PEISAA Senior Soccer FINAL REPORT - 2023

Commissioner: (Andrew MacAdam)

1. SPORT PARTICIPATION NUMBERS

Male 7 A (Up one team from the end of last year) and 6 AAA (Same as last year) teams and approximately **240 players**. *Female* 6 A (up 1 team from last year) teams and 6 AAA teams (Up one from last year) and approximately **220 players**.

2. GENERAL COMMENTS

The 2023 Fall Soccer Season was a five-week sprint to Provincials. We had very few interruption in games, however, the wet weather created some havoc with some field not being able to be used. We managed to get through it. All 4 leagues were generally competitive. The playoffs brought about some upsets according to league standings. Game reporting has been very good again this year, using the Goal Line web site. The number of cards and suspensions this season was similar to last year. I credit that to officials cracking down on the "silly stuff" that sometimes goes on within a game. Again, we do need a better way of tracking cards. I do not believe all cards are being reported. We only postponed one game this year due to official availability. This year, I had more officials working games than I have had in any year since I took over assigning, which was great. Thanks goes out to our sponsors, The Department of Education and Early Years, The PEI School Milk Foundation, Grant Thornton, and Eastlink Community Television. A big thanks goes out to Phil Bridges, the School Sport Coordinator for all his help throughout the season.

3. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

1. I will put this in here again this year: To ease cost to schools and easing of officials, I would recommend going to one Saturday in September, where we could schedule 6 games at the same venue (Bluefield offered 4 years ago).

2. Card reporting still needs to be addressed. Can we look at reporting on Goalline (if that is a possibility) Presently, I rely on an email or text after games indicating cards given out or if there were no cards. This has proven to be very ineffective, as AD's are asking if certain players are to sit out games, and I have no record of any cards

3. We had a Wednesday (October 11), where we had 4 officials going to Montague, 2 to Morell, and 1 to Souris. It took a lot of begging to get those games covered. If we can at all possible have limited number of games on the same night in the east, that would be great!

4. I am leaving the following suggestions for the Sport Regulations regarding cards (I was not involved in any discussion around this, so I am not sure if it was addressed):

DISCIPLINE CARDS (SOCCER)

- 1. When a player receives 3 yellow cards during the season (exhibition, regular season, and tournament games) he/she will sit the next scheduled game, tournament included.
- 2. <u>Player's accumulated yellow cards will revert back to zero when the playoffs begin.</u>
- 3. A red card is an automatic one game suspension, depending on severity the suspension could be longer. If a player picks up a red card or a third yellow card on the last game before playoffs they would sit the first playoff game. <u>Red card offenses also continue into playoffs</u>.
 - a. Serious Foul Play and Violent Conduct offenses will be longer than the one game and can expect a discipline committee to convene (either in person, or via email) to review the referee's report to consider the length of the suspension, expect it to be more than the one game.
 - b. <u>Verbal Abuse of officials will be an automatic 2 games suspension.</u>
 - c. <u>Physical abuse of an official will be dealt with by a discipline committee.</u>
 - d. Spitting on another player will be automatic 2 games suspension.
 - e. <u>Denying an Obvious Goal Scoring Opportunity will be a one game suspension.</u>
 - f. <u>Using offensive, insulting, or abusive language will be a one game suspension. In</u> <u>the case of racial insults, a discipline committee will convene.</u>

Note: All suspensions do not include the game the player is ejected, no matter the time of the ejection.

4. Also, add to the policy handbook: In the event where players were red carded before the championship games: In most FIFA competitions, a player does not sit on the bench for the games they are suspended. However, we are running our competitions, and we should be able to allow or disallow players to sit on the bench for Championship games only, as there will be team pictures after the game. I believe the ability to sit on the bench with his/her team mates, should be left to the discretion of the PEISAA and commissioner.

Below is a summary of the medal games.

