4. GENERAL COMMENTS

I think that by changing baseball season to the fall, more players will be

interested/able to play and this will enable more schools to enter teams. Having the opportunity to have an A league as well as the AA, will allow more schools to join, knowing they have an appropriate league to play in.

C) Provincials

After canceling for impending weather on the Tuesday, we had a great day for provincial baseball on the Thursday. The two fields used are appropriate for Bantam baseball. Bantam fields, with mounds are in short supply so future provincials will need to plan accordingly.

D) Thank You

Thank you to Mike Richards, the officials assignor. Trying to find umpires for school ball when minor baseball is in full swing is a challenge, and is another reason why we should move to the fall.

Also thank you to Christopher Drummond from the City of Charlottetown who is in charge of field bookings. He was very accommodating and ensured that fields were in good shape for regular season games and provincials. Christopher also wanted to note that he would be supportive of moving baseball to the fall.

PEISAA Senior Soccer FINAL REPORT – 2020-21

1. SPORT PARTICIPATION NUMBERS

Male 14 teams (Up two from last year Kinkora and Evangeline) and approximately 250 players. *Female* 11 teams (Down one from last year) and approximately 190 players. We had 5 AAA Male teams, 6 AAA Female teams, and 9 A Male teams and 5 A Female teams.

2. GENERAL COMMENTS

The 2020 Fall Soccer Season was certainly a different year because of the global pandemic. We are certainly very lucky to live in PEI and to have Phil Bridges at the helm of the School Athletic Association. With Phil's leadership and many "protocol plans," we were able to allow our students to participate in school soccer. As always, this year was very entertaining and each division had its share of competitiveness. Because of Covid-19, we were forced to have "bubble" school play in divisions for the regular season, then cross over for playoffs. The A Men had three (3) divisions of three (3) teams. The A Women and AAA Men had two (2) divisions, one with Three (3) teams and one with two (2) teams. The AAA Women had two (2) divisions of three (3) teams. Game reporting has been very good again this year, using the Goal Line web site. Organizing playoffs was done at the first of the season as Phil drew up the schedules for the leagues. We just had to input teams as they advanced. The leagues were very

competitive for the most part, which made for entertaining soccer to watch. Thanks goes out to our sponsors, The Department of Education and Lifelong Learning, The PEI School Milk Foundation, and Eastlink Community Television. A big thanks goes out to Phil Bridges, the School Sport Coordinator for all his help throughout the season, especially getting the operational plans for the season, and having spectators at our league games, and championships at the Terry Fox Complex

3. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

1. Discipline reporting needs to be addressed. If we could have Goaline set up to enter cards, that would be very helpful. Once again, I was informed of several cards through email or text, which was helpful, but I can never be too sure if I am getting them all, unless all game sheets are sent to me.

2. I am adding (**again**) the following suggestions for the Sport Regulations regarding cards:

DISCIPLINE CARDS (SOCCER)

- 1. When a player receives 3 yellow cards during the season (exhibition, regular season, and tournament games) he/she will sit the next scheduled game, tournament included.
- 2. <u>Player's accumulated yellow cards will revert back to zero when the playoffs begin.</u>
- 3. A red card is an automatic one game suspension, depending on severity the suspension could be longer. If a player picks up a red card or a third yellow card on the last game before playoffs they would sit the first playoff game. <u>Red card offenses also continue into playoffs.</u>
 - a. <u>Serious Foul Play and Violent Conduct offenses will be longer than the one game and can expect a discipline committee to convene (either in person, or via email) to review the referee's report to consider the length of the suspension, expect it to be more than the one game.</u>
 - b. <u>Verbal Abuse of officials will be an automatic 2 games suspension.</u>
 - c. <u>Physical abuse of an official will be dealt with by a discipline committee.</u>
 - d. Spitting on another player will be automatic 2 games suspension.
 - e. Denying an Obvious Goal Scoring Opportunity will be a one game suspension.
 - f. <u>Using offensive, insulting, or abusive language will be a one game suspension</u>. In the case <u>of racial insults, a discipline committee will convene</u>.
 - g. <u>A second caution in the same game will result in a one game suspension.</u>

Note: All suspensions do not include the game the player is ejected, no matter the time of the ejection.

The third IFH change has moved to playing 4 quarters (15 min quarters) with stop time for penalty corners. This requires more playing time ...which at this time we do not have. 2020 was the second season for wearing mandatory defensive penalty corners masks and added the many ways to sanitize the masks for each penalty corner !! Thank you to Cornwall Recreation and Summerside CG turf for allowing field hockey the opportunity to use their turfs without charging a fee. Again , Thank you to all the coaches and umpires for their hard work! Thank you to both, Phil Bridges and Walter McEwen for their support.

