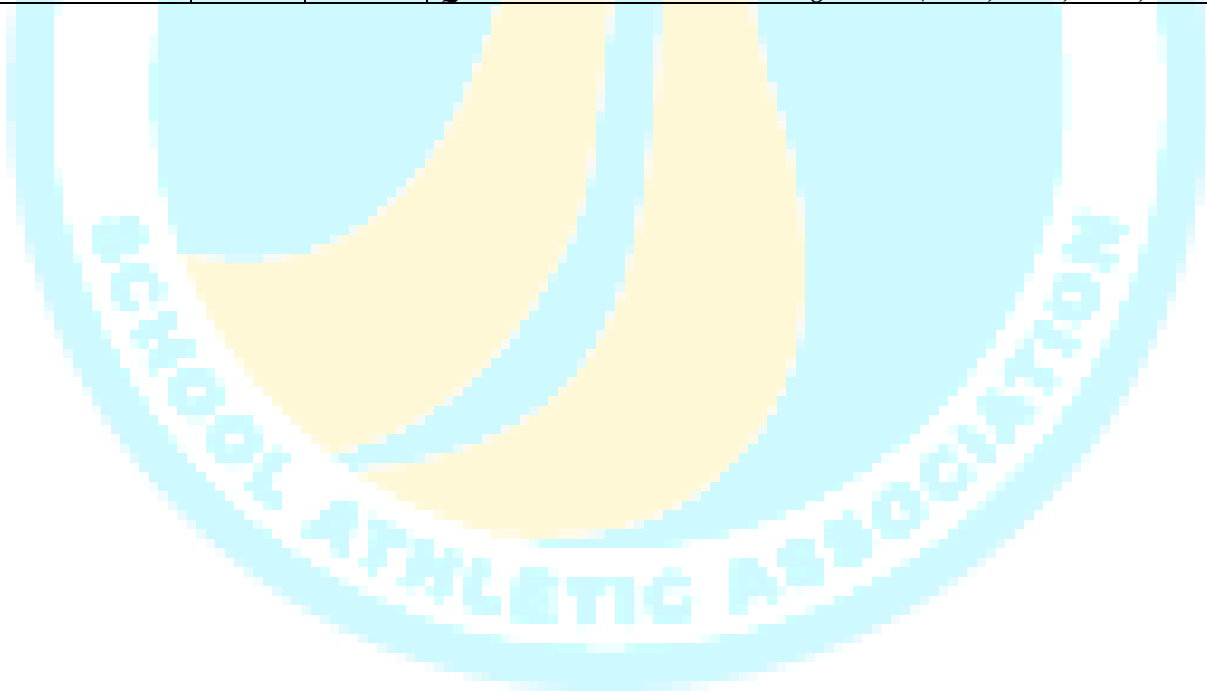

4. General Comments

The Pre Novice - Intermediate Cross Country season ended with the 2016 Source for Sports Provincial Cross Country Championship at Mill River Provincial Park. 4. GENERAL COMMENTS

General Comments/

As there often is, there was a good deal of conversation among interested individuals about the upcoming basketball season in the days, weeks and months leading up to the Athletic Directors' meeting in November. Three main topics dominated this discussion: how would college and university playoffs impact high school playdowns? Would there be sufficient officials available at a calibre necessary to support the school basketball leagues and tournaments with concurrent coverage required for the higher levels of play? Would the high schools continue with a seeding system?

At the November meeting ADs were asked to encourage young and interested people to offer their services to the PEIBOA in order to support the association's efforts to meet the demands of the basketball community.

The ADs came up with an appropriate preliminary and tentative schedule to be the skeletal framework for the regular and playoff season. They then created a proposed league and tournament schedule based on that framework.

There was discussion about the league play format with the end result being the maintenance of the seeding committee with seeding as the basis for match-ups at the end of the regular season. Early and mid-season tournament play was adjusted so as to give consideration whenever possible to the officials and of course to allow the athletes the chance to perform as well as they could as student athletes.

Once the tentative play-off schedule, proposed by the commissioner, after consultation with Rob Anderson of the BOA and Craig Watson, the school sport director, was approved by the ADs at UPEI and Holland College, it was really written in stone. There are never any extra dates at either major institution by some time in December, sometimes even earlier.