PEISAA Senior Soccer Championships – October 27/28, 2023

Terry Fox Complex, Cornwall, PE

Senior Men's AAA Gold Medal Game – Col. Gray 1 – Charlottetown Rural - 0 In a classic Col. Gray – Charlottetown Rural final for AAA Soccer, fans were not disappointed. Col. Gray came into the game ranked first in the league and qualified for the championship game after defeating number 4 ranked Westisle, 3-1. Third ranked Rural advanced by defeating number 2 ranked Bluefield in the semifinals. The first half started with both teams creating chances, however, neither team would score. Col. Gray started to control the play as the half advanced. The colonels pressure paid off as early in the second half, Merlin Devine broke the 0-0 tie and put the Colonels up 1-0. Col. Gray continued to carry the play for most of the second half. Late in the game a desperate Rural team had a corner kick and pushed everyone forward, including their keeper. The move came close to paying off, however, the Colonels keeper, Ethan Goeseels, came up with a huge save in the last few minutes of the game to preserve the victory.

Senior Women's AAA Gold Medal Game – Bluefield 3 – Charlottetown Rural – 1 In a David vs. Goliath type of game, Charlottetown Rural, with several Provincial players on their roster were defeated by Bluefield 3-1, who possessed no Provincial players, in the Gold medal game. The first half ended 0-0 as both teams exchanged chances, but defense lead the way. Bluefield came out on the offensive in the second half and 3 minutes in, the pressure paid off as Evelyn Guignion took a left kick from 25 yards out to pick the far corner and take a 1-0 lead. 5 minutes later, Bluefield's Makenzie Ramsay knocked in a rebound off a corner kick to put the Bobcats up 2-0. Rural's Zoe Olscamp cut the lead in half at the 66 minute mark as she placed the ball into the back of the net. Charlottetown Rural was down a player for the last 10 minutes as a player was shown a red card after her second caution. That pretty much sealed any chance of a comeback as Bluefield were pressing all second half. With just 3 minutes left, a Bluefield player was taken down in the penalty box and a penalty kick was awarded. Guignion stepped up and made no mistake, placing the ball just inside the right post to seal the Gold Medal for Bluefield.

Senior A Men's A Gold Medal Game – Col. Gray 1 – Kensington – 0

In a battle of 1st (Kensington) vs. 2nd (Col. Gray), the competition was tight. Both teams created several scoring chances, however, it was Col. Gray's Josh Wyand who broke the tie just 3 minutes before the halftime whistle. The second half was similar to the first half as both teams exchanged chances. Gray's Lincoln Scott and Kensington's Sam Pendleton both mad e key saves in the game to keep the score low. Col. Gray defended well to preserve the Gold Medal.

Senior A Women's A Gold Medal Game – Kishora - 2 – Charlottetown Rural – 0

The top seeded Kishora (Kensington/Kinkora) started with a bang scoring 9 minutes into the Gold Medal game off the foot of Abby Peters taking a 1-0 lead they would hold onto into the second half. 23 minutes into the second half, Abby Murphy would add another goal for Kishora. Kishora would hold off an offensive push by Rural for the remainder of the game, however, they were not able to break the Kishora defense and Kishora would claim the Gold Medal.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS

A) Regular Season

One item that came up this year to be mindful of in planning in the future is that in the A Boys division, in order to increase the number of games played, it was agreed upon to have the two divisions play each other, rather than within their own division. The risk of that always is that one division could have several (or all) teams with strong records and the other could all have losing records. In that case, some winning records won't qualify for playoffs, while some losing records will. This happened this season and going forward, I'd suggest this option should be a

last resort. Something to keep in mind. One other issue that was out of our control was field availability. Due to several factors, including wet, unplayable fields, there was a lot of juggling required to get games in. Again, not something that we can really control but worth mentioning.

B) Provincial Playoffs

Once again, provincials were a success with all games being played at the Terry Fox Complex. The weather was great, attendance was strong and games were all competitive. Thank you to the Terry Fox Complex for the continued use of the facility.

C) Officials

Again, great work by Andrew MacAdam scheduling officials this year, despite a general shortage. Thank you to all the officials as well.

E) All Stars

Provincial medal games had game MVPs as well as tournament MVPs in gold medal games. Thanks to PEI Mutual for providing t shirts.

