4. GENERAL COMMENTS

Good weather was a tremendous help in getting our games and season in this year. The move from Spring to Fall means that we have awarded our second PEISAA baseball championship in the past 5 months! Attending the highly competitive provincial championship game showed that there is certainly a level of interest from our students in school baseball. Congratulations to EWS who reversed last season's 5-4 final score, in taking the title.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS

A) Keep it in the fall but look at options

Following along with last year's recommendation, this season baseball moved from Spring to the Fall, where I believe it should stay. There are several reasons for this, as mentioned in previous reports that include, condition of fields, availability of umpires, players being in "game shape", and the fact that most teams are finished of their minor ball by now. Obviously this year, the addition of "Fall Ball" in minor baseball did have an impact (BW and Ecole sur Mer had to drop out) but I believe it can be limited if schools and students know going into future years that school baseball will stay in the fall. As mentioned, the passion and enjoyment witnessed during provincials shows that the students value this experience. That being said, there are certainly obstacles that we need to work around. We tried Saturdays this year, with limited success but it might be a better option in another year. The other possibility is scheduling a couple "jamborees", where teams could get 2-3 games in at once, in order to take some of the pressure off of scheduling multiple games around a variety of outside issues.

B) If numbers warrant it, bring back the A and AA Leagues

If we are able to have enough schools enter teams, ideally we would have an A and AA league. There are wide ranges of talent between and even within teams, and finding an enjoyable and safe place to play would further help with numbers.

C) Provincials

Great evening of provincial baseball. Bantam sized fields are rare on PEI so our options are limited with venues for future years. The lights at City Field make it a great venue for players and spectators alike.

D) Pitch Counts

A reminder to teams that ideally you would keep track of both your pitcher, and the opposing team's pitcher when it comes to pitch counts. An honest mistake in the final created some controversy that we can avoid in the future. It's often hard for a coach to do this as well as coach, so it's helpful to have this role assigned to a parent.

E) Thank You

Thank you to Mike Richards, the umpire assignor. No issues at all this season. That's always a nice thing to not have to worry about. Thanks for taking care of that. Also thank you to Christopher Drummond from the City of Charlottetown who is in charge of field bookings. He was very accommodating and ensured that fields were in good shape for regular season games and provincials.

PEISAA SENIOR SOCCER FINAL REPORT – 2021-22

1. SPORT PARTICIPATION NUMBERS

Male 9 A and 5 AAA teams and approximately 250 players. *Female* 5 A teams and 5 AA teams and approximately 180 players.

2. GENERAL COMMENTS

The 2021 Fall Soccer Season was very entertaining and each division had its share of competitiveness. At the end of the season, all leagues, with the exception of the AAA Men's division were very close in standings. Once again, game reporting has been very good this year, using the Goal Line web site. Once again, the standings came down to the last couple games to determine most positions, making the leagues very competitive. Thanks goes out to our sponsors, The Department of Education and Lifelong Learning, The PEI School Milk Foundation, Grant Thornton, and Eastlink Community Television. A big thanks goes out to Phil Bridges, the School Sport Coordinator for all his help throughout the season.

3. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

1. I have had a couple coaches question why we do not use a 3 point for a win, and 1 point for a tie, as almost every FIFA league in the world does use this point system. I have no issues with this, and would suggest going this route next year. For the record, it would not have changed any positions this year in any of our senior leagues.

2. There were a number of games rescheduled this year, due to a lack of officials. One issue is playing when Holland College plays (Usually once a year on a weekday). We would be prudent to have their schedule in hand at the scheduling meeting (not that it would have mattered this year, because they rescheduled, last minute, which messed up two nights for us). We had more games this year than last year, so it was a bit more difficult getting games filled, however, schools were very accommodating rescheduling.

3. To ease cost to schools and easing of officials, I would recommend going to one Saturday in September, where we could schedule 6 games at the same venue (Bluefield offered 3 years ago).