There was some pressure by mid-February to move the dates. Weather had wreaked havoc on the Junior High schedule. The reality is that the only flexibility we have is to use our own school facilities. These are large enough in some instances to handle anticipated crowds, but there are some match-ups for certain play-off games that can only be handled at the collegiate gyms. Actually even Holland College is too small for some games and only UPEI is suitable.

As a result we stood strong on our original plans and the original concept proved successful in the end.

There had been a couple of December incidents for which disciplinary action was a necessity. At the time this was a concern. The ADs at the schools involved effectively carried out the action and spoke sincerely with the offenders and the behaviour was nipped in the bud. It is important to deal with these types of situations immediately for the discipline to be meaningful to those involved. Other athletes and coaches learn as well from these cases. In order for this to happen ADs, officials and the commissioner must communicate seamlessly to be most effective.

All stars were chosen from league and again at play-off time. Only those from the regular season of play are included here. The ADs decided there would be no all star game.

Recommendations/

1. ADs should feel free to bring items to the attention of the commissioner or the school sport director well in advance of the November meeting.
2. Tentative dates for play-offs should be negotiated with Holland College and UPEI early in the school year.
3. Clinics for coaches and officials should be organized and advertised by the sport governing bod with cooperation from the PEISAA.
4. Prior to the November meeting, perhaps at Teachers' Convention, consider and discuss unofficially:

A] Whether some league format would work better than seeding. The league of play could be for all or a portion of the teams in a given year.

B] Whether there should be an all star game of some kind.

C] Whether A/AA play should return to the schools.

When these points are decided upon at the ADs meeting, recognize that for the given year a decision has been reached by a majority of the ADs and therefore it is the status quo.

5. ADs and officials must get accurate disciplinary reports in immediately in order to be effective.
6. To have a quality product Game Reports must be accurately reported to the SAA website as soon as possible following each game.

4. **General Comments**

The 2017 school gymnastics season ended on Saturday, February 18th with the PEI School Athletic Association Provincial Gymnastics Championship at the Kensington Intermediate Senior High School. The championship was hosted by the St. Louis Elementary School.

Provincial team titles: Pre-Novice Boys- Montague Consolidated, Pre-Novice Girls- L M Montgomery - Novice Girls- West Kent Elementary, Novice Boys- L M Montgomery, Bantam Girls – Summerside Intermediate. Individual awards were also given to the top six vault /floor routines and top ten all around.

A total of 276 gymnasts participated at this year's event. This was a decrease of 28 gymnasts from last year. The biggest drop was with the Intermediate girls - 11. We had a total of 27 different schools from across PEI participate.

Thursday and Friday before the championship schools were closed due to the weather. Lots of effort, extra planning and help was needed to make sure the Championship was held on Saturday. It was a challenge but we got it done.

On Saturday morning the competition started at 9:00 am and finished ahead of time. A total of 130 gymnasts participated with 87 Pre-Novice Girls and 43 Pre-Novice Boys. Decrease of 10 gymnasts from last year.

On Saturday afternoon, another big crowd watched 120 gymnasts perform in the Novice boys and Novice girl's categories, (44 Novice boys and 76 Novice girls). Decrease of 3 gymnasts from last year.

The late afternoon competition had a total of 26 gymnasts participate in Bantam Boys/ Girls, and Intermediate Boys/Girls categories, 4 Bantam Boys, 20 Bantam Girls, 1 Intermediate Girl and 1 Intermediate Boy. This was a decrease of 15 from last year.

We also had 5 Senior Girls who participated as a pilot program this year. We did a presentation of awards on the podium to recognize them; no SAA awards were handed out.

This year was the first time competitors in all 9 categories performed a Jump to handspring onto a raised mat surface; fall to straight lying position on the back. Pre Novice 28" high and the Novice to Intermediate 36" Some school had a bit of a challenge getting mats to reach the 36" height at their schools but in all it was well received and athletes did a great job.