F) Provincials Bronze Medal Games

FHC had a number of rule changes for 2021. These are IFH rules played at International competitions with International umpires. PEIFHA umpires have agreed there are two changes we will not include for safety reasons for 2023 season 1. Playing the ball with the stick above the shoulders. 2. Reverse stick HIT (known as Tomahawk) will not to be allowed.... Players are permitted to play with the reverse stick PASS. Umpires will revisit these rules for the start of 2023 season. The third IFH change has moved to playing 4 quarters (15 min quarters) with stop time for penalty corners. This requires more playing time (even if we don't stop the time stop for PC)

2021 was the third season for wearing mandatory defensive penalty corners masks. No complaints by any player.

Thank you to Cornwall Recreation and Summerside CG turf for allowing field hockey the opportunity to use their turfs without charging a fee. WE need to work with Charlottetown and Montague to build turfs.!!!

Again, thank you to all the coaches and umpires for their hard work! Thank you to both, Phil Bridges and Walter McEwen for their wonderful support.

5. **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

- 1. PEIFHA executive is happy to have 9 umpires to delivery our program. All umpires have taken the Community or Provincial umpire courses. They are trained through FHC. FHC is providing a safe sport environment for their officials, PEIFH will follow their lead. We have zero tolerance for any type of abuse from players, coaches and Fans!

4. General Comments

The Pre-Novice - Intermediate Cross-Country season ended on Saturday October 21st at the 2023 Source for Sports Provincial Cross-Country Championship at Mill River. The Westisle Family of Schools hosted the Pre- Novice to Intermediate Championships. Rural High School hosted the Juvenile to Senior categories at Charlottetown Rural High October 17th.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

This year we held four qualifiers with a total of 165 male golfers and 34 female golfers participating – a significant increase in our numbers. All qualifiers were held on their proposed dates with two tournaments having to delay the start due to wet conditions.

Students from all 10 High Schools in the PSB, 4 of 6 High Schools from the Commission scolaire de langue francaise and 1 Private School participated. Students from Souris, Kinkora, Kensington and Grace Christian participated this year after not participating for the last few years – welcome back! We had 12 AAA Men's teams competing this year (43 golfers), 12 A Men's teams (44 golfers) and 8 AAA Women's teams (28 golfers). The largest increase was the A Men's level that had 4 teams last year and grew to 12 teams this year.

Due to our larger numbers and students wanting to be finished so they could participate in other school/outside activities after the golf we elected to use Retrogression (RCGA Rules) to break any ties. We did use the tie breaker to determine the 2nd and 3rd place finishers in AAA Men's.

We want to extend a "Thank You" to Eagles Glenn, Mill River, Fox Meadows and Avondale for hosting our qualifiers once again. These courses are the ones that we have utilized frequently over the past number of years. Preferred rates for students to play on courses in great shape are much appreciated by our Schools. Thanks go to those working in the Pro Shop, Outside Workers, Food Services and the Grounds Crew for their contributions to making it a day that our young golfers will remember. Thank You's are also extended to the teachers that co-hosted each qualifier.

To Ryan Garrettt and his staff at Brudenell River a sincere Thank You is extended from all of us – student golfers, coaches, parents, Phil Bridges -PEISAA and Wayne Denman (Coordinator) for ensuring that students had the best opportunity to compete at the Provincial Championships.

As the Senior High Golf Commissioner, I want to thank all the coaches, AD's, Schools, Phil Bridges and volunteers for making this all possible. Doing my job is so much easier and enjoyable thanks to everyone pitching in to assist with any tasks that I need assistance with.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE FUTURE

A) Maintain the administration of the qualifiers and championships through the Golf Commissioner.

B) I believe that golfers should and need to play more than one qualifying 18 hole tournament to prepare for the Championships. Playing one tournament in 6 weeks is not suitable if we expect to see good scores. We used to have to play at least twice so we could get an average score – a better way to get ready! Cost is a factor as is time required to play. I suggest we form a committee to examine this. Maybe one 18 hole round and some 9 hole rounds?

