## **Chair's Report 2019-2020**

As I finish my 2nd consecutive term as the Chair of the Prince Edward Island School Athletic Association (PEISAA), I am honored and feel privileged. Over the past 4 years in which I was Chair, the PEISAA has been rejuvenated. The PEISAA's accomplishments would have not been possible without the strong leadership and dedication of our School Sport Coordinator Phil Bridges and it has been a pleasure working with him. In addition, I would like to acknowledge our Executive who has brought insightful ideas and decisions to the table. These individuals have been vital in advocating for their respective member groups. It has also been a memorable experience working with these dedicated individuals and they helped paved the way for many years to come.

The 2019-2020 school year started strong. Last year, the PEISAA implemented an updated policy and procedures manual and launched a new website. Member schools have been very receptive to these changes and this year was focused on maintaining these changes. The updated policy and procedures manual has been well received along with the updated website continues to be successful for our member schools and coaches.

The PEISAA was pleased to collaborate with Special Olympics PEI to endorse their Unified Sport of Bocce. Unified sports joins students with and without an intellectual disability to be on the same team. This year, we saw 7 schools participate in a Unified Bocce Tournament that engaged a total of 88 students (43 potential Special Olympians along with 45 unified partners). On top of this, there were approximately 50 leadership students involved to help run the qualifiers and championships. This sporting opportunity was a powerful experience for all involved and the PEISAA will continue to support this collaborating with Special Olympics PEI.

During March break, all in-class schooling was cancelled due to the global COVID-19 pandemic. In return, for the first time in PEISAA history, spring sports were also suspended. Our member schools and volunteer coaches do a terrific job in creating sporting opportunities to our student athletes. The pandemic has certainly touched everyone's life in some way, but safety of our student athletes, coaches, officials, and other volunteers is the number one priority.

Since becoming Chair, there have been questions regarding how to improve and maintain our financial stability as an organization. In leaving the PEISAA, I can proudly state our financial statements are healthy. It has been a focus over the past 3 years to secure corporate sponsors and capitalize on missed revenue opportunities (focused on ensuring admission fees were collected at all our PEISAA Championships) to help offset our operating expenses while maintaining low membership fees. Phil Bridges and the PEISAA Executive have done an amazing job tackling our financials. I would like to acknowledge and thank all our sponsors in supporting our youth. Finally, I give praise to all our member schools, employees, coaches, and officials for everything that you have done to have an impact on our student athletes during the 2019-2020 school year.

Athletic Directors and coaches were efficient to deal with throughout the season in getting games re-scheduled. Players maintained positive sportsmanship toward each other and officials.
- There was issues in re-scheduling the Semi Final / Gold Medal games as the original schedule indicated that October 8<sup>th</sup> would be the final day for games, however, due to weather the Quarter-final games had to be played on this date, ideally, the Semi Final / Gold Medal game would have been played on October 10<sup>th</sup>, the recommendation was put forth to teams that October 10<sup>th</sup> be avoided due to PEISAA Golf provincials and unconfirmed field availability, a request was made by myself to look at October 12<sup>th</sup> or October 15<sup>th</sup>. A Quarter-final team had requested confirmation that October 10<sup>th</sup> was not going to be used as the re-schedule date. The following day, three of the four teams participating in the Semi finals strongly recommended that October 10<sup>th</sup> be the re-schedule date, a decision was made to schedule them for October 10<sup>th</sup> which was appealed by the team not in favor. October 15<sup>th</sup> was selected as the new date, which was affected by weather, the games ended up being completed October 22<sup>nd</sup> after multiple weather delays.

#### 4. GENERAL COMMENTS:

2019 intermediate and high school field hockey had excellent weather for league play. Most league days had double headers in Cornwall and at the same time, a double header in Montague (Wednesdays) and Summerside (Thursdays). An intermediate mini league tournament on Sept 29 in Cornwall did help with travel for Summerside and Montague.

Again this season I scheduled both intermediate and high school games (double header) at TOSH and Montague. The mini tournament held in Cornwall is a great idea for SIS and Montague Intermediate schools. They travel to Cornwall to play their home/away home against each other.....this saves travel cost/time for SIS and Montague schools. In 2020 we will try to schedule TOSH and Montague High schools home/away games in Cornwall.

