4. GENERAL COMMENTS

Another year and a new challenge to our baseball season. This year Fiona took a week out of our schedule and took some of our fields out of play. Despite that, teams and coaches did their best to make it a successful season. The Fiona shortened season resulted in some teams only playing 2 games (in one case it was a doubleheader). This is obviously not ideal under normal circumstances and I have mentioned this in the RECOMMENDATIONS. Overall, the fact that we had 7 teams that were competitive, spoke to the interest in baseball on PEI. The season had several highlights, including some fine pitching performances and the quality of baseball displayed at provincials was high level.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS

A) Keep it in the fall but look at options

This was mentioned last year, as I believe the Fall season to be our best option for many reasons mentioned before. That said, there is still some options to look at as we try to optimize the short window the fall weather affords us! One suggestion is to attempt to book field times so that when schools return in September, they know that there will be two weekend jamborees on specific dates. This would help with scheduling and students who had conflicts on those dates would know that they would not be able to be on the team. This would also help limit the number of teams trying to reschedule mid-season due to players playing hockey, etc.

B) If numbers warrant it, bring back the A and AA Leagues

If we are able to have enough schools enter teams, ideally we would have an A and AA league. There are wide ranges of talent between and even within teams, and finding an enjoyable and safe place to play would further help with numbers.

C) Provincials

Great evening of provincial baseball. Bantam sized fields are rare on PEI so our options are limited with venues for future years. The lights at City Field make it a great venue for players and spectators alike

D) Pitch Counts

A reminder to teams that ideally you would keep track of both your pitcher, and the opposing team's pitcher when it comes to pitch counts. An honest mistake in the final created some controversy that we can avoid in the future. It's often hard for a coach to do this as well as coach, so it's helpful to have this role assigned to a parent. On top of having a counter at games, AD's are asked to share specific pitch count rules with coaches, as this came up in the finals this year.

E) Update Rules

Phil pointed out some of our rules need to be updated in our Constitution. I will be looking into that and will share updates with AD's when completed.

F) Thank You

Thank you to Dave McQuaid, the officials' assignor. No issues at all this season. That is always a nice thing to not have to worry about. Thanks for taking care of that.

Special thanks this year to Christopher Drummond and the City of Charlottetown. They always do a great job having fields ready throughout the season but this year, when faced with the Fiona aftermath they really came through for us to keep the season rolling.

PEISAA Senior Soccer FINAL REPORT - 2022

Commissioner: (Andrew MacAdam)

1. SPORT PARTICIPATION NUMBERS

Male 7 A (finished with 6 and down from 9 last year) and 6 AAA (up from 5 last year) teams and approximately **240 players**. *Female* 6 A (up 1 team from last year) teams and 5 AAA teams (same as last year) and approximately **220 players**.

2. GENERAL COMMENTS

The 2022 Fall Soccer Season was very competitive. After one week, Hurricane Fiona hit the Island and we had to postpone a week's worth of games. The decision was made to extend the season by one week to get the games in. All 4 leagues were generally competitive. The playoffs brought about some upsets according to league standings. Game reporting has been very good again this year, using the Goal Line web site. The number of cards and suspensions this season was at an all-time high (at least since I took over as commissioner). We did ask officials to crack down on abuse of officials and language issues in general, but there were some physical issues as well. We do need a better way of tracking cards. I do not believe all cards are being reported. We did not have to cancel/postpone as many games this year to official availability, but we are still struggling as some officials are on the fields 5 days a week. Thanks goes out to our sponsors, The Department of Education and Lifelong Learning, The PEI School

Milk Foundation, Grant Thornton, and Eastlink Community Television. A big thanks goes out to Phil Bridges, the School Sport Coordinator for all his help throughout the season.

3. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. I will put this in here again this year: To ease cost to schools and easing of officials, I would recommend going to one Saturday in September, where we could schedule 6 games at the same venue (Bluefield offered 4 years ago).
- 4. Card reporting still needs to be addressed. Can we look at reporting on Goalline (if that is a possibility) Presently, I rely on an email or text after games indicating cards given out or if there were no cards. This has proven to be very ineffective, as AD's are asking if certain players are to sit out games, and I have no record of any cards
- 7. I am leaving the following suggestions for the Sport Regulations regarding cards (I was not involved in any discussion around this, so I am not sure if it was addressed):

DISCIPLINE CARDS (SOCCER)

- 1. When a player receives 3 yellow cards during the season (exhibition, regular season, and tournament games) he/she will sit the next scheduled game, tournament included.
- 2. Player's accumulated yellow cards will revert back to zero when the playoffs begin.
- 3. A red card is an automatic one game suspension, depending on severity the suspension could be longer. If a player picks up a red card or a third yellow card on the last game before playoffs they would sit the first playoff game. Red card offenses also continue into playoffs.
 - a. Serious Foul Play and Violent Conduct offenses will be longer than the one game and can expect a discipline committee to convene (either in person, or via email) to review the referee's report to consider the length of the suspension, expect it to be more than the one game.
 - b. Verbal Abuse of officials will be an automatic 2 games suspension.
 - c. Physical abuse of an official will be dealt with by a discipline committee.
 - d. Spitting on another player will be automatic 2 games suspension.
 - e. Denying an Obvious Goal Scoring Opportunity will be a one game suspension.
 - f. <u>Using offensive, insulting, or abusive language will be a one game suspension. In</u> the case of racial insults, a discipline committee will convene.
 - g. A second caution in the same game will result in a one game suspension.