C) All qualifiers must be played on Tuesday, Thursday or Saturday to assist the smaller schools and their limited number of athletes.

D) What is the cause of "No Shows" at the Provincials. I don't think that this is a problem on most other PEISAA Team Championships.

E) Plan dates/locations for Qualifiers and Championships by June 1, 2024 at the latest.

F) Some Basic RULES/EDIQUETTE of GOLF need to be taught to players to help speed up play.

G) Perhaps coaches could be doing some work with students that want to play next year – current players or newbies. A long term plan!

H) What can we do to increase the number of female golfers in our Championships?

PEISAA Intermediate Golf Provincial Championships

The PEI Intermediate Golf Championships were held at Avondale Golf Course on October 11th, with 57 individual players and 24 scramble teams participating in both the male and female competitions. Avondale was once again our host venue, with Connor Lea and his staff providing tremendous help and the course was in great shape once again. With not many players having Avondale as their home course, it makes for the perfect location for hosting these events. We were lucky to have great weather, very solid play from the golfers, and lots of help from the coaches and volunteers at the course.

The boys had a very close race with M. E. Callaghan winning the individual event and coming second in the scramble portion of the tournament. Birchwood was a very close second with a third and fourth in the individual event and then coming first in the scramble portion of the tournament. Birchwood beat out M.E. Callaghan by retrogression in the scramble, and East Wiltshire placed third.

Birchwood Intermediate won the girl's tournament with a first, second, and third-place finish in the individual event and a third-place finish in the team portion of the tournament. East Wiltshire won the scramble portion of the tournament with Belfast coming a close second winning by regression over Birchwood.

The numbers seem to be very similar from last year for the Provincial Championships, with the boys having 33 for individual play and 54 players for the scramble. The girls had 24 for individual play and 18 players for the scramble. Unfortunately, female participation was down in the zone qualifiers, especially in the western areas, with no scrambles teams entered from zone one. With no golf course in the area, this could easily be a reason for participation dropping this year, and in the future, but it would be great to get some representation from all areas next year.

We changed the scramble portion up this year with them playing in 6somes (two teams of three per group). This allowed each team to be aware of their score as well as their opponent's score. Scrambles are always tricky in finding the right format, but it seemed to run very well and the pace of play was not an issue.

We did have an unfortunate mishap with a school signing for a higher score than they had, which caused them to finish third. It is important to write down your opponent's score as well as your own so you can compare when finished.

Thanks to Phil Bridges for helping out and answering all my questions and making everything run smoothly.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

All Intermediate and Senior High medal games were held in one location. This continues to be a great idea and created a better Championship experience for fans, players and coaches. With the increased numbers of games this year compared to last, we did struggle to sometimes find officials to cover games. Instead of cancelling games we did have officials do games by themselves, more that last season. I know we don't want to cancel games, but we don't want the number of games officiate by 1 official to become too great. Something we need to consider when we schedule games. I received too many reports of technical / unsportsmanlike fouls in my opinion, especially at the Senior High Level. We had a total of 50 Technical Fouls and 53 Unsportsmanlike fouls at the Senior High Level . Also, 23 Technical fouls and 27 Unsportsmanlike fouls at the Intermediate level. I am concerned about the behavior of some of our coaches and players. I think the PEISAA needs to consider a coaching course that focuses on expectations from coaches in an educational setting. We could consider dropping 1 mandatory course we have in place now and implement redefining winning as a mandatory course. Perhaps reevaluate the number of technical/unsportsmanlike fouls a players/coaches receives before receiving a suspension. Another suggestion is, we encourage the AD's to be around the first few home games played in their gym so they can curb any unsporting behavior from their fans, setting the tone for unacceptable behavior. The officials were much more diligent this year to report technical and unsportsmanlike fouls.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

1. 20 pt rule for Play-offs / Regular season . Should be in Policy Handbook

2. Continue to ensure the officials know the importance of reporting all technical and unsportsmanlike fouls be reported to the assignor/ commissioner .