5. **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

- 1. PEIFHA must work towards more umpires. Although school umpires in 2019 was a total of 9 umpires ,we lost 5 before the 2020 season started.
- 2. For Provincial playoffs' overtime. The 2-71/2 min periods will have stopped time for Penalty Corners. (FHC rule)

4. General Comments

The Bantam- Senior Cross Country season ended on October 15th with the 2020 Source for Sports Provincial Cross Country Championship at Charlottetown Rural High School.

The weather did cooperate at the Rural Provincial site this year with a beautiful sunny day. A total 340 runners ran the four different competitive courses. This was an increase of 50 runners from last year. All categories saw an increase except the Juvenile Men and Women categories, which were down 10 runners. The biggest increase was the Intermediate Boys and Girls category with an increase of 25 runners.

Many races had to run two waves due to the cap number of 50 runners permitted per race due to our COVID 19 Operational Plan. All races started on time and finished on time. The awards were presented after each race with the help of our official announcer Phil Bridges. All the results were posted on the SAA web site following the championship.

Thank you so much to all the teachers, students and volunteers from the Rural for helping with the success of the Championship.

Special thanks Esther Hovingh for her continued commitment with the Juvenile and Senior categories and volunteering to host the Bantam – Intermediate categories at Rural this year. Thanks to all the coaches for the time they put into this year's championship, everyone worked to ensure that the students had the best opportunity to compete at as high level as possible.

Recommendations for next year: pending a non covid 19 experience

1. Maintain the administration of the tournaments through the golf commissioners

2. Maintain the championship qualification format that requires all golfers to play a minimum of two qualification tournaments each season.

3. Issue the qualification tournament schedule in June, giving schools lots of notice in planning for the following year.

4. All qualifying tournaments must to be played on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays.

5. Investigate the possibility of having the girls play 18 holes at the championship

6.Evaluate the women's division, is it providing the type of competition needed?

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

Covid 19 has certainly disrupted school sport on PEI. Without being allowed to facilitate zone meets it became very difficult to determine the skill level of the individual golfers and therefore their ability to compete at a championship level.

In response to this situation it was decided to limit the number of golfers representing each school and ask school athletic directors to determine whether an individual golfer should compete at the Provincial Championship. Every Intermediate school could send a team in the boys and girls divisions.15 schools entered a boys team and 10 entered a girls team.

The PEISAA Provincial Championships were held at Avondale Golf Club, a special thanks to Connor Lea and the staff at Avondale for helping make the players so welcome. The golf course was in great shape and the weather was ideal.

Thanks to the school coaches and parents for helping supervise the golfers. With the change in format it was important for the golfers to stay on task and complete their round as quickly as possible, the adult supervisors certainly helped with this.

The girls played 9 holes and the boys played 18 holes.

Although the overall level of play was not what would be expected at a Provincial Championship there were a few great scores including a new individual record of 73 by Michael Taylor of Gulf Shore

Recommendations for next year:

1. Emphasize the importance of administrating the qualifying tournaments through the office of the zone representatives.

Maintain the 4 athletic zone championship qualification format three teams from each zone qualifying.
 With Intermediate schools playing in the fall, it is important that the qualifying tournaments be scheduled in the spring to insure the fall qualification tournament schedule is completed in time for the Provincial Champions

4. Maintain the shot gun format for the Provincial Championships.

5. With the number of athletes competing in golf increasing substantially, I believe that a committee needs to be set up to review the sport regulations for Intermediate golf. Topics to be reviewed should include but not be restricted to:

a. qualification expectations for boys and girls

b. scoring

c. championship format for the girls division

1. Covid 19 Pandemic

The pandemic was unleashed on the world early in 2020. The PEISAA basketball high school championships were the last significant sporting tournament to be held in Canada last March. The spring sport schedule was cancelled.

In the fall the PEISAA schedule was resumed following strictly observed protocols. Volleyball was one of these sports and the championships in that sport paved the way for the basketball regular season.

Initial schedule was completed at the Athletic Directors' meeting in November. The schedule that was created was interrupted twice as the Chief Medical Officer felt the Covid situation was too critical to allow indoor sport to continue without interruption. Time was added on to the schedule at the back end and everything was wrapped up by early April.

The participation numbers were high. The Senior women and the men each had seventeen teams taking part. The combined numbers of teams, thirty-four in all, was the highest numbers for basketball in SAA history. Close to five hundred student athletes competed at the senior high level.