The SAA also gave out medals instead of ribbons this year. Craig tried to get our usual ribbons but was not successful so we decided to try a generic medal to replace our ribbons. We needed a total of 20 medals for each category (160 medals) Awards not used at the end of the Championship were returned to Craig and he was going to replace the center piece and reuse them for ties. I think we are saving money this way by not wasting ribbons not used and not having to reorder ribbons for ties.

All information and results were posted in the Guardian and the Journal. The media coverage before and after was good. All results were circulated to all the media, schools and on our SAA website within days of our championship.

We had a total of 415 paid spectators. This was a decrease of 35 from last year.

Our computer program which calculated the results came through for us again. Within minutes of the end of both competitions, the results were handed out. I would like to thank Brian Alain once again for helping us with the results and registration.

Thank you to Trevor Bridges who helped with the presentation of awards in the morning and afternoon.

I would like to say a special thank you to Craig Watson our SAA School Sport Coordinator for his continuous support in helping with the championship and a special thank you to Richard Younker for coming to the school Friday night to lock up after the janitor went home.

I would also like to thank Principal Donald Mulligan and Phy. Ed. Teacher Brett Corcoran for all their help and continuous support. Thank you for allowing us to use your fine facility to host our Provincial Championship. It is very much appreciated.

We can't forget PEI School milk Foundation for their continuous support and of course for the free chocolate milk for all the competitors.

Thank you to all the Unit managers for hosting their own zone competitions and sending me all the results on time. It was greatly appreciated. It's always a pleasure to work with such dedicated professionals. Great job!

PEISAA Wrestling Final Report 2016-2017

1. General Comments

The 2017 PEISAA Wrestling Championships were held on Friday evening for the Bantam, Midget and Senior divisions and on Saturday for the Novice competitors. The site was Montague Regional High School. The tournament was run on two mats.

The on-mat official situation was strong and matches ran smoothly, without issue. We were able to mentor developing officials / pairmasters as well. The senior officials provided guidance, mentoring the newer officials. The officials went out of their way to ensure the athletes were safe and interacted w/ the athletes, allowing them to feel at ease. There were no injuries that we were made aware of.

The parents, friends and former wrestlers from the Montague schools' wrestling community were top notch volunteers once again this year and are quite knowledgeable about the sport of wrestling. Our minor officials, score keepers, timers and hosts allowed for a very smoothly run event.

Volunteers run this sport and, as commissioner and coach, I can't thank them enough. I was very pleased with the flow of the event and MRHS is an ideal venue. This was our best year yet as pulling out the second set of bleachers was key in keeping everyone off the floor and wrestling mats.

Participation numbers at the intermediate and senior high stayed about the same. Our new teams (Birchwood, ME Callaghan from 2016) participated again this year. There continues to be a keen interest in developing a Pre-Novice division and including them at an age appropriate level of competition in PEISAA competition. Suggestion would be to have wrestlers at this age practice at their school, compete in exhibition-style matches at their zone, but not attend provincials until Novice age. This would be an appropriate competition pathway for wrestlers of this age.

The biggest challenge continues to be developing the Intermediate / senior high school category. Having a teacher / coach w/in the school seems to determine the longevity and success of a program and helps to retain athletes. Unfortunately, when that teacher leaves the school, the program stops.

2. Update on Recommendations for 2016 – 2017 Season

Recommendations for 2016-2107 Season

1. Add Pre-Novice division (modified rules, grouped weights)

Did not happen this season but in discussion – elementary schools are in favor of seeing modified participation at this level to promote growth and introduce the sport

2. Change the season for Bantam, Midget, Senior to November – February and have provincials at the end of February, allowing for those athletes to have an opportunity to compete at NBIAA and NSSAF events and continue with a club when the school season is over. Keep Pre-Novice and Novice as is, so as not to disrupt the PEISAA Gymnastics season.

Some schedule changes are being looked at for next season (with March Break being later and Easter being earlier)

3. Review the weight classes and make changes to reflect participation numbers and ensure appropriate gaps between classes.

Suggestion – eliminate all weight classes at Novice, move to grouped weights as a pilot for 2017-2018 and re-evaluate. Current format limits participation. This suggestion was supported by everyone I spoke to.

4. Have the Midget (Gr 9/10) and Senior (Gr 11/12) weight classes mirror the weight classes at the national level. From Wrestling Canada Lutte: Midget = Cadet; Senior = Juvenile.