FHC had a number of rule changes for 2019. These are IFH rules played at International competitions with International umpires. PEIFHA umpires have agreed there are two changes we will not include for safety reasons. 1. Playing the ball in the air above the shoulders. 2. Reverse stick HIT (known as Tomahawk ) was not to allowed.... Players are permitted to play with the reverse stick PASS. Umpires will revisit these rules for the start of 2020 season. The third IFH change has moved to playing 4 quarters (15 min quarters) with stop time for penalty corners. This requires more playing time ...which at this time we do not have.

The wearing of defensive penalty corners masks was made mandatory. I would like to thank all schools for their support!!

Thank you to Cornwall Recreation and Summerside CG turf for allowing field hockey the opportunity to use their turfs. Cornwall had requested new mesh netting for the two goals at Cornwall turf (replaced in 2016 for \$340) and 2017 season the goal boards were replaced ( \$250). PEIFHA bought this equipment for Cornwall. We will see if there if other equipment is required. New goals for Summerside would be a great help.

For Birchwood Intermediate School, third year in PEIFHA league, it was a special season as they were first in league play and won the gold medal for the Intermediate play. Congratulations Birchwood!

### 5. LEAGUE AND CHAMPIONSHIP RESULTS

#### **4. General Comments**

The 2020 school gymnastics season ended on Saturday, February 15<sup>th</sup> with the 2020 ADL Provincial Gymnastics Championship held at the Kensington Intermediate Senior High School. The championship was hosted by the St. Louis Elementary School for the 32<sup>nd</sup> year in a row.

The championship was scheduled to be held on Saturday February 8<sup>th</sup> but was postponed due to the weather.

Prov. team titles: Pre-Novice Boys- West Kent Elementary, Pre-Novice Girls L.M. Montgomery Elementary, Novice Boys Spring Park Elementary, Novice Girls LM Montgomery Elementary, Bantam Girls ME Callaghan Intermediate High. Individual awards were also given to the top six vault /floor routines and top ten all around.

A total of 239 gymnasts participated at this year's event. This was a decrease of 56 gymnasts from last year. Rescheduling was the main reason with athletes having prior commitments on the 15<sup>th</sup>. We had a total of 25 different schools from across PEI participated.

On Saturday morning the competition started at 9:00 am and finished ahead of time. A total of 124 gymnasts participated with 76 Pre-Novice Girls and 48 Pre-Novice Boys

On Saturday afternoon the competition started at 1:00 pm and finished 30 minutes behind schedule. A total of 84 gymnasts participated with 54 Novice Girls and 30 Novice Boys.

The late afternoon competition had a total of 31 gymnasts participate in Bantam Boys/ Girls, and Intermediate Boys/Girls, 5 Bantam Boys, 23 Bantam Girls and 3 Intermediate Girls.

For the fourth year in a row all 9 categories performed a Jump to Handspring onto a raised mat surface; fall to straight lying position on the back. Pre Novice 28" high and the Novice to Senior 36" Some school are still having challenges getting mats to reach the 36" height at their schools. It still remains the safest vault to perform for our school athletes.

The SAA also gave out our new ribbons this year and the coaches were pleased that all athletes receiving ribbons and went home with their awards. We had a few ties but we had lots of ribbons on hand to present at the championship.

All information and results were posted in the Guardian and the Journal. The media coverage before and after was good. All results were circulated to all the media, schools and on our SAA website within days of our championship.

We had a total of 461 paid spectators. We also charged \$ 3.00 admission with no apparent complaints from spectators.

Our computer program which calculated the results came through for us again. Within minutes of the end of both competitions, the results were handed out. I would like to thank Brian Alain once again for helping us with the results and registration.

I would like to say a special thank you to Phil Bridges our SAA School Sport Coordinator for his great support leading up to the championship. Not being able to help as in other years he went out of his way at times to get things ready for me.

ADL was announced several times as our new Title Sponsor for Gymnastics at the competition site and in our news release. ADL rep was there all day and presented awards to all our categories.