2. Recommendations for 2021/22.

It is important that the organizers and the competitors maintain a flexible approach to the management, implementation and the safety and health considerations relative to the basketball competition as an important part of the PEISAA sport roll- out this year.

The Covid pandemic has not finished its run and we must insure that we are contributing to a program that contributes to maintaining what physical and mental normalcy we can without endangering all those involved. Last year an excellent balance was managed. This year we must continue along a road of reason that allows sport to approached normal goals while safely mitigating the hazards of the virus and its variants.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

It seems that coaches have some issues with the no zone rule especially at the AA level. Education around what a zone press looks like may need to be circulated to coaches before the start of next season. We also kept the formal 20 point rule in the league; however, the question came up at provincials of whether or not we should we use the 20 point rule during provincials. Maybe at the highest level this rule could change?

Technical fouls and unsportsmanlike fouls were up this year in the East. Both coaches and players were given these fouls. At the start of next year, it is important that the AD's of each school go over the PEISAA rules of fair play and conduct. Especially with coaches who may not be in the school system.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

- 2. Continue with the no zone rule for regular season and playoffs.
- 3. Set all playoff dates for next season in both the East and West before the season begins. Have a set number of days off before the playoffs begin to allow for any makeup dates that cannot be made up during the season.

Multiple times throughout the school year the schools were shut down as a "Circuit breaker" method. We decided to cancel all qualifying meets and only have the Provincials. Each participating school was responsible for ensuring that their lifters were ready to compete at the

Provincial meet.

The PEI School Milk Foundation also supplied Chocolate Milk for all the lifters during the competition. Westisle Composite High School was the host of the P EISAA All-Star Cresting High School Powerlifting Provincials held on April 10th. Brett Corcoran (AD) & George Kinch (Coach) were the meet managers. I would like to thank George & Brett for all that they did this year. It was not an easy year but they did it well and with a smile on their face. It was very well set-up and the lifters had ample space to social distance themselves from others. We had 4 judges, 4 spotters, 3 technicians and 1 announcer to run the meet. Along with that we had 1 Covid manager and 3 Covid screeners due to the CPHO requirements. The Provincials this year were run as two events. The Female competition was in the morning at 10am & the Male competition got underway at 2:30pm. We were able to give out all the medals and banners right after t he final lifts. We had two medal ceremonies where Phil Bridges (School Sport Coordinator) was onsite to address the lifters, coaches & spectators. It was a great experience to see the lifters receive their hard earned medals and to see the winning team celebrate their victory. We will make sure that this is done every year moving forward. 4. GENERAL COMMENTS

The PEISAA provincial badminton championships were held May 4 to May 8, 2021. This year, 5 Charlottetown and area schools were used, along with Bluefield for Mixed Doubles.

Championship titles in Novice, Bantam, Intermediate, Juvenile and Senior boys' and girls' categories were all up for grabs in singles, doubles and mixed play. Most of our Island schools were represented in zone playoffs, with the top two from the four zones advancing to the provincials in Novice, Bantam and Intermediate. In Juvenile, Senior and Mixed categories, there were East and West regional events to decide who went to Provincials.

In a very close Senior Mens' final, Dylan Batchilder of Rural defeated his teammate from Rural Spencer Gallant 21-18 and 22-20 to win the provincial title. Xiao Chen from Gray defeated Hans Zhang of Rural in a three game match 21-18, 10-21 and 21-14 to claim the senior boys bronze medal. In doubles action, Batchilder and Gallant from Rural defeated Jeremy Norman and Xiao Chen from Gray in three games 14-21, 21-15 and 21-13. The bronze medal was won by Westisle. Chandler DesRoches and Isaac Oliver defeated Aiden Arsenault and Matthew Hebert of Rural 21-17 and 21-17. With a first, second and fourth in singles and a first and fourth in doubles, Charlottetown Rural won the Provincial Championship with 15 points.

In girls' action, Karla MacCallum of Gray dominated the field and defeated Hayden Ford of Bluefield to win the Senior Womens' Provincial Championship. The scores of the games were 21-4 and 21-8. Torey MacDonald of Bluefield defeated Mia Martell of Montague 17-21, 21-14 and 21-9 to claim the bronze medal in singles. In the doubles

final, Ford and MacDonald of Bluefield defeated Belle Ashley and Keely Dynment of Westisle 21-11 and 21-12. In an all Montague bronze medal match Carrie Docherty and Erin Morris of defeated Lacey White and Maggie Murphy 20-22, 21-12 and 21-15 to claim the bronze medal. By coming second and third in singles, along with a first in doubles, Bluefield won the provincial championship with 10 points.