Change hasn't been made yet. Looking to implement these changes for 2017/18 season.

5. Encourage more girls to continue wrestling into intermediate school by offering a camp in the fall or sometime in January 2017 for girls only.

In the works for next season

6. Offer coaching development opportunities in Oct / Nov 2016 for interested teachers and members of the community to develop school wrestling (target area: Western PEI and elementary school level in Charlottetown and Summerside).

Western PEI saw a lot of growth w/ more kids participating and a new club being formed, which supports PEISAA wrestling. Numbers are down overall in Summerside area with only a couple of elem. School aged wrestlers (and their school was not

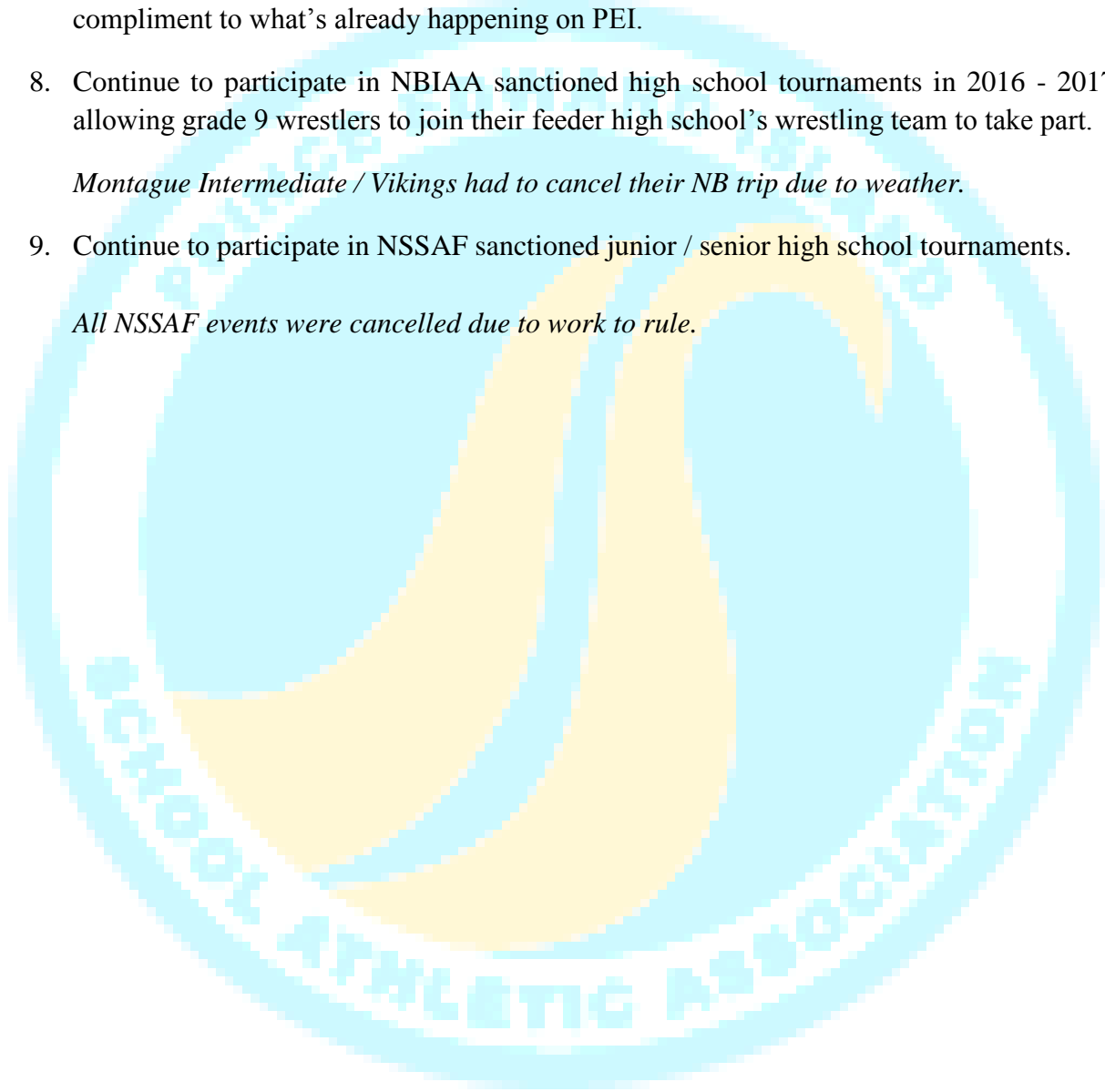
registered for PEISAA wrestling). Charlottetown area remained consistent and Cornwall area has continued to show a keen interest in PEIAA wrestling.