3. That our coaches are required to take a course that expresses the importance of proper behaviour in an educational setting.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

Each Qualifier got underway around 9:45am and finished around 3pm. This format was great and I would like to see it continue when we have large participation numbers. 4. General Comments

2023 - 2024 was the first "normal" post COVID season that saw the return of school teams to off Island competition at Kings Edgehill and Sackville High in NS as well as events in NB. We had great interprovincial results and we're looking forward to more schools attending off Island events next season. At the Provincials, wrestling took place on 2 mats and the total competition ran about 3.5 hours. There were no injuries and medical care was provided by Sports Centre Physio. New for 2024: we implemented the best 2 of 3 format for weight classes that only had 2 competitors as well as more clearly defined "team" with a long term plan of aligning with other PEISAA sports. Both were well received.

Scheduling the event is always tricky with Nationals and other sports. We were impacted by an off Island Rugby tournament this year at the high school level. With the late March Break / early Easter, we had no wiggle room for dates as zone competitions had to take place first and many coaches / officials / athletes were out of province for Nationals the week after Easter.

It was our third attempt at grouped weight classes. Wrestlers kept their weight from zones and stayed in the same groupings whenever possible. A few minor grouping changes were made. For example: if a wrestler dropped out which resulted in someone have no matches, groups were reconfigured to ensure wrestlers would have matches. Thank you to Tim Murphy, our head drawmaster, for working tirelessly to have a draw that works!

It's a priority to establish another 1-2 elementary programs in the Charlottetown area and western PEI.

A special - likely once in a lifetime occurrence - we came together as a group to do a large group photo to send our well wishes to Hannah Taylor, who'll be competing in Paris 2024 Olympics this summer. She got her start in wrestling through the PEISAA. I'm proud to say I will be there to cheer her on in person!

5. Recommendations for improving the sport:

Continue to use grouped weights

Continue to compete in SSNS and NBIAA

Continue to support new & existing programs with equipment loan (mats, scales, clocks), coaching development, officials development and camps.

Increase participation numbers & add new schools (worth noting it's almost equal male / female). Charlottetown Rural has indicated they are planning to add a team which will be huge for the Ch'town area.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

The PEISAA provincial badminton championships were held April 23 to April 27, 2024. This year, 5 Summerside and area schools were used, along with Bluefield for Mixed Doubles.

Championship titles in Novice, Bantam, Intermediate, Juvenile and Senior boys' and girls' categories were all up for grabs in singles, doubles and mixed play. Most of our Island schools were represented in zone playoffs, with the top two from the four zones advancing to the provincials in Novice, Bantam and Intermediate. In Juvenile, Senior and Mixed categories, there were East and West regional events to decide who went to Provincials.

In the Senior Men's final, Braden Bruce of Colonel Gray avenged his loss in the final last year by defeating Jack Wen in a long battle 21-23, 22-20 and 21-17 to win the provincial title. Vinett Nagapuri from Colonel Gray also needed three sets to defeat Reece Gallant of Westisle 21-15, 11-21 and 21-16 to claim the senior boys bronze medal. In doubles action, Colonel Gray claimed 2 of the 3 top positions. Brayden Bruce teamed up with Desmond Cunniffe defeated Jonas Binkley and Zach Connell from Three Oaks 21-10 and 21-15 to win the gold. The bronze medal was won by Gray as well. Caira Duong and Jonathon Truong from Gray defeated Kyle Yao and Faisal Ahmadi of Charlottetown Rural 21-17 and 21-17 in an entertaining match. With a first and third in singles and a first and third in doubles, Colonel Gray easily won the Provincial Championship with 14 points.

In girls' action, Colonel Gray had the three top senior women's singles players. Sushmita Kolloju defeated Khadija Kubra 21-8 and 21-15 to win the Senior Women's Provincial Singles Championship. Lily MacVicar of Gray defeated Kayla Storey of Bluefield 21-7 and 21-19 to claim the bronze medal. In the doubles Sushmita Kolloju teamed up with Sherry Xi to defeat Rachel MacFadyen and Mava Gauthier of Bluefield 21-6 and 21-5. Abby Peters and Haven Woodside of KISH defeated Katelyn Brothers and Madelyn Brothers of Montague 21-16 and 21-18 to claim the bronze medal. By coming first, second and third in singles, along with a first in doubles, Colonel Gray won the provincial championship with 15 points.