4. Card reporting still needs to be addressed. Can we look at reporting on Goalline (if that is a possibility) Presently, I rely on an email or text after games indicating cards given out or if there were no cards. This has proven to be very ineffective, as AD's are asking if certain players are to sit out games, and I have no record of any cards

7. I am adding (again) the following suggestions for the Sport Regulations regarding cards (I was not involved in any discussion around this, so I am not sure if it was addressed):

DISCIPLINE CARDS (SOCCER)

- 1. When a player receives 3 yellow cards during the season (exhibition, regular season, and tournament games) he/she will sit the next scheduled game, tournament included.
- 2. <u>Player's accumulated yellow cards will revert back to zero when the playoffs begin.</u>
- 3. A red card is an automatic one game suspension, depending on severity the suspension could be longer. If a player picks up a red card or a third yellow card on the last game before playoffs they would sit the first playoff game. <u>Red card offenses also continue into playoffs.</u>
 - a. <u>Serious Foul Play and Violent Conduct offenses will be longer than the one game and can</u> <u>expect a discipline committee to convene (either in person, or via email) to review the</u> <u>referee's report to consider the length of the suspension, expect it to be more than the</u> <u>one game.</u>
 - b. Verbal Abuse of officials will be an automatic 2 games suspension.
 - c. <u>Physical abuse of an official will be dealt with by a discipline committee.</u>
 - d. Spitting on another player will be automatic 2 games suspension.

- e. <u>Denying an Obvious Goal Scoring Opportunity will be a one game suspension.</u>
- f. <u>Using offensive, insulting, or abusive language will be a one game suspension</u>. In the case <u>of racial insults, a discipline committee will convene</u>.
- g. <u>A second caution in the same game will result in a one game suspension.</u>

Note: All suspensions do not include the game the player is ejected, no matter the time of the ejection.

8. We had a couple instances this year, where players were red carded before the championship games. In most FIFA competitions, a player does not sit on the bench for the games they are suspended. However, we are running our competitions, and we should be able to allow or disallow players to sit on the bench for Championship games only, as there will be team pictures after the game. I believe the ability to sit on the bench with his/her team mates, should be left to the discretion of the PEISAA and commissioner.

9. Given we have sponsorship deals with several partners, team pictures during the finals weekend, players must wear their medals for these pictures. The school Milk Foundation pays for all the medals and milk, therefore players are to show respect for the medals, at least until they leave the playing surface to go home. Pictures are not to be taken until all players have their medals around their necks, facing forward.

play with the reverse stick PASS. Umpires will revisit these rules for the start of 2022 season. The third IFH change has moved to playing 4 quarters (15 min quarters) with stop time for penalty corners. This requires more playing time ...which at this time we do not have.

2021 was the second season for wearing mandatory defensive penalty corners masks and added the many ways to sanitize the masks for each penalty corner !! There are a number of other covid protocols that will likely remain for 2022.

Thank you to Cornwall Recreation and Summerside CG turf for allowing field hockey the opportunity to use their turfs without charging a fee.

Again, Thank you to all the coaches and umpires for their hard work!

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

The covid-19 rules were not as strict this year, so five qualification tournaments were held to allow schools to select which ones they wished to participate in. Intermediate Golf went through a change in format during the 2021-22 season. We held qualifiers in our four zones but held 9 hole individual play for both Girls and Boys and introduced a three member team scramble format of nine holes for both Girls and Boys.

Points were awarded for the first four finishers (6-4-3-1) in both individual and team play for both Girls and Boys. Medals were awarded to top 3 Girls and top 3 Boys Individuals and Teams. The School that earned the most points in Girls Individual and Scramble play received the Girls Championship Golf Banner. Likewise, the Boys School received the Boys Championship Golf Banner.

As a result of these changes we had more students participating at the qualifiers and the Championships with everyone having the opportunity to play 18 holes if they were successful in qualifying for both formats. Thanks to Connor Lea and his Staff at Avondale for helping make the players so welcome. The Golf Course was in great shape and the weather was the best in years. Thanks to the school coaches and parents for helping supervise the golfers. The change in format was different for all and with everyone's cooperation it went off very smoothly in our first attempt. We will be meeting to evaluate our change in format – I believe that we made a very successful change that was accepted by most participants. The positive comments that we heard were all we could hope for – the teamwork and encouragement that players expressed to each other was nice to see and hear. Special Thanks to Phil Bridges – he was always there when I needed him !

5. RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Emphasize the importance of administering the qualifying tournaments through the office of the zone representatives.

2. Maintain the 4 athletic zone championship qualification format that was developed this year. A meeting to discuss the pros and cons should be held in the near future.