7. Continue to encourage schools to participate in the PEI Open, NB Open, NS Open and the Maritime Wrestling Festival (Moncton, NB). In particular, the PEI Open (March / April) and the Maritime Wrestling Festival (end of April in Moncton) are a perfect compliment to what's already happening on PEI.
8. Continue to participate in NBIAA sanctioned high school tournaments in 2016 - 2017, allowing grade 9 wrestlers to join their feeder high school's wrestling team to take part.

Montague Intermediate / Vikings had to cancel their NB trip due to weather.

9. Continue to participate in NSSAF sanctioned junior / senior high school tournaments.

All NSSAF events were cancelled due to work to rule.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

The PEISAA provincial badminton championships were held the week of May 1 to May 6. This year we used 5 Summerside and area schools, along with Bluefield.

Championship titles in Novice, Bantam, Intermediate, Juvenile and Senior boys' and girls' categories were all up for grabs in singles, doubles and mixed play. Most of our Island schools were represented in zone playoffs, with the top two from the four zones advancing to the provincials in Novice, Bantam and Intermediate. In Juvenile, Senior and Mixed categories, there were East and West regional events to decide who went to Provincials.

David Pan from Colonel Gray was victorious in senior boys singles defeating Owen Hall from Three Oaks 21-17 and 21-9 to win the provincial title. Logan MacDougall of Three Oaks defeated Donovan Bears of Montague 21-15 and 21-17 to claim the senior boys bronze medal. In doubles action David Pan and Jack Ronahan from Gray defeated Daniel Sanayie and Jack Digout from Charlottetown Rural 21-12 and 21-16. The bronze medal was won by Three Oaks. Owen Hall and Logan MacDougall defeated Sawyer Gauthier and Benoit Sampson from Bluefield 21-12 and 21-15. With a first in singles and a first in doubles, Colonel Gray won the Provincial Championship with 10 points.

In girls' action, Katherine Zhu of Charlottetown Rural defeated Kelsey MacKinnon of Three Oaks to win her Provincial Championship. The scores of the games were 21-7, 20-22 and 21-16. Nikki Arsenault of Three Oaks defeated Robyn Power of Charlottetown Rural 21-15 and 21-10 to claim the bronze medal in singles. Keirstyn Hamlin and Kelsey MacKinnon of Three Oaks defended their senior girl's doubles title defeating Katherine Zhu and Helan Li of Gray 21-19 and 21-18. Rickilee MacLeod and Maddie Thibodeau of Westisle defeated Nikki Arsenault and Lauren Reeves 21-17 and 21-17 to claim the bronze medal. Three Oaks won the provincial championship with a first, second, third and a fourth, for a total of 11 points.

Senior Mixed Doubles champions this year were Grace Gormley and Daniel Martell from Montague. They defeated Anika Weibe and Jack Ronahan of Colonel Gray 21-10, 18-21 and 21-18. Emma Jinks and Jack Digout from Charlottetown Rural defeated Lauren Reeves and Ethan Boyd 21-14 and 21-10 to win the bronze medal. Montague wins the senior mixed provincial title with 5 points.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

This year was the second year for regional qualifiers in the juvenile and senior divisions. The schedule was improved over last year, but there are still a few wrinkles to iron out. We played 4 days a week for two weeks this year. Next year I propose that we have longer days and only go two days a week. This will give teams more practice time with their coaches.

Having players report scores if they were going to a third game, worked very well again this year. It is great to see that the players are aware of how important scores are. There is also a group of P.E. teachers who are become very efficient at doing PEISAA tie breakers. This is very important in regional play as well as in pool play at provincials.