Note: All suspensions do not include the game the player is ejected, no matter the time of the ejection.

4. Also, add to the policy handbook: In the event where players were red carded before the championship games: In most FIFA competitions, a player does not sit on the bench for the games they are suspended. However, we are running our competitions, and we should be able to allow or disallow players to sit on the bench for Championship games only, as there will be team pictures after the game. I believe the ability to sit on the bench with his/her team mates, should be left to the discretion of the PEISAA and commissioner.

Senior Soccer Medal Games – November 4/5, 2022

Friday, Nov. 4th – A Men and Women Bronze Medal Games

Senior A Women - Three Oaks 1, Bluefield 0 (overtime)

Bluefield and Three Oaks spent 90 minutes moving the ball up and down the field, both teams having several chance to score, but to no avail. After 90 minutes, the two teams were tied and headed to 2 x 10-minute overtime halves. In the 1st overtime half, Bluefield appeared to score, however, the Bluefield player was offside and the goal was called back. With 7 minutes left in the second overtime half, Three Oaks' Hailey Collicutt broke the 0-0 tie to claim the hard fought battle for Bronze.

Senior A Men - Charlottetown Rural 1, Francois Buote 0

Francois Buote and Charlottetown Rural played a very entertaining Bronze Medal game on Friday evening. Both teams had many chances throughout the game, however, in the end, Charlottetown took home the Bronze Medal with a 1-0 score with a goal by Cole Belanger-Birt.

Saturday, Nov. 5th – AAA Men and Women Bronze Medal Games

Senior AAA Women – Bluefield 2, Westisle 1 (Penalty kicks)

Early Saturday morning the Westisle and Bluefield AAA Women's teams took to the field and provided some entertaining soccer for 110 + minutes. Westisle opened the scoring at the 30 minute mark of a goal by Ashlyn MacNeill. Bluefield tied the game just before the halftime whistle blew off the foot of Lindsey Smith. The teams were back and forth the whole game, however, both keepers, Cyriah Richard and Tasha Kowalchuk were up to the task. At the end of regulation and 2, 10-minute overtime halves, the teams were tied at 1, with penalty kicks to follow. After 5 kicks each, Bluefield came out on top with the 2-1 victory and the Bronze Medals.

Senior AAA Men – Bluefield 8, Westisle 0

Bluefield and Westisle met in the Bronze Medal Game early Saturday morning. Bluefield came out hard and fast creating havoc to the Westisle defense. Hudson Halti would score the eventual game winner at the __ minute mark. Nathan Gallant would add to the lead just a few minutes later. The frustration would build for Westisle and Bluefield were awarded 3 penalty kicks within 6 minutes in the first half because of aggressive tackles in the penalty area. Colby Munro made no mistake on any of them to take a 5-0 lead into the second half. In the second half, Bluefield would add 3 more goals, one by Jacob MacDonald and two more by Kody Vos.

Saturday, Nov. 5th – A Men and Women Gold Medal Games

Senior A Women – Kishora 1, Souris 0 (Penalty Kicks)

In the Senior A gold Medal game, defense was the name of the game as both teams survived several goal-area scrambles, to play to a 0-0 draw at the end of regulation time. The teams would exchange a few chances in 20 minutes of overtime. In penalty kicks, Kishora would come out on top scoring 3 as Souris could only beat the Kishora keeper twice.

Senior A Men - Col. Gray 2, Kensington 0

In the Senior A gold Medal Game, Col. Gray had most of the chances, however, Kensington would be able to defend many of the scoring chances Gray would put on them. However, midway through the first half, Col. Gray would break the nil-nil tie with a goal by Luke Scott with a hard shot low in the corner of the net. The second half was more equal in play, however, Kensington was not able to tie the game. Late in the second half, Matthew Keoughn score to give the Col. Gray squad some breathing room. The game would end with Col. Gray earning the Gold Medal.

Saturday, Nov. 5th – AAA Men and Women Gold Medal Games

Senior AAA Women - Three Oaks 2, Col. Gray 0

In the AAA Women's Gold medal Game, Col. Gray and Three Oaks would meet on an abnormally warm, November day! Col. Gray took the play to Three Oaks for the majority of the first half. However, three Oaks' defense were up to the task and were able to counter with a goal mid-way through the first half from Ava Pomeroy. The teams would end the first half with Three Oaks up 1-0. The second half was like the first, with Col. Gray pushing for the tie, and Three Oaks defending hard to secure back-to-back Provincial titles. Their defense would pay off as they held Col. Gray to no goals and would add an insurance marker late in the second half by Olivia James to claim the Gold Medal.