3. With Intermediate schools playing golf in the Fall, it is important that the qualifying tournaments be scheduled in the Spring to ensure that all schools are aware of the short time that they have in September to be ready to go. If booking of courses gets any busier that is a major concern. Communication between schools for setting dates is of utmost importance.

4. Maintain the format of 9 holes each for individual and scramble play.

5. With the number of athletes competing in golf increasing substantially, I believe that a committee needs to be set up to review the sport regulations for Intermediate golf - topics to be reviewed should include but not restricted to:

a) qualification expectations for boys and girls

b) scoring

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

COVID derailed the flow of our basketball season this year as we had to pause the season at Christmas time. When we picked up the season in February we did not count the standings from the first half and started fresh in the second half. Due to having limited time, the large A leagues were broken in half. This way every team was able to play 5 games in the second half. Two teams due to COVID issues did not play one game. The first half standings were used to help make the divisions, but the results did not carry over. We were able to have almost every team get the second half of their season played, but we had to use March Break to do it.

This year the Intermediate East and West basketball leagues stopped the implementation of a no zone rule. This included a no zone press rule. We did keep the formal 20 point rule in the

league. If a team is up by 20 points they should drop back to half and play half court defense and play no full court man to man. I do wonder if we should use the 20 point rule during provincials?

Both AA leagues were Island-wide leagues with SIS in boys and girls and Hernewood boys joining the east leagues. The scores in the A girls league are continuing to widen, as does the skill level of the teams. Many people have voiced their opinion about having an AA, A and B or AAA, AA and A league next year. This would put teams in a division that would have them playing competitive games. We could have seeding games before Christmas and then after Christmas they would be placed in the proper division for the remainder of the season.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

- 1. Continue with the 20 point rule.
- Set all playoff dates for next season in both the East and West before the season begins. Have a set number of days off before the playoffs begin to allow for any makeup dates that cannot be made up during the season.
- 3. Have an AA, A and B league or AAA, AA and A league. Have teams play teams in their division before Christmas and reclassify after Christmas to make 3 leagues.

For the 2021-2022 school year we were still in the COVID-19 pandemic. Restrictions were different and by the end of the year all restrictions were removed. This meant that our two qualifier competitions had COVID restrictions but the provincial competition did not. We had to delay the provincial championships due all schools being in home learning during the last part of the first semester (January/February). In total this year we had 9 high schools participate with a total of 59 female lifters & 58 male lifters competing in the qualifiers. That gave us an all time high number of Powerlifters in the PEISAA (118 total lifters).

The first Qualifier was held at WestIsle High School on December 2nd 2021. This qualifier was for the team from the western part of the island. Brett Corcoran & George Kinch were the meet managers for the event. The schools that were represented are the following : WestIsle, Kinkora & TOSH with 52 total lifers competing. We had 3 judges, 4 spotters & 2 technicians as event staff. The competition went smoothly. The qualifier for the eastern schools was held on December 7th & 13th 2021 at Bluefield High School. We required a second date to finish the competition due to a power outage on the 7th. Darryl Boudreau, Christian King & Jason Trainor set up the events for both days. The schools that were represented are the following : Souris, Montague, La-Belle-Cloche, François-Buote, Colonel Gray & Bluefield with a total of 56 lifters . Another great competition!

We had an increase in sponsorships this year. Joel & Jeremy Watts (Bluefield graduates) from All-Star Cresting were back to sponsor the Provincials. They sold meet apparel and provided shirts for all event staff. Mike Armstrong from StrongArm Sport provided us with new calibrated Powerlifting plates, a competition barbell and barbells to give out to the winning teams. John MacDonald & Justin Smith from the PEI Powerlifting Association gave out best lifters prizes at both qualifiers as well as at the provincial championships. The prizes given out by the PEIPLA were free memberships to the association. Rhea & Ryan Stinn from InnerStrength products decided to send us gift cards to give out to the lifters during the championships. These were given out as door prizes. The School Milk Foundations also supplied Chocolat Milk for all the lifters during the competition. They also provided the medals.