Senior Mixed Doubles champions this year are Sherri Xi and Vineet Nagapuri of Gray. They defeated their teammates Khadija Kubra and Desmond Cunniffe of Gray 21-16, 11-21 and 21-16 to win the title. Rebekah McGeogheghan and Kayden Kelly of Rural defeated Kayla Storey and Jordan Noble of Bluefield 18-21, 21-9 and 21-4 to win the bronze medal. Colonel Gray wins the senior mixed provincial title with 8 points.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

This year was the sixth year for regional qualifiers in the juvenile and senior divisions. The schedule was very similar to past years. We are now at a point where the schedule works and there will only need to be minor adjustments made each year.

This year we used google sheets to do our regional qualifiers and double elimination draws. I set them up and shared them with the AD's from the schools involved. In most cases the scores were put right on the google draw and this way the other AD's could follow along and I could get instant results. Next year we may use Google sheets to do our senior high badminton provincials draw.

This was the second year of our new provincial tiebreaker in badminton. In the past, we have had times where up to 4 schools have tied for a provincial championship. We used it in two categories this year where we had a tie for a team championship. It was quick to use and is a better solution than having multiple championship schools.

Just like the past few years, this badminton season was unique. Basketball season ended later this year which left us with less time for tryouts and the provincials were still the last weekend of April. This led to a conflict with the annual band trips to Halifax, but we were able to work around it. We moved senior mixed to the Thursday of the week for the second year in a row as many badminton players were away on this date. The usual Thursday pool play looks like it may be on Tuesday's from now on. The switch of pool play to Tuesday and mixed to Thursday enabled band players to play badminton this year unless they wanted to play mixed doubles.

Having players report scores at Provincials after every game worked very well in the draws that I ran this year. I recommend that it is used at zone play as well. It is great to see that the players are aware of how important scores are. There is also a group of P.E. teachers who have become very efficient at doing PEISAA tie breakers. This is very important in regional and zone play as well as in pool play at provincials.

I was able to get zone 2/4 to look very similar this year. They each had pool play and then a double elimination. Zone 1 has fewer numbers and does something similar but zone 3 is still the outlier. Zone 3 does pool play but does not do it the week before like the other zones and still does single elimination. Hopefully the calendar works in our favour next year so all 4 zones can align.

This year we were in the Summerside area and next year we will be back to the Charlottetown area. Bluefield has become the host of the mixed championships and having a school in the middle of the province hosting this championship in one evening is working very well. I think that moving back and forth between the two largest areas in the province for all singles and doubles events is the way to run the championship. It also aligns with many of our other sports championship formats.

Lastly, this was the seventh year for Yonex as a sponsor. Thanks to Yonex for being our badminton sponsor and for the great prizes they give us.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

This year was another good year on the field for high school rugby on PEI. Players, coaches, referees, and Athletic Directors put in many hours of hard work to continue the tradition of high caliber high school rugby. I'd like to thank Phil Bridges, School Sport Coordinator, for his support and work behind the scenes to ensure that the season was successful. Another thank you goes to Anthony Scott, as Referee Assignor. Thank you to Walter MacEwen for his work maintaining the PEISAA website. For anyone not mentioned above that had a hand in this season's success thank you!

High school rugby coaches continue to be required to complete NCCP's Safe Sport and Making Head Way modules, as well as World Rugby's Rugby Ready. These courses are an excellent starting point for coach education and development.

This season, pre-season scrimmages took place once again for all A teams and any AA or AAA teams that had not taken part in pre-season tournaments. These scrimmages have been a great addition, with coaches being encouraged to be on the field throughout. I would argue that these scrimmages are equally as valuable to pre-season scrimmages at preparing players for the season.