Senior AAA Men – Col. Gray 2, Charlottetown Rural 1 (Overtime)

Col. Gray would open the scoring in the first 15 minutes of the game from Logan MacWilliams and looked like they were going to outplay Rural. However, Rural adjusted and regained their composure. The remainder of the game was a very entertaining and competitive game between two skilled teams. Late in the second half, Rural would put pressure on Col. Gray to tie the game at 1 and send it into overtime. In the overtime period, both teams had some exciting chances, however, a beautiful through ball to Ben Hashimoto, and a tap past the Rural keeper allowed him to tuck the game-winner into the back of the net. Reverse stick HIT (known as Tomahawk) will not to be allowed.... Players are permitted to play with the reverse stick PASS. Umpires will revisit these rules for the start of 2023 season. The third IFH change has moved to playing 4 quarters (15 min quarters) with stop time for penalty corners. This requires more playing time ...which at this time we do not have.

2021 was the third season for wearing mandatory defensive penalty corners masks. No complaints by any player.

Thank you to Cornwall Recreation and Summerside CG turf for allowing field hockey the opportunity to use their turfs without charging a fee. Again, Thank you to all the coaches and umpires for their hard work! Thank you to both, Phil Bridges and Walter McEwen for their support.

5. **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

INTERMEDIATE VOLLEYBALL

Girls Leagues

The two A Girls leagues were made up of a total of 27 teams.

The 21 were divided into three leagues. The West had 9 teams while the Central and East had six teams each. Each team in each league played the opposition once each. The West league had an eight-match schedule while the East and the Central played five matches each. Evangeline finished first in the west with a perfect 8-0 record. Boys Leagues

General Comments 4.

The Pre Novice - Intermediate Cross Country season ended on Saturday October 22nd at the 2022 Source for Sports Provincial Cross Country Championship at Mill River. The Westisle Family of Schools hosted the Pre-Novice to Intermediate Championships while Rural High School hosted the Juvenile to Senior categories at Charlottetown Rural High October 18th.

The weather did cooperate at Mill River this year with warm and sunny skies for a change. A total of 620 runners ran the four different competitive courses. This was a decrease of 42 runners from the last year provincial was run with all 8 categories back in 2019-20.

The Juvenile /Senior Championships were held at Charlottetown Rural High School on Tuesday, October 18th, with meet manager Esther Hovingh. A total of 113 runners ran the 2 courses on a wet track after Fiona. This was a decrease of 12 runners from 2021.

The Juvenile and Senior Championship was also a great success. Meet manager Esther Hovingh was very pleased with the turnout. The course had to be altered a bit due to fallen trees on the original course. The Senior Girls ran the 5km distance for the first time this year with the new distance taking affect this year.

The overall PEISAA Provincial Championship participation was 733 runners.

At the Mill River site all 3 courses had to be rebuilt from scratch due to loosing land to more housing development on parts of the old course. The 1.5 km, 2.0 km and the 3.0 km all had demanding hills and open fields that offered a very competitive course for all runners. This new course made it not as friendly for spectators at the finish line.

All races started on time and finished on time except one race started 3 minutes ahead of time. One girls was not there for the start but still ran the course once she got there behind the others.

Phil and I made an extra effort to make visible the Source for Sports Logo, our meet sponsor. The Milk Foundation and the SAA banners were also visible at the start line the finish line and the awards area.

The new SAA tent was very visible and promoted the SAA logo very well at the finish line. Great investment for the SAA.

The awards were presented after each race. I would like to thank Andy Doran for helping with announcing the presentation of awards and Phil for his great MC promoting our sponsors before each award presentations.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

We managed to get back a little more to normal concerning COVID but the weather including Fiona threw us another curve. We managed to get our first event held at Mill River off on the proposed date. Then things got more difficult when Fiona arrived and shut us down until October when we held three qualifiers on the same day – never again! Our numbers went up significantly in the

participation in both the male and female qualifiers. As a result at one time we had 94 golfers ready to play in the Provincials – the highest number that I can remember in the past 27 years! The numbers did drop due to field trips, school sports and other activities that the golfers wanted to take part in . We still ended up having 85 golfers on the course in the Championships. We had 11 teams in the Mens AAA division, 4 teams in the Mens A division and 6 teams in the Ladies AAA division. We had 38 AAA men, 22 A men and 25 AAA ladies competing for individual awards.

The Provincial Championships were hosted by Brudenell River Golf Course. The weather cooperated and provided a nice warm Fall day for golf. A special thank you goes to Ryan Garrett and the staff at Brudenell River – the course condition and the warm welcome to all players and coaches is much appreciated. With all the cancellations during the Fall season we revised our tie breakers as there were other playoffs happening after the golf tournament. We went back to our original method of solving ties by retrogression according to RCGA rules.