École Francois-Buote was the host of the 21-22 PEISAA All-Star Cresting High School Powerlifting Provincials held on April 13th. Myself, Mitchell Caissy (Coach/AD) was the meet manager. I am very pleased with how the provincial championship played out this year. The PEISAA provided new banners & a tent to set up. We had banners up behind the platform for each of our sponsors. For the event staff we had 4 judges, 4 spotters, 2 technicians and 1 announcer to run the meet. The judging was done by certified judges from the Canadian Powerlifting Union. Justin Smith, Jillian MacCallum-Sproul, Tilman Gallant & John MacDonald. The spotters for the day were the following : Logan Vessey, Brennen Gallant, Nicole Kenny & Prabdeep Singh. They are all experienced Powerlifters and were very efficient & professional. The technicians were very efficient getting all the weigh-ins, weight classes & results entered. This allowed us to have a medal ceremony following the competitions. They were the following : Paulina Morales-Munroe, Jesse Montgomery & McKenna Moore. The following was our schedule for the day :

8am - Female Weigh-ins open
9:30am - Female Competition starts
11:30am - Male Weigh-ins open
12:30pm - Female medal ceremony (and lunch)
1pm - Male competition starts
4pm - Male medal ceremony

We did run late with the last attempt of the day being lifted in the evening. All prizes, medals and banners were given out by the end of the day. It was an amazing experience for me to give out a brand new barbell to the championship teams. The excitement in the gymnasium was overwhelming.

The sport seems to be growing within PEI schools. The schools that were represented are the following : WestIsle, Bluefield, Montague, François-Buote, Colonel Gray, Kinkora, Souris, La-belle-cloche & TOSH. With the new qualification rules in effect we had 86 lifters qualify for provincials. At the last minute I had multiple coaches inform me of qualified lifters that could not attend the competition. I then selected the next best lifter (by WILKS) to fill those spots. On the day of the competition we had a total of 78 lifters compete. This year we had two schools win a championship banner for the first time. Colonel Gray won the female team banner & Three Oaks won the male team banner. Congratulations to both winning teams on their well earned victories.

Many of the lessons learned while training for a meet can be applied to the lifters school studies & life in general. I witnessed great sportsmanship this year. I observed lifters being very vocal while cheering on other lifters, regardless of the school they represented. It was apparent that everyone wanted to see everyone succeed on the platform. This year we received amazing support from sponsors, schools, coaches & parents. Without all of them, we would not be able to offer this amazing experience to our students. 4. GENERAL COMMENTS

The PEISAA provincial badminton championships were held May 3 to May 7, 2022. This year, 5 Summerside and area schools were used, along with Bluefield for Mixed Doubles.

Championship titles in Novice, Bantam, Intermediate, Juvenile and Senior boys' and girls' categories were all up for grabs in singles, doubles and mixed play. Most of our Island schools were represented in zone playoffs, with the top two from the four zones advancing to the provincials in Novice, Bantam and Intermediate. In Juvenile, Senior and Mixed categories, there were East and West regional events to decide who went to Provincials.

In a very close Senior Mens' final, Dylan MacLean of Montague defeated Maguire Brennan of Westisle 21-13 and 22-20 to win the provincial title. Keegan Arsenault from Rural defeated Will Somers of Three Oaks 21-16 and 21-19 to claim the senior boys bronze medal. In doubles action, Rural claimed 3 of the 4 top positions. Spencer Gallant and Jérémie Boutilier from Rural defeated Maguire Brennan and Kavon Bernard from Westisle 21-15 and 21-17 to win the gold. The bronze medal was an all Rural match. Keegan Arsenault and Carter Sigsworth defeated James Wood and Ryan Yu 22-20 and 21-17. With a first, third and fourth in doubles and a third in singles, Charlottetown Rural won the Provincial Championship with 10 points.

In girls' action, Westisle had the two top senior women's singles players. Macy Hackett defeated Chloe Gallant 21-19 and 21-13 to win the Senior Womens' Provincial Singles

Championship. Jiahui Pan of Rural defeated Tessa Larose of Three Oaks 21-18, 18-21 and 21-18 to claim the bronze medal in a very close singles match. In the doubles Westisle continued their dominance. Amelia DesRoche and Chloe Gallant of Westisle defeated Tessa Larose and Brianna Shortt of Three Oaks 21-19, 19-21 and 21-18. In an all Westisle bronze medal match, Avery Noye and Ella Collins defeated Hailey Williams and Macy Hackett 12-21, 21-18 and 21-19 to claim the bronze medal. By coming first and second in singles, along with a first, third and fourth in doubles, Westisle won the provincial championship with 16 points.