Senior Mixed Doubles champions this year are Karla MacCallum and Jeremy Norman of Gray. They defeated Lacey White and Dylan MacLean of Montague 21-9 and 21-7. MacCallum and Norman went 5-0 and never gave up more than 11 points in any game to win the championship. Molly Doyle and Jeremie Boultilier of Rural defeated Gracie McQuaid and Will Morrison of Rural 21-13 and 21-18 to win the bronze medal. Colonel Gray wins the senior mixed provincial title with 6 points.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

This year was the fifth year for regional qualifiers in the juvenile and senior divisions. The schedule was very similar to past years. We are now at a point where the schedule works and there will only need to be minor adjustments made each year.

This year I turned my attention to the Novice, Bantam and Intermediate levels in Zone 4. There was a new zone 4 representative this year and change was needed in this zone. Each zone does do their zone play quite differently to get ready for Provincials. I have already met with the zone reps to start the process of making all 4 zones run close to the same. I can see 2 zones having a couple of distinct differences in their qualifier stages due to high numbers in zone 3 and lower numbers in zone 1. Having a qualification round before a zone competition for singles in all 4 zones is important as it helps to rank the players and gives them a competition before their zones. Next year they will all be very similar in how they do their play downs.

COVID and a longer than usual basketball season played havoc with the scheduling of badminton this year. We eventually had CPHO approve our provincials and the schools figured out how to manage their teams for zones. In the end, badminton ran a week later than usual but we were able to 100% complete zones and provincials.

Having players report scores at Provincials, if they were going to a third game, worked very well again this year. It is great to see that the players are aware of how important scores are. There is also a group of P.E. teachers who have become very efficient at doing PEISAA tie breakers. This is very important in regional and zone play as well as in pool play at provincials.

This year we were in the Charlottetown area and next year we will be back to the Summerside area. Bluefield has become the host of the mixed championships and having a school in the middle of the province hosting this championship in one evening is working very well. I think that moving back and forth between the two largest areas in the province for all singles and doubles events is the way to run the championship. It also aligns with many of our other sports championship formats.

This year the schedule was drawn out over a week. Mixed was played on Tuesday. The other categories were played on Thursday and Saturday. This gave senior mixed a chance to play earlier in the week so they were not over worked if they chose to play either singles or doubles. The mixed group played their pool play and medal round in one night. This meant that the top 4 teams played 5 games in one night. They were happy to have the competition all in one night, so I plan on continuing it again next year at Bluefield.

Lastly, this was the fourth year for Yonex as a sponsor. Thanks to Yonex for being our badminton sponsor and for the great prizes they give us.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

High school rugby returned in 2021 and the season was a massive success! PEI is the only province in Canada that was able to play a full high school rugby season! Players, coaches, referees, and Athletic Directors put in many hours of hard work to continue the tradition of high caliber high school rugby. I'd like to thank Phil Bridges, School Sport Coordinator, for his support, guidance, and work behind the scenes to ensure that the season went ahead during an incredibly difficult time. Another thank you goes to Anthony Scott, as Referee Assignor. Anthony was tasked with assigning officials for over 100 rugby games with only 7 active officials this season. Also, thank you to Darryl Boudreau for his work to prepare Bluefield to host all our provincial championships and to ensure that the site was set up for spectators. Thank you to Walter MacEwen for his work maintaining the PEISAA website. For anyone not mentioned above that had a hand in allowing the high school rugby season to take place during a global pandemic - thank you!

This season, our Safe Rugby clinics continued, with a slightly different look. 2 sessions were held in person - one at Three Oaks and one at Charlottetown Rural. The session at Charlottetown Rural was filmed to ensure that all coaches who could not attend in person were able to take in the session after the fact. Each coach was also required to complete World Rugby's Rugby Ready module and NCCP's Making Headway module before the season. This season, we had over 50 coaches from 7 Island high schools.

This season, pre-season scrimmages were used for the first time. With two-thirds of the athletes having not played high school rugby before, we felt that a gradual introduction to the game would benefit the teams. These scrimmages were very successful - coaches were encouraged to be on the field directing players and discussing on-field situations.

This year, the women's A league flourished. There were 7 teams, with Three Oaks, Bluefield, and Charlottetown Rural all fielding 2 teams! The league was also very evenly matched, and the league standings came down to several tie-breaks to determine final standings. In the playoffs, Charlottetown Rural #2 beat Bluefield #1 in the final 32-15. Participation in the men's league was down significantly this season with Bluefield and Three Oaks being the only teams to compete in the playoffs. In the final, Bluefield beat Three Oaks 20-15 in a very exciting game.