This year we were in the Summerside area and next year we will be back to the Charlottetown area. I think that moving back and forth between the two largest areas is the most fair for the championship and aligns with many of our other championship formats.

This year the schedule was drawn out over a week. Novice and Mixed were played on Monday and Wednesday. The other categories were played on Thursday and Saturday. This gave senior mixed a chance to play earlier in the week so they were not over worked if they chose to play either singles or doubles.

There needs to be a review of championship points as there is still too many ties for championships each year. I have had a problem trying to figure out a solution to this. I hope to find a solution for next year.

Lastly, this was the first year for Yonex as a sponsor. Their shuttles were superior to Black Knight and they were able to give us some product for door prizes at our championships. Thanks to Yonex for being our badminton sponsor.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

This rugby season was another successful one. Student-athletes from all across the Island competed in 3 divisions in men's and women's championships. Every year, school sport would not be possible without countless hours of work by players, coaches, referees and Athletic Directors. A special thank you goes to Craig Watson as School Sport Coordinator for his help and guidance behind the scenes. Also, thank you to Anthony Scott in his first year as Referee Assignor. Credit should also be given to Joel Arsenault and Laura Lindsay for their work in hosting successful A and AA provincial championships. Another thank you goes to UPEI and UPEI Athletic Director Chris Huggan for allowing us to host our AAA championships at their site. There are many other people who are very important to the continued success of high school rugby on PEI and I thank them as well.

Every year, the A rugby league has the same general storyline and this year was no different. The players start as athletes with little knowledge of the game and transform into players who understand what to do on the field. The 8s version of the game is also important in helping the student-athletes to adjust to playing a contact sport while allowing a large amount of space for players to move in. This space allows the safety and sportsmanship aspects to be focused on due to the decreased number of collisions per game. Both A leagues came down to

very competitive championships with Charlottetown Rural White defeating Three Oaks in the women's final and Bluefield defeating Three Oaks in the men's final.

In the AA division, both AA championship games were very close games with Colonel Gray winning the women's and Montague winning the men's. The circumstances presented themselves on a few occasions for us to use the 11s and 13s variation of rugby again. I am a big supporter of these variations as an intermediary between 8s and 15s.

In the AAA regular season, both men's and women's divisions were very competitive and tightly matched. In the AAA championships, Three Oaks beat Charlottetown Rural in a very high level game in the men's final while Three Oaks beat Montague in the women's final. The re-emergence of Montague and Westisle's rugby programs has been great to see and I look forward to seeing them in championship games in the years to come.

Walter MacEwen is an incredible resource for our league with the work he does with the PEISAA website and the submission of scores to media outlets. The Results Grid on the website is a wonderful asset that he keeps up to date the entire season.

Thank you to everyone for your continued work to make high school rugby a success.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

- Once again, I suggest that we hold at least one Guidelines, key rules and question session before the beginning of the season for coaches and referees to attend. Many coaches and referees are not familiar with the Guidelines. This leads to issues through the season as well as when we get to playoffs where all rules supposed to be fully enforced. My suggestion would be that this would be held by Darryl, Tim, Anthony and/or myself and they would review key safety points, any rule changes, and areas that have caused confusion in recent years (i.e. timeouts, overtime format, pool players, etc.). I would ask that all coaches and referees attend, but at least 1 representative from each school be required to attend this session.
- PEI Rugby does not have enough qualified referees. It has been an issue for a long time, but has gotten steadily worse over the past several years. If there is any way for the PEISAA to work with the rugby union for referee recruitment and training it MUST be done.
- Referees need to send in yellow and red card reports. The player sent off form is for red cards only. Yellow cards require an email saying the player's name, team, and the reason for card. We have a cumulative card discipline system that does not work if the commissioner is not made aware of cards.
- There should be a change in format to AA/AAA all stars. For the last few years, Kensington has been the only "AA" team during league play. Since we have a AA all star team of 15 and a AAA all star team of 15, this means that the team that finished last in AAA gets more all stars than the team that finished first in AAA. If we want players to continue in rugby, we need to work to recognize the best players. I suggest either a 1st and 2nd team of both levels combined, or a 25-person roster of 15 "starters" and 10 "reserves".