Senior Mixed Doubles champions this year are Maria Campaneau and Dan Do of Gray. They defeated Lauren King and Dylan MacLean of Montague 16-21, 21-18 and 21-15. Aaliyah MacDonald and Matt MacFarlane of Three Oaks defeated Sydney Muttart and Tyson McCardle of Kinkora 17-21, 22-20 and 21-15 to win the bronze medal. Colonel Gray wins the senior mixed provincial title with 5 points.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

This year was the sixth year for regional qualifiers in the juvenile and senior divisions. The schedule was very similar to past years. We are now at a point where the schedule works and there will only need to be minor adjustments made each year.

With the basketball season running long this year, badminton had a shorter than usual season. Therefore, the plans to get all 4 zones in novice, bantam and intermediate to look very similar will have to wait until next year. There will be a meeting with the zone reps to have their input and to get the zone play downs ready for next season. All zones in singles should have a qualifier to rank players and to eliminate a few players. Then they can play a double elimination tournament since they are ranked to get the top two players from each zone. Doubles will be played after the singles qualifier so that teams can be ranked and put into a double elimination tournament or they can have pool play and then do a double elimination tournament. This is still to be decided.

Having players report scores at Provincials, if they were going to a third game, worked very well again this year. I recommend that it is used at zone play as well. It is great to see that the players are aware of how important scores are. There is also a group of P.E. teachers who have become very efficient at doing PEISAA tie breakers. This is very important in regional and zone play as well as in pool play at provincials.

It also looks like we have found a way to use the PEISAA tiebreaker to break ties for provincial championships. If two or more teams are tied, then the scores of teams and players involved will be used to break the tie. If the zone reps and executive agree to this, I will put more details in next year's report.

This year we were in the Summerside area and next year we will be back to the Charlottetown area. Bluefield has become the host of the mixed championships and having a school in the middle of the province hosting this championship in one evening is working very well. I think that moving back and forth between the two largest areas in the province for all singles and

doubles events is the way to run the championship. It also aligns with many of our other sports championship formats.

This year the schedule was drawn out over a week. Mixed was played on Tuesday. The other categories were played on Thursday and Saturday. This gave senior mixed a chance to play earlier in the week so they were not over worked if they chose to play either singles or doubles. The mixed group played their pool play and medal round in one night. This meant that the top 4 teams played 5 games in one night. They were happy to have the competition all in one night, so I plan on continuing it again next year at Bluefield.

Moving the provincials back to the last full week of April is recommended as moving into the first week of May is very late for the junior and senior highs in the province. Many of the Athletic Directors coach both badminton and flag or rugby and the overlap is very difficult for many players.

Lastly, this was the fifth year for Yonex as a sponsor. Thanks to Yonex for being our badminton sponsor and for the great prizes they give us.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

High school rugby was back in full swing without restrictions this season, and the season went very well! Players, coaches, referees, and Athletic Directors put in many hours of hard work to continue the tradition of high caliber high school rugby. I'd like to thank Phil Bridges, School Sport Coordinator, for his support, guidance, and work behind the scenes to ensure that the season went ahead during an incredibly difficult time. Another thank you goes to Anthony Scott, as Referee Assignor. Anthony was tasked with a lot of assigning gymnastics with only 6 healthy officials for much of the season. Also, thank you to UPEI for providing their facilities for the provincial championships. Thank you to Walter MacEwen for his work maintaining the PEISAA website. For anyone not mentioned above that had a hand in this season's success thank you!

This season, our Safe Rugby clinics evolved further. One session was held in person, with a Google Classroom link being shared for coaches that couldn't make the trip. Following the session, a recording was sent out to all coaches to ensure that everyone was able to take in the session. Each coach was also required to complete World Rugby's Rugby Ready module and NCCP's Making Headway module before the season. This season, we had 60 coaches representing teams from 7 Island high schools.

This season, pre-season scrimmages returned with a slightly different look. The scrimmages took place as jamboree-style events with 3-4 teams involved in most. These scrimmages have been a great addition, with coaches being encouraged to be on the field directing players and discussing on-field situations.

