EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT - 2005-06

The 2005-2006 school athletic year has been one of transition, the office has been moved to Summerside and the Association was granted a full time Executive Director position. This marks the first time in the 44 year history of the PEI School Athletic Association, that the Executive Director position has not been shared, in some way, with another position within the Department of Education. Based on evaluations completed by the membership and the Dept of Education the change has been met with positive reviews. At this time I can announce that the Department of Education support will remain in place for the 2006-2007 school year.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Laura Lee Noonan, Student Services Co-ordinator with the responsibility of overseeing the PEISAA. Her proactive approach to school athletics has allowed the Association to create this position and over the next year enhance the delivery of programs to the membership.

Dale has provided highlights of the the past year so rather than repeat them I will try to look into the future and update where we would like the Association to be in the next few years.

Although there have been a few communication glitches in the last year, I think, the move to e-mail communication only has been very positive. This can only improve as the school's Athletic Directors gain better access and begin to feel confident with their use of the technology that will become available to them. Next year I will return to the issuing of quarterly reports but they will be in an e-format rather than in hard copy that had been used in the past.

The website continues to be an important information tool, the PEISAA Executive is in the planning stages of re-tooling the website to create an even more user friendly platform.

Hopefully, you will see improvements soon. At this time I must thank Randy Cheverie and Shane MacLure for the work they have done to keep the website updated, it is work that is continuous and time consuming, the expectation is that the improvements will make their work easier.

The PEISAA continues to seek out more corporate sponsorship and I can announce today that we have reached an agreement with UPEI that will allow our students more exposure to the university's facilities and will help us to enhance our program delivery. More details will follow as they are worked through. Special thanks to Milk Sport for renewing their support, it has been a great relationship. As well, I would like to thank the Credit Unions of PEI, Source for Sport, PaperFlow, Comfort Inns and Dominos for continuing to support our student athletes.

I would like to thank the Executive for the time they have volunteered to facilitate and in particular I would like to recognize Gord Wilson and Jeff Squires for the passion and commitment they have brought to the Board, both are moving on to other endeavours.

Dale McIsac has been a strong leader for school sport and I look forward to another year with Dale at the helm. He has been instrumental in cultivating a positive relationship with the high school Principals that has engaged this group in helping to plan the strategic direction of the PEISAA.

In closing, I would like to recognize the Athletic Directors and the Sport Commissioners for the leadership they have provided. Your influence on the student athletes of the Province is substantial and is providing a positive impact on the children and young adults you administrate. School sport continues to be a major contributor to the education of a vast number of PEI's students thanks to your efforts.

Thanks were extended to Kim Gallant, Brian Newcombe and Andrew MacAdam for their help with the Track and Field Championships. He noted that Track and Field needs to be restructured, as it is now it makes a very long day.

Also the SAA has received a letter from Colin MacAdam seeking over 100 volunteers for the Canada Games.

4. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

1. Match Report Forms are not always faxed to the Commissioner immediately after each match. Official score sheets are not always mailed to the Commissioner. League standings were difficult to keep up to date due to missing Match Result Forms

I recommend that the Internet be adopted as everybody's primary method of communication (Commissioner, Coaches, Athletic Directors, Officials, Assignors, etc.).

I recommend that all Athletic Directors take the responsibility to help verify the accuracy of all match results on the Internet web site and commit to reading and replying to e-mails on a daily basis.

I recommend that the League Standings be added to the web site and updated on a regular basis throughout the season to avoid last minute corrections prior to Provincials.

2. The volleyball season begins immediately as school resumes in September and Provincials are held on the first weekend in November. This 8 1/2 week season is too short to adequately select teams, train athletes,

compete in league play and strategize for the Provincial Playoffs.

The quality and level of volleyball is being negatively affected by this short season, placing Island volleyball athletes in a vulnerable spot when trying to improve their skills in hopes of being selected for Canadian University teams and affecting PEI volleyball performances at National competitions, including Canada Games.

When this short PEI High School season is compared to the PEI Junior High season (9 1/2 - 10 1/2 week seasons), the Nova Scotia volleyball season (13 1/2 week season), and the PEI High School basketball season (17 1/2 week season), it is obvious that our volleyball players and the development of this great sport is at a disadvantage.