This year, the level in both the women's and men's A leagues was excellent. In the women's league, Charlottetown Rural proved to be quite dominant, eventually winning the final 30-5. This year, the men's A league saw the return of Westisle's men's program, finishing 3rd in the regular season standings and 4th in the playoffs. Charlottetown Rural and Colonel Gray separated themselves during the regular season, and eventually met in the final with Colonel Gray winning 24-17 in overtime.

This year also saw the return of AA regular season competition, with 10s being the variation played. On the women's side, Charlottetown Rural, Montague and Westisle faced off in a home-and-home regular season. Montague was dominant all season long, eventually winning the championship 26-5. On the men's side, Montague and Kensington also played a home-and-home regular season schedule. Their season was a very close battle, which resulted in Montague scoring a last minute try to win 19-15 in the championship game.

This year also saw the addition of AAA reserves exhibition games. In these games, AA teams faced off against teams that were made up of AAA reserve players and some top A players. While a few teams struggled to field reserve teams, the on-field result was excellent and very helpful to the AA teams.

The women's AAA league was interesting this year. Three Oaks struggled with injuries all season, and as a result the regular season standings did not necessarily reflect the full-strength ability of each team. As a result of this, Charlottetown Rural went undefeated in the regular season, only to come up against a healthy Three Oaks team in the semis. In the playoffs, Bluefield and Three Oaks ended up battling it out in the final with Bluefield coming out on top 14-3. In the AAA men's league, Bluefield was dominant all season long. The other three teams were very closely matched with Charlottetown Rural eventually facing Bluefield in the final. Bluefield performed once again and won the championship game in convincing fashion, 29-7.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

This year the East flag football leagues continued with an A/AA league for both boys and girls. Games continued to be played mostly on Monday for AA girls and AA boys, Tuesday for A girls and A boys were on Thursday nights. This was the first year for a high school league. It was played on Wednesday nights, which took away Wednesday nights from the junior high schedule.

This was not ideal as we lose one Monday for Victoria Day. It also put all AA games on Monday which caused a busy schedule on Mondays. It is great to see flag in high school, but it would be hard to give up another night as the schedule is already jam-packed.

The Senior high league was implemented as a pilot project this year and was a big success. The caliber of flag football was very good, and it looks like it will continue again next year as a school sport. It may expand slightly but will still stay on one night.

This may have been the best year in memory for weather for flag football as we only had to cancel part of one night of an A girls schedule due to rain. The A/AA provincials were both held on Tuesday June 11 in Summerside. The senior high was also held on the CUP turf as well on June 5. This continues to be a great location for the provincials. The level of flag football at provincials was outstanding this year. All 6 leagues had 4 outstanding teams at provincials.

The East schedule this year was split between the Cornwall turf and François Buote. Thanks to the Town of Cornwall (Kim Meunier) and François Buote (JP Gallant and Mitchell Caissy) for their cooperation with field usage this year. The senior high league was divided between the CUP turf and Bluefield. Thanks to the City of Summerside and Darryl Boudreau for their cooperation.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

This year we had quite a few new officials join. This helps the sport to grow and improve. We need to continue to recruit new officials so we can have two officials for each game and three in playoff games. This year we had 2 officials on 90% of the junior high games. There were always two officials on senior high games. Whenever possible, we should attempt to have as many games being played on the turf field. However, referee availability needs to be there to accomplish this. The 3:40 start time is tough to get 4-6 officials to the turf.

This year we did not use the Longworth fields. We used the turf and Francois Buote to run the junior high league. As mentioned above, the CUP turf and Bluefield were used to run the senior high schedule. I was able to secure some more turf time later in the evening this year. Hopefully we can do this again next year as the game is meant to be played on turf, especially at the AA level. There were some small issues with some rough spots on the Bluefield field that may have to be looked at for next year.

Mouth guards and shorts without pockets became mandatory this year. Numbers need to be put on the front and back of all jerseys next year. Poppers were also used for the first time with great success. The game continues to evolve and improve every year.