I want to express my sincere Thanks to all the coaches for the time they spent to ensure that the students had the best opportunity to compete at as high a level as possible. Their assistance in doing the scoring at the completion of play was instrumental in getting golfers to their next activities in a quick and efficient manner. I want to express a special "Thank You" to Phil Bridges for his assistance.

Recommendations for next season:

- 1. Maintain the administration of the tournaments through the Golf Commissioner.
- 2. I believe that golfers should and need to play more than one qualifying 18 hole tournament to prepare for the Championships. Everyone can have a good day or a bad day on the course.
- 3. We need to book our tournaments in May of 2023 for the Fall season. We saw how difficult is was to reschedule.
- 4. All qualifiers must be played on Tuesday, Thursday or Saturday to assist the smaller schools and their limited number of athletes.
- 5. We have always had fewer females participating in golf. What can we do to increase the numbers? Do we need to have two divisions like the men? A Scramble event? We need to retain what we have for our competative ladies what can we offer for the others? Maybe we need to get a committee together to examine this.

4.GENERAL COMMENTS

Intermediate Golf went through a change in format during the 2021-22 season. Wedecided to carry on with the same format again thisyear. Zone 1 and 2 have held their qualifierstogether over the past few years but decided to hold their own qualifiers for the 2022-23 year. This made scheduling an easier task for both Zones as well as cutting down travel time and expense of travel. This move worked out well for both Zones. The weather and Fiona created havoc with scheduled qualifiers as Zone 1 was the only Zone not having to reschedule theirqualifier date. Getting tee times in September has been more difficult since COVID and having to reschedule has added to the difficulty of getting times early enough for everyone to complete their 9 hole events. The later in the month we hold our Zone golf qualifying events the more conflicts arise with school and outside activities. A special THANK YOU is extended to the Zone coordinators for working to make their qualifiers a success even with the difficulties that faced them.

All Zones held a 9 hole individual and a three member team scramble format of nine holes for both Girls and Boys as we did in the previous year. The number of students participatingwere very similar in the second year of the revised formats. The number of Boys in Individual qualifiers this year fell from 72 to 65 and the number of Girls fell from 27 to 22. However, the number of Boys in the Scramble format went from 63 to 72 and the Girls went from 21 to 18 in the qualifiers. Not a significant change at all. In the Provincial play for Boys Individuals the numbers were the same - 36 both years! The Girls fell from 26 to 22. In the Provincials for the Scramble format the Boys gained 3 more (51-54) and the Girls lost 3 players (21 - 18). Again almost the same numbers. As a result of these changes we had more students having the opportunity to play 18 holes if they were successful in qualifying for both formats. This year we had 52 out of 87 Boys that played 18 holes and 15 of 22 Girls that played 18 holes.

As we did lastyear, points were awarded for the first four finishers (6-4-3-1) in both individual and teamplay for both Girls and Boys. Medals were awarded to top 3 Girls and top 3 Boys Individuals and Teams. The School that earned the most points in Girls Individual and Scramble play received the Girls Championship Golf Banner. Likewise, the Boys School received the Boys Championship Golf Banner.

Thanks to Connor Lea and his Staff at Avondale for helping make the players so welcome. The Golf Course was in great shape and the weather cooperated once again. Thanks to the school coaches and parents for helping supervise the golfers. We did tweek the Team competition by having two teams per hole - it worked out alright We will look at this over the year to decide what to do next year. We will be meeting to evaluate our change in format -I believe that we made a very successful change that was accepted by most participants. The positive comments that we heard were all we could hope for - the teamwork and encouragement that players expressed to each other was nice to see and hear.

Special Thanks to Phil Bridges - he was always there when I needed him! Recommendations for next year:

- 1. Emphasize the importance of administering the qualifying tournaments through the office of the zone representatives. They all did a great job Thanks to all much appreciated!
- 2. Maintain the 4 athletic zone championship qualification format that was developed. A meeting to discuss the number of places allocated per zone.
- 3. With Intermediate schools playing golf in the Fall, it is important that the qualifying tournaments be scheduled in the Spring for September and October with possible Weather Dates in case of cancellations. This way all schools are aware of the short time that they have in September to be ready to go. If booking of courses gets any busier that is a major concern. Communication between schools for setting dates is of utmost importance.
- 4. Maintain the format of 9 holes each for individual and scramble play.
- 5. With the number of athletes competing in golf increasing substantially, I believe that a committee needs to be set up to review the sport regulations for Intermediate golf topics to be reviewed should include but not restricted to:
- a) qualification expectations for boys and girls
- b) scoring

7. Recommendations

- A. We must continue to strive to help coaches to learn more about their craft by exposing them to certification and learning opportunities. Minimum levels should be established and required.
- B. The PEISAA and the PEIBOA must work to introduce more new officials and seek to upgrade the qualifications of our current officials.
- C. The PEISAA must take any opportunities to piggyback on school or community upgrades to improve the levels of facility standards.
- D. If we become aware of the development of new amendments to develop the game in our province we should make sure that we remain open to the inclusion of these endeavours in our province. One specific variation to look at is 3-on-3. The growth of 3-on-3 basketball internationally seems to be an example that suits Canada and PEI's sparsely populated areas very well.
- E. I would suggest the continuation of the reporting for all to see, of the technical fouls assessed during the regular season.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