The women's AAA league was very close this year with Colonel Gray, Three Oaks, and Bluefield finishing a three-way tie on top of the standings. In the playoffs, after competing in the AAA league during the regular season, Montague, Kensington, and Westisle dropped down to play for the AA championship. In the AA final, Westisle and Kensington battled right down to the final whistle, with Westisle taking it 12-11. In the AAA playoffs, it came down to Three Oaks and Bluefield in the final. Three Oaks took home the banner with a 9-7 win in the final. The AAA men's league was the closest I have seen this year. The top 5 teams were all capable of beating each other and winning the provincial championship. In the end, Charlottetown Rural and Three Oaks met in the final, with Charlottetown Rural winning the game 7-5.

Thank you to everyone for your cooperation in following CPHO guidelines to ensure that the season could happen and for your continued work to make high school rugby a success.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

- This year, the number of rugby officials on PEI reached an all-time low. There are now only 7 active rugby referees down from 10 in 2019 and 12 in 2018. The PEISAA requires about 8-10 referees to avoid referee burnout and perceived conflicts of interest. This season, the number of referees dropped below that threshold, and referees were overworked and put in situations they should not be put in (i.e. refereeing games where players they currently coach are involved). The PEISAA **NEEDS** to work with the PEI Rugby Union to create a plan to recruit more rugby referees. The PEISAA requires more officials than the PEIRU, so it cannot fall solely on the PEIRU's shoulders to recruit and provide officials to the PEISAA.
- Require coaches to complete the World Rugby Concussion Management online module instead of NCCP's Making Headway. World Rugby's Concussion Management module is a rugby-specific resource that is similar to Making Headway, but improved. Making Headway does not allow coaches to re-take the module and can only be tracked with Sport PEI's help. World Rugby's module produces a dated certificate upon completion and can be re-done anytime.
- I believe that we should continue to remove PEI-specific items from our Rugby Guidelines. So,

I believe we should move to fully commit to using World Rugby's laws. We have made several changes toward this in the past several years, and we should continue to do so moving forward.

- The selection process for league all stars should be less arbitrary. This season, every league selected a different number of all stars, and coaches were not given accurate information when they were asked for all star nominees or for all star voting. AAA leagues with 6+ teams should select 15 all star starters and 10 reserves. AAA leagues with fewer than 6 teams should select 15 all stars. A leagues with 5+ teams should select a first and second team with 7 all stars on each. A leagues with fewer than 5 teams should select 7 all stars. University and representative coaches use all star selections as identifiers for recruitment and selection. More thought and preparation needs to be put into their selection.
- The pre-season scrimmages should continue to be used moving forward. These were very helpful to introduce the game to new players and to re-introduce gameplay to returning players and referees. I will work with ADs and coaches prior to the 2022 season to plan these scrimmages. Having 3-4 teams at one site may add to the benefits with coaches and players able to watch other teams play in addition to playing themselves.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

This year the East and West flag football leagues continued with an A/AA league in both boys and girls. We had 22 schools take part in the league this year, 12 in the West and 10 in the East. Games continued to be played mostly on Tuesday/Wednesday in the West (one Friday and one Monday) and Monday to Thursday (three Fridays) in the East. The East schedule this year was split between the Cornwall Turf, Longworth fields and François Buote. The turf could only host 2 games at a time and no fans were permitted. Longworth Ave field was used on Monday and Wednesday nights but was not available two nights due to a very wet field. François Buote became the go to as there were no limitations on field usage. Thanks to the Town of Cornwall (Greg Lucas), City of Charlottetown (Christopher Drummond), City of Summerside (Ryan Steele) and François Buote (JP Gallant) for their cooperation with field usage this year. We could not run the busy schedules we have without their cooperation and flexibility. This year there were 60 flag football teams, easily the largest sport in the junior high schedule.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

There seems to be three tiers to flag football. Next year the leagues should reflect this. Having an A/AA/AAA system would have teams in the proper division and all games would be closer and more competitive. There are always a few AA teams that are not as competitive as the top teams. The top AA teams could be AAA and the upper A teams and lower AA teams could form the AA league. The lower A teams that struggle to field a team or who lose to the top A teams could form their own A league. This would give them meaningful games and a chance to win a championship.

Refereeing needs to continue to grow and improve. We need to continue to recruit new officials so we can have two officials on each game and three in playoff games.

When possible, we should attempt to have as many games as possible being played on the two turf fields. However, the use of fields at François Buote and Longworth field will be needed again next year.

Mouth guards should continue to be highly recommended for all players. Numbers need to be put on the front and back of all jerseys next year. A high school league should be looked at to continue the growth of the sport.