- There are a few minor changes to the Rugby Guidelines needed for clarification, especially regarding pool players. These will be added and stressed in the next iteration of the Guidelines document.
- Game sheets must be filled out and scores must be entered for games at the championship site. The host school is responsible for supplying game sheets and entering the scores online.

GENERAL COMMENTS:

The 6th Annual PEISAA Triton was held on May 22, 2017. Students and staff from thirteen schools swam, biked and ran the course at Credit Union Place (CUP), the Summerside boardwalk, Rufus St., Mackenzie Dr., Notre Dame St., and Northumberland St. The weather was comfortable but was a bit windy which was a wonderful challenge on the biking portion of the event.

Triathlon Directors, CJ Studer and Cheryl Tanton registered 92 triathletes from bantam through to senior and teachers/school staff for the event. The event continues to grow each year that it is held.

Cheryl Tanton, head official, was aided by lifeguards, police, student volunteers and adult volunteers on the road. As safety is of utmost concern, trained first aid personnel were present, with key individuals always in radio communication. Pathways were swept clean and detailed course information was given at the mandatory athlete's pre event meeting. The Summerside Police was informed of the event and assisted in securing the road sections of the triathlon. Notices were also placed in the Journal Pioneer, on the City of Summerside website and flyers were hand delivered to all residences and businesses that are on the event route. This is always done to inform residents of the event.

As this is an event that celebrates the intrinsic value of sport, there were no Provincial Champions declared. However, the PEISAA graciously allowed us to award a PEISAA Excellence in Triathlon Banner for the second year to the school that had the highest percent of triathletes per school population register and complete the event. We are very thankful for the banners and are excited about continuing this practice in future events. Each triathlete also received a Triton t-shirt as they finished the course. Times were taken to give the athletes a goal for improvement next year. No times were shared among the schools or zones, thus no results

were published. Each participant is a champion in their own right. The spirit of 'play' on the course is incredible!

This model of participation is foundational in the sport of triathlon and is a model in which the race directors and parents/families feel very strongly about.

The adopted model of registering and prepaying prior to the triathlon made registration on the morning of the event run smoothly. We will continue this model.

The facilities at Credit Union Place and the surrounding community of Summerside worked perfectly for this event. With unwavering support from the Summerside Chief of Police and the City's event staff-barricades and truck, use of city truck and gas for pickup and drop of of TriPEI trailer, and equipment appropriate roads were blocked off and the course was made secure for our triathletes.

The Triton could not be delivered if it were not for the work of the army of volunteers from Athena, Summerside Intermediate, Three Oaks, and dedicated parents/adults and teachers. They are critical to the success of the event and provided educational opportunities and service learning hours for these students.

A special award of a PEISAA t-shirt was handed out to recognize Karen Farag, a grade twelve student from Three Oaks Senior High School who participated in all six PEISAA Triathlon events.

This event is also a partnership with Triathlon PEI. This event needs their support through the use of their equipment. This event has been extensively covered by the media and has been a very positive experience for the athletes, teachers,volunteers, and spectators.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. With the partial open course design of the bike/run course, adults (with an understanding of triathlons) are needed to support high traffic areas.

Therefore it is recommended that along with the vast number of youth volunteers, adult volunteers will be continually sought after.

2. Some athletes did not complete all their biking laps - on purpose or not. This is no big deal for the event but will be communicated/managed better when students are on course.

3. The teacher's solo and relay division was a success, so it is recommended this continue.

4. The majority of schools who have entered triathletes have been doing so for the past five years. It would be a pleasure to see an expansion of schools register in the triathlon and create a community of student triathletes in the province. Perhaps the continuance of awarding of banners will entice other schools to participate.

5. In some schools, the triathlon information relayed to the AD's is not being passed on to all students/teachers in their schools. Upon discussions, teachers and students who may have been interested in the triathlon have said that they had no information about the event. Also we need to keep event staff at the Credit Union Place well informed as parents/families contact them seeking information.

Therefore it is recommended that the provided triathlon information be relayed by the AD's to all staff and students who are eligible to participate in the Triton triathlon.