This year, the level in the women's and men's A leagues were fantastic. The women's league was very evenly matched with 3 ties during the regular season. In the playoffs, Three Oaks #2 beat Charlottetown Rural in the final 32-15. Participation in the men's league was up slightly from last season with the return of a Charlottetown Rural team. In the final, Charlottetown Rural beat Three Oaks 31-17 in a very exciting game.

The women's AAA league was very close this year with Bluefield, Three Oaks, and Charlottetown Rural all having a real chance to win the championship. Kensington also deserves a lot of credit for fielding a truly competitive team. In the playoffs, after competing in the AAA league during the regular season, Montague, Kensington, and Westisle dropped down to play for the AA championship. In the AA final, Kensington and Westisle battled right down to the final whistle, with Kensington coming out on top 10-8. In the AAA playoffs, it came down to Three Oaks and Bluefield in the final. Three Oaks took home the banner with a 17-5 win in the final. The AAA men's league was interesting this year - Three Oaks separated themselves as the top team, but Bluefield, Colonel Gray, and Charlottetown Rural battled all season for the 2-4 spots. In the final, Three Oaks beat Colonel Gray 31-0.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT - 2021 Check-in

• This year, the number of rugby officials on PEI reached an all-time low. There are now only 7 active rugby referees - down from 10 in 2019 and 12 in 2018. The PEISAA requires about 8-10 referees to avoid referee burnout and perceived conflicts of interest. This season, the number of referees dropped below that threshold, and referees were overworked and put in situations they should not be put in (i.e. refereeing games where players they currently coach are involved). The PEISAA **NEEDS** to work with the PEI Rugby Union to create a plan to recruit more rugby referees. The PEISAA requires more officials than the PEIRU, so it cannot fall not solely on the PEIRU's shoulders to recruit and provide officials to the PEISAA.

- Require coaches to complete the World Rugby Concussion Management online module instead of NCCP's Making Headway. World Rugby's Concussion Management module is a rugby-specific resource that is similar to Making Headway, but improved. Making Headway does not allow coaches to re-take the module and can only be tracked with Sport PEI's help. World Rugby's module produces a dated certificate upon completion and can be re-done anytime.

- I believe that we should continue to remove PEI-specific items from our Rugby Guidelines. So,

I believe we should move to fully commit to using World Rugby's laws. We have made several

changes towards this in the past several years, and we should continue to do so moving forward.

- Done.

• The selection process for league all stars should be less arbitrary. This season, every league selected a different number of all stars, and coaches were not given accurate information when they were asked for all star nominees or for all star voting. AAA leagues with 6+ teams should select 15 all star starters and 10 reserves. AAA leagues with fewer than 6 teams should select 15 all stars. A leagues with 5+ teams should select a first and second team with 7 all stars on each. A leagues with fewer than 5 teams should select 7 all stars. University and representative coaches use all star selections as identifiers for recruitment and selection. More thought and preparation needs to be put into their selection.

- The pre-season scrimmages should continue to be used moving forward. These were very helpful to introduce the game to new players and to re-introduce gameplay to returning players and referees. I will work with ADs and coaches prior to the 2022 season to plan these scrimmages. Having 3-4 teams at one site may add to the benefits with coaches and players able to watch other teams play in addition to playing themselves.
 - Done.

6. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

- Once again, the number of rugby officials on PEI is a major issue. The number of active officials rose to 8 this year with another 2 partially trained (the last minute planning of the scrimmages didn't allow them to complete the on-field portion of their level 1 course). When two officials suffered injuries early in the season, the remaining 6 were far too busy. The PEISAA NEEDS to work with the PEI Rugby Union to create a plan to recruit more rugby referees. The PEISAA requires more officials than the PEIRU, so it cannot fall not solely on the PEIRU's shoulders to recruit and provide officials to the PEISAA.
- Amend the requirement for the Rugby Ready and Making Headway modules for returning coaches. At present, Rugby Ready is required to be re-done yearly and Making Headway is only required to be completed once. They should both be required to be re-done every 2-3 years.
- Continue to remove PEI-specific items from the Rugby Guidelines.
- Guidelines for consistency in league all star selections should be created. Other sports have remained largely the same for decades, while rugby changes every year. This year, there wasn't even a nomination/voting process for all stars. University and representative coaches use all star selections as identifiers for recruitment and selection. More thought and preparation needs to be put into their selection. Suggested format:
 - A league 4 teams or fewer: 11 all stars (7 'starters', 4 'reserves')
 - A league 5 teams or more: 14 all stars (first team, second team)
 - AAA league 4 teams or fewer: 15 all stars
 - AAA league 5 teams or more: 22 all stars (15 'starters', 7 'reserves')
- Pre-season scrimmages should continue and the schedule should be set well in advance to ensure that officials can complete the on-field portion of their certification.
- AA sevens league or tournament schedule should be added. With Westisle's men's program and Montague's men's/women's program in serious trouble, we need to create a longer term solution than we have. If we created a Saturday 7s tournament schedule, this could take the pressure off those schools for a couple of years while they re-build their programs. For example, play 3 Saturday tournaments in May. Schools that cannot field a 15s team enter their teams, and schools that do have 15s teams can enter teams to get non-starters more experience.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