Last year the Intermediate East and West basketball leagues removed the no zone defense rule. With the shorten season last year we could not get a good sense if there were any concerns with the rule change. With a normal season this year (slightly shorter) I received no complaints. I recommend we keep the rule in place. We also kept the formal 20-point rule in the league; however, the question has come up in the past of whether or not we should we use the 20-point rule during play-offs and provincials. I recommend for our play-offs that we increase this to either 30 pts or remove all together. Perhaps another discussion for the executive. I received too many reports of technical / unsportsmanlike fouls in my opinion. I am concerned about the behavior of some of our coaches. I think the PEISAA needs to consider a coaching course that focuses on expectations from coaches in an

educational setting. I am still a bit concerned that officials do not always report technical and Unsportsmanlike fouls to the assignors. I will continue to express the importance of this and that officials do their part.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

- 1. Executive discussion on 20 pt rule.
- 2. Continue to ensure the officials know the importance of reporting all technical and unsportsmanlike fouls be reported to the assignors.
- 3. That our coaches are required to take a course that expresses the importance of proper behaviour in an educational setting.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

Another great year for High School Powerlifting. The sport is growing in the schools as well as in the community. We had a total of 128 lifters compete this year. The quality of lifting has increased over the last few years and I attribute that to the coaches doing a great job getting the students ready for competition. I have noticed that lifters are arriving at the qualifiers with a better knowledge for the sport than in the previous years. This is a great success for the PEISAA. Again, this year we were required to use the qualifying standards to reduce the number of lifters that advanced to the Provincials. WestIsle always does a great job getting the gym ready for a competition. I would like to thank Brett Corcoran and George Kinch of WestIsle for their great hospitality.

The Championship meet got underway just after 9:30am with the female lifters. WestIsle had a great performance and took home the female banner for the 11^{th} time. Afterwards, the male lifters started their competition around 2:30pm. For the first time in the PEISAA history a school from the CSLF won a Powerlifting banner. It was an intensely close competition. However, François-Buote won the banner. There was a total of 80 lifters that competed at the Provincials. This means a total of 720 attempts on the platform during the day. Everything was over and done with around 7:30pm.

I would like to thank the sponsors for the championship: Allstar Cresting (Joel & Jeremy Watts), PEI Powerlifting Association (John MacDonald & Justin Smith), StrongArm Sport (Mike Armstrong), Treadmill Factory (Larry LeBlanc) & Innerstrength Products (Rhea & Ryan Stinn).

Powerlifting meets are notorious for being a long day of lifting. The referees had made a comment about how incredible it was to have 80 lifters compete in the same day and be over at a reasonable time. While some parents that are unfamiliar to the sport found the day long. I believe that we could improve in some areas however we need to continue to put safety first and take the time needed to give each lifter a proper attempt. The coaches, referees, technicians, spotters/loaders and of

course the lifters did a great job. It is amazing to see the comradery between the schools. It is obvious to see that everyone wants everyone else to succeed. The athletes seem to forget what school was written on their shirt and they would cheer on whoever is lifting on the platform. That is special and unique to the sport. I am very proud of the High School Powerlifting and everyone that is involved.

Recommendations for next season:

- 1. The IPF has made some changes in the Bench Press rules. I would like to discuss if we want to follow suit.
- 2. I would also like to have the discussion about adding an attempt timer. This would encourage the lifters to be more ready to lift. We lost time this year due to lifters not being lined up and ready to go.
- 3. I would also recommend that we look at how many lifters we want at the Provincials. (We should maybe add another qualifier.)

4. General Comments

The 2023 school gymnastics season ended on Saturday, February 11th at the 2023 ADL Gymnastics Provincial Championships held at the Kensington Intermediate Senior High School.

The championship was hosted by the St. Louis Elementary School for the 33rd year in a row and again threaten by weather on Friday but the event started on time Saturday morning.

Provincial team titles: Pre-Novice Boys-West Royalty Elementary, Pre-Novice Girls Spring Park Elementary, Novice Boys LM Montgomery Elementary, Novice Girls West Kent Elementary. Individual awards were also given to the top six vault /floor routines and top ten all around.

A total of 205 gymnasts participated at this year's event. This was a decrease of 34 gymnasts from 2010. We had a total of 22 different schools from across PEI participate.

On Saturday morning the competition started at 9:00 am and finished ahead of schedule. A total of 106 gymnasts participated with 73 Pre-Novice Girls and 33 Pre-Novice Boys

On Saturday afternoon the competition started at 1:00 pm and finished on time. A total of 93 gymnasts participated with 71 Novice Girls and 22 Novice Boys.