In all, the Triton triathlon has become a successful annual event due to the participating triathletes and the unwavering support of our local volunteers, PEISAA (Craig Watson), the many partners of the PEISAA up and including the School Milk Foundation (Marilyn).

2. Recommend to use the IAAF tie breaker rule to break ties in the high jump. Rule 181.8

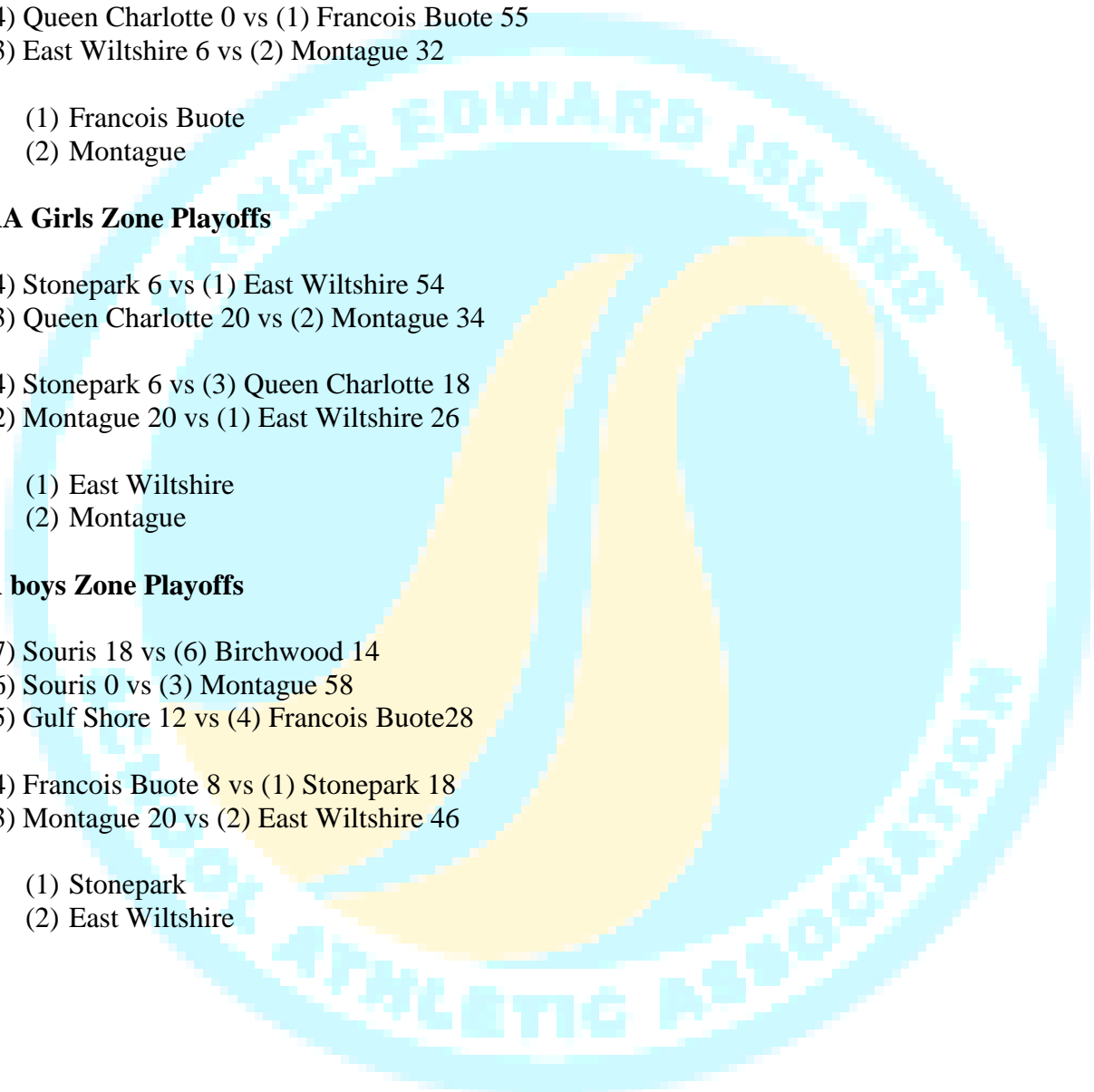