Good weather was a tremendous help in getting our games and season in this year. The move from Spring to Fall means that we have awarded our second PEISAA baseball championship in the past 5 months! Attending the highly competitive provincial championship game showed that there is certainly a level of interest from our students in school baseball. Congratulations to EWS who reversed last season's 5-4 final score, in taking the title.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS

A) Keep it in the fall but look at options

Following along with last year's recommendation, this season baseball moved from Spring to the Fall, where I believe it should stay. There are several reasons for this, as mentioned in previous reports that include, condition of fields, availability of umpires, players being in "game shape", and the fact that most teams are finished of their minor ball by now. Obviously this year, the addition of "Fall Ball" in minor baseball did have an impact (BW and Ecole sur Mer had to drop out) but I believe it can be limited if schools and students know going into future years that school baseball will stay in the fall. As mentioned, the passion and enjoyment witnessed during provincials shows that the students value this experience. That being said, there are certainly obstacles that we need to work around. We tried Saturdays this year, with limited success but it might be a better option in another year. The other possibility is scheduling a couple "jamborees", where teams could get 2-3 games in at once, in order to take some of the pressure off of scheduling multiple games around a variety of outside issues.

B) If numbers warrant it, bring back the A and AA Leagues

If we are able to have enough schools enter teams, ideally we would have an A and AA league. There are wide ranges of talent between and even within teams, and finding an enjoyable and safe place to play would further help with numbers.

C) Provincials

Great evening of provincial baseball. Bantam sized fields are rare on PEI so our options are limited with venues for future years. The lights at City Field make it a great venue for players and spectators alike.

D) Pitch Counts

A reminder to teams that ideally you would keep track of both your pitcher, and the opposing team's pitcher when it comes to pitch counts. An honest mistake in the final created some controversy that we can avoid in the future. It's often hard for a coach to do this as well as coach, so it's helpful to have this role assigned to a parent.

E) Thank You

Thank you to Mike Richards, the umpire assignor. No issues at all this season. That's always a nice thing to not have to worry about. Thanks for taking care of that.

Also thank you to Christopher Drummond from the City of Charlottetown who is in charge of field bookings. He was very accommodating and ensured that fields were in good shape for regular season games and provincials.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

This year the East and West flag football leagues continued with an A/AA league in both boys and girls. We had a record 24 schools take part in the league this year, 13 in the West and 11 in the East. Games continued to be played mostly on Tuesday/Wednesday nights in the West and Monday to Thursday nights in the East. This may have been the best weather we have experienced in recent memory as we never canceled a single night in the regular season for weather. 5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

Refereeing needs to continue to grow and improve. We need to continue to recruit new officials so we can have two officials for each game and three in playoff games.

When possible, we should attempt to have as many games as possible being played on the two turf fields. However, the use of fields at François Buote and the Longworth field will be needed again next year.

Mouth guards should continue to be highly recommended for all players. Numbers need to be put on the front and back of all jerseys next year. Shorts without pockets need to be emphasized. A high school weekend tournament should be looked at to continue the growth of the sport.

Commissioners role - Now that I am a teacher in the East, I recommend that Rob Connell, who is at the Summerside Turf both nights, become the West Commissioner. I do believe that Rob will get Lincoln Rix to do the schedule for him. I wish to continue in the east as Commissioner and will do the schedule. This will allow Rob and I to look after issues in both leagues easier as it is a huge job for me, only being in the east.