Due to lower than usual numbers in Bantam and Intermediate categories the afternoon competition had to be added to the 1:00 pm session. All went well as we integrated the Intermediate and bantam girls with the Novice Boys.

For the fifth year in a row all 6 categories performed a Jump to Handspring onto a raised mat surface. Some schools are having challenges getting mats to reach the Novice height at their schools. It remains the safest vault to perform for our school athletes.

The SAA gave out our new ribbons this year and the coaches were pleased that all athletes receiving ribbons went home with their awards. We had many ties but, we had lots of ribbons on hand to present at the championship.

All information and results were posted in the West Prince Graphic, the Guardian and the Journal Pioneer. The media coverage before and after was not covered by anybody by these newspapers. My press releases before and after the championship were printed along with some pics that I took. All results were circulated to all the media, schools and on our SAA website within days of our championship.

We had a total of 415 paid spectators. We charged \$ 3.00 admission with no apparent complaints from spectators.

Our computer program which calculated the results came through for us again. Within minutes of the end of both competitions, the results were handed out. I would like to thank Brian Alain once again for helping us with the results and registration.

I would like to say a special thank you to Phil Bridges our SAA School Sport Coordinator for his great support leading up to the championship. Not being able to be there in person he made sure we had all the necessary items needed to host our event with style. The new table skirts were very nice and added a nice presentation to the site.

ADL was announced several times as our Title Sponsor for Gymnastics at the competition site and in our news release. No ADL rep. this year to present awards.

I would also like to thank KISH Principal Donald Mulligan and Catherine Olscamp for all their help and continuous support. Thank you for allowing us to use your fine facility to host our Provincial Championship. Thank you to the cleaning staff of KISH this year for helping and supporting us with anything we needed.

We can't forget Marilyn and the PEI School Milk Foundation for their continuous support and of course for the free chocolate milk for all the competitors.

Thank you to all the Unit managers for hosting their own zone competitions and sending me all the results on time. It was greatly appreciated. It's always a pleasure to work with such dedicated professionals. Great job!

5. Recommendations for improving the sport:

- 1. To keep the new handspring onto a raised mat surface; fall to straight lying position on the back.
- 2. Allow coaches to raise the height or lower of the mats another 8 cm, so mat stack minimum of 30" to a maximum of 42". This is a recommendation for safety reasons.

In our first provincials since 2019, the event went very well! Wrestling took place on 2 mats and the total competition ran 3.5 hours. There were no injuries. We had several new schools as well as teams making a return to competition as well as homeschool students and 2 schools from CSLF, for the first time ever (as far as I know). Tignish Elementary took a year off, and they're typically a large team, so numbers were down at the elementary level. We had several weight classes contested at the senior level for the first time in recent memory, including one female weight class with 4 very competitive / Canada Games caliber wrestlers. In July 2022, Wrestling PEI hosting the Canada Cup of wrestling and there was a legacy of 3 brand new mats left on PEI. PEISAA Wrestling and Wrestling PEI support each other

very well and these 3 new mats, along with existing mats, resulted in the growth of new and returning schools this past season. It's not unrealistic to aim to double our numbers for next season. There were just over 120 wrestlers in the event.

It was our second attempt at grouped weight classes. The weights we set up in a slightly different way from the first year, to aim to get as many matches as possible. In 2024, the plan is to establish all weight classes for provincials (ahead of zones, similar to what we did this year) and then create the draw for zones. We would like to add that if there are only 2 in the weight class, the competition would be best 2 out of 3. Previously it was a winner takes all format.

5. Recommendations for improving the sport:

Continue to use grouped weights

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

The PEISAA provincial badminton championships were held April 23 to April 29, 2023. This year, 5 Charlottetown and area schools were used, along with Bluefield for Mixed Doubles.

Championship titles in Novice, Bantam, Intermediate, Juvenile and Senior boys' and girls' categories were all up for grabs in singles, doubles and mixed play. Most of our Island schools were represented in zone playoffs, with the top two from the four zones advancing to the provincials in Novice, Bantam and Intermediate. In Juvenile, Senior and Mixed categories, there were East and West regional events to decide who went to Provincials.

In the Senior Men's final, Tom Pham of Gray dominated the competition on his way to defeating Braden Bruce of Gray 21-7 and 21-12 to win the provincial title. George Gallant from Three Oaks defeated Colby Hudson of Westisle 21-15 and 21-11 to claim the senior boys bronze medal. In doubles action, Colonel Gray claimed 2 of the 3 top positions. Tom Pham and Braden Bruce from Gray defeated George Gallant and Jonas Binkley from Three Oaks 21-15 and 21-18 to win the gold. The bronze medal was won by Gray as well. Andy Nguyen and Desmond Cunniffe from Gray defeated Maguire Brennan and Colby Hudson of Westisle 25-23 and 21-19 in an entertaining match. With a first and second in singles and a first and third in doubles, Colonel Gray easily won the Provincial Championship with 15 points.

In girls' action, Charlottetown Rural had the two top senior women's singles players. Jai Hui Pan defeated Kimmy Chen 21-13, 8-21 and 23-21to win the Senior Women's Provincial Singles Championship. Khadija Kubra of Gray defeated Charlotte of Yu, also of Gray 23-21, 20-22 and 21-18 to claim the bronze medal in a very close singles match. In the doubles a team from Westisle, Chloe Gallant and Amelia DesRoches defeated Jai Hui Pan and Kimmy Chen of Rural 21-18 and 22-20. Alana Mabey and Alina Crocket of Rural defeated Avery Noye and Ella Hudson 21-15 and 21-19 to claim the bronze medal. By coming first and second in singles, along with a second and third in doubles, Charlottetown Rural won the provincial championship with 13 points.

Senior Mixed Doubles champions this year are Charlotte Yu and Andy Nguyen of Gray. They defeated Lydia Enman and Noah Farrell of Ecole sur Mer 21-9 and 21-15. Katelyn Brothers and Daniel McGeogheghan defeated Avery Noye and Jordan Gough of Westisle 21-17 and 21-15 to win the bronze medal. Colonel Gray wins the senior mixed provincial title with 5 points.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

This year was the sixth year for regional qualifiers in the juvenile and senior divisions. The schedule was very similar to past years. We are now at a point where the schedule works and there will only need to be minor adjustments made each year.

This year we used google sheets to do our regional qualifiers and double elimination draws. I set them up and shared them with the AD's from the schools involved. In most cases the scores were put right on the google draw and this way the other AD's could follow along and I could get instant results. It may be the way of the future for all zone and provincial play.

This was the first year of our new provincial tiebreaker in badminton. In the past we have had times where up to 4 schools have tied for a provincial championship. We used it in two categories this year where we had a tie for a team championship. It was quick to use and is a better solution than having multiple championship schools.

Just like the past few years, this badminton season was unique. We were able to start a bit earlier with tryouts and the provincials were back into the last weekend of April. This led to a conflict with the annual band trips to Halifax, but we were able to work around it. We moved senior mixed to the Thursday of the week as many badminton players were away on this date. The usual Thursday pool play was moved to Tuesday for most divisions. The switch of pool play to Tuesday and Mixed to Thursday enabled band players to play badminton this year. Going forward, this may be the way to run badminton.

Having players report scores at Provincials, if they were going to a third game, worked very well again this year. I recommend that it is used at zone play as well. It is great to see that the players are aware of how important scores are. There is also a group of P.E. teachers who have become very efficient at doing PEISAA tie breakers. This is very important in regional and zone play as well as in pool play at provincials.

I was able to get zone 2/4 to look very similar this year. They each had pool play and then a double elimination. Zone 1 has fewer numbers and does something similar but zone 3 is still the outlier. Zone 3 does pool play but does not do it the week before like the other zones and still does single elimination. Hopefully, all 4 zones can align in the next year or two.

This year we were in the Charlottetown area and next year we will be back to the Summerside area. Bluefield has become the host of the mixed championships and having a school in the middle of the province hosting this championship in one evening is working very well. I think that moving back and forth between the two largest areas in the province for all singles and doubles events is the way to run the championship. It also aligns with many of our other sports championship formats.

Moving the provincials back to the last full week of April is recommended moving forward as the first week of May is very late for the junior and senior highs in the province. Many of the Athletic Directors coach both badminton and flag or rugby and the overlap is very difficult for many players.

Lastly, this was the sixth year for Yonex as a sponsor. Thanks to Yonex for being our badminton sponsor and for the great prizes they give us.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

This year was very exciting for high school rugby on PEI! Players, coaches, referees, and Athletic Directors put in many hours of hard work to continue the tradition of high caliber high school rugby. I'd like to thank Phil Bridges, School Sport Coordinator, for his support, guidance, and work behind the scenes to ensure that the season was successful. Another thank you goes to Anthony Scott, as Referee Assignor. Anthony's day job took him to Alberta for much of April and early-May, but he continued to make sure that officials were well taken care of. Also, thank you to UPEI for providing their facilities for the provincial championships. Thank you to Walter MacEwen for his work maintaining the PEISAA website. For anyone not mentioned above that had a hand in this season's success thank you!

This season was the first year that Safe Sport was required of rugby coaches within the PEISAA. This is a very positive change. High school rugby coaches continue to be required to complete World Rugby's Rugby Ready module and NCCP's Making Headway module.

This season, pre-season scrimmages took place once again for all A teams and three AAA women's teams. Several teams took part in pre-season tournaments, so some teams did not require the scrimmages. The scrimmages took place as jamboree-style events with several teams at each site. These scrimmages have been a great addition, with coaches being encouraged to be on the field directing players and discussing on-field situations.

These scrimmages were vital to the success and development of new officials this year. After several years of dwindling referee numbers, there were 6 new referees certified this year. This is a huge step towards ensuring the success of the high school rugby league for years to come.

This year, the level in both the women's and men's A leagues was excellent. The women's league was very interesting, with Charlottetown Rural #1 separating themselves as the top team and the other 4 teams battling all season. In the playoffs, Charlottetown Rural #1 beat Three Oaks in the final 20-0. Participation in the men's league exploded this season, from 3 teams last year to 7 (6 teams finished the season) this year. It was very nice to see the return of men's rugby at Kensington and also nice to see the Montague men's team have success this year after struggling for many years in AA/AAA. In the final, Charlottetown Rural beat Bluefield #1 17-0.

The women's AAA league was quite close once again this year with Bluefield, Three Oaks, and Charlottetown Rural all having a real chance to win the championship. In the playoffs, after competing in the AAA league during the regular season, Montague, Kensington, and Westisle dropped down to play for the AA championship. In the AA final, Kensington and Montague battled right down to the final whistle, with Kensington coming out on top 8-5 after an incredible penalty kick with very little time left on the clock. In the AAA playoffs, it came down to Charlottetown Rural and Three Oaks in the final. Three Oaks took home the banner with a 20-10 win in the final. 4. GENERAL COMMENTS

Another year and a new challenge to our baseball season. This year Fiona took a week out of our schedule and took some of our fields out of play. Despite that, teams and coaches did their best to make it a successful season. The Fiona shortened season resulted in some teams only playing 2 games (in one case it was a doubleheader). This is obviously not ideal under normal circumstances and I have mentioned this in the RECOMMENDATIONS. Overall, the fact that we had 7 teams that were competitive, spoke to the interest in baseball on PEI. The season had several highlights, including some fine pitching performances and the quality of baseball displayed at provincials was high level.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS

A) Keep it in the fall but look at options

This was mentioned last year, as I believe the Fall season to be our best option for many reasons mentioned before. That said, there is still some options to look at as we try to optimize the short window the fall weather affords us! One suggestion is to attempt to book field times so that when schools return in September, they know that there will be two weekend jamborees on specific dates. This would help with scheduling and students who had conflicts on those dates would know that they would not be able to be on the team. This would also help limit the number of teams trying to reschedule mid-season due to players playing hockey, etc.

B) If numbers warrant it, bring back the A and AA Leagues

If we are able to have enough schools enter teams, ideally we would have an A and AA league. There are wide ranges of talent between and even within teams, and finding an enjoyable and safe place to play would further help with numbers.

C) Provincials

Great evening of provincial baseball. Bantam sized fields are rare on PEI so our options are limited with venues for future years. The lights at City Field make it a great venue for players and spectators alike

D) Pitch Counts

A reminder to teams that ideally you would keep track of both your pitcher, and the opposing team's pitcher when it comes to pitch counts. An honest mistake in the final created some

controversy that we can avoid in the future. It's often hard for a coach to do this as well as coach, so it's helpful to have this role assigned to a parent. On top of having a counter at games, AD's are asked to share specific pitch count rules with coaches, as this came up in the finals this year.

E) Update Rules

Phil pointed out some of our rules need to be updated in our Constitution. I will be looking into that and will share updates with AD's when completed.

F) Thank You

Thank you to Dave McQuaid, the officials' assignor. No issues at all this season. That is always a nice thing to not have to worry about. Thanks for taking care of that.

Special thanks this year to Christopher Drummond and the City of Charlottetown. They always do a great job having fields ready throughout the season but this year, when faced with the Fiona aftermath they really came through for us to keep the season rolling.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

This year the East flag football leagues continued with an A/AA league for both boys and girls. Games continued to be played mostly on Monday for AA girls, Tuesday for A girls, AA boys on Wednesdays and A boys on Thursday nights. The roller coaster weather was on full display this year. There were many cold nights and the last two days were high 20's. We only had to cancel part of one night of an A boys schedule due to rain. The A/AA provincials were both held on Tuesday night in Summerside. This continues to be a great location for the provincials. The level of flag football at provincials was outstanding this year. All 4 leagues had 4 outstanding teams at provincials.

The East schedule this year was split between the Cornwall turf, Longworth fields and François Buote. Thanks to the Town of Cornwall (Connor McCaskill), City of Charlottetown (Christopher Drummond) and François Buote (JP Gallant) for their cooperation with field usage this year.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

Refereeing needs to continue to grow and improve. We need to continue to recruit new officials so we can have two officials for each game and three in playoff games. This year we had to move some AA games off the turf field and play them at Longworth field starting at 5, due to referee availability. When possible, we should attempt to have as many games as possible being played on the turf field. However, referee availability needs to be there to accomplish this.

The use of François Buote next year may not be available as JP Gallant who lined and took care of the fields is retiring. I may be able to get the city of Charlottetown to paint

the fields there. If not, then we may be looking for another location or we will need to use Longworth field 4 nights a week.

Mouth guards should continue to be highly recommended for all players. Numbers need to be put on the front and back of all jerseys next year. Shorts without pockets need to be emphasized. Poppers will be implemented next year instead of cloth flags. This was a recommendation from the referees.