Since the current PEISAA Constitution and Policy states that the Senior Volleyball A and AA Leagues are to hold their Provincial Championships on the 3rd Friday of November, I recommend that we return to this original schedule adopted to allow for a more adequate team selection process prior to the first game, more practices between league games, and more time to develop technical skills.

3. Teams played an imbalanced schedule with a combination of games worth two or four points. I recommend that all teams play a home and home game against each team in their division instead of playing 4 point games.

4. Young athletes are developing bad technical habits as officials are being less severe on ball handling calls.

I recommend officials to call players on technical errors (carries, double touches, net violations, etc.) more often to help them develop better skills and a better understanding of the game. This will inevitably better prepare Island High School students for competition at the University level

5. Note of Appreciation

The success of this Senior Volleyball season was, without a doubt, a team effort.

I want to express my gratitude for all of Garth Turtle's work and support as PEISAA Executive Director to whom I turned to when I didn't know where else to turn. 4. GENERAL COMMENTS

The season began in mid November with the "scheduling meeting". This was at the House of Sport in Charlottetown. In attendance were the Athletic Directors, Garth Turtle, and myself. It was decided to go with a seeding system with the top 5 ranked teams, at the end of the regular schedule, competing for the "AAA" championship and the next six ranked teams (7-12) competing for the "AA" championship. Each team was asked to schedule a minimum of 12 games against at least five different teams.

The playoff structure would have #4 host #5 with the winner playing #1 in a semifinal while #3 would play #2 in the other semifinal. The winners would play, at UPEI, for the "AAA" gold and the losers for the "AA" bronze, at Gray. In the "AA", team #9 would host #10 and #8 would host #11 in a quarterfinal and the winners would play at #6 and #7 in semifinal games leading to the medal games at UPEI. And Gray.

The league commenced on November 21 with thirteen women's teams and 15 men's teams. Unfortunately, Kinkora were forced to withdraw from the men's division during the season.

A 5 person seeding committee was established to rate the 2 divisions, Garth Turtle, Darryl Gaudet, Lee Forbes, Brett Wood and myself met 4 times during the season and seedings were published based on the results of these meetings.

The regular season ended on Feb 24th, with the quarterfinals starting on March 1st. The Bronze medal games were played at Gray on March 4th and the Gold medal games were played on March 6th and 7th at UPEI Cantor Games Field House. Close to 200 games were played throughout the season and the PEISAA

The season concluded with the annual SUBWAY allstar banquet and games. These were held at Col Gray on Thursday March 9th. This event was well received with both games decided on the final possession.

As a first year Commissioner, I believe this season went extremely well. This was due to the efforts of all involved, players, coaches, and officials, especially the following.

Garth Turtle and his staff at the PEISA office, they actually do all the work

Rick, Rob and Peter for the efficient work they did assigning officials

All officials, I never received one complaint

Athletic Directors, thanks to the use of email communications worked effectively

Chris Huggan, for hosting the Bronze medal and Allstar games

Dale McIsaac, for his support

Janice Robertson, for the great coordination at UPEI

Milk Sport and Dominos Pizza, things would not work without there support

Subway, the allstar night is a great event that would not go without this support.

A final note:

The league format is determined by the Athletic Directors, at there scheduling meeting in November, I suggest that all coaches direct all concerns to the Athletic Directors well before this meeting, so that we can prepare for any major changes that might need to occur.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

1. We continue with the seeding set up as we did this year. I hope to put on paper the procedure we will follow to determine the rankings. I believe we should have the top teams competing for our top title and that teams be given the opportunity to play more games at their appropriate skill level.

2. We should look at eliminating the terms "AAA" and "AA". With our current seeding set up, classification of teams is not determined until after the final seedings at the end of the season. I suggest we go with Provincial Division 1 and 2 Championships

3. Game report forms have to be completed better. Athletic Directors need to check these over, all players have to be included and points have to match actual game results.

4. All tournament games, involving Island schools, must be reported to the Commissioner. The more information available to the seeding committee the better the results of the seeding meetings.

5. We remain flexible as to the number of games you play, the number of schools you play, the number of teams who compete for each division and the playoff structure. These may vary from year to year and should be determined by the Athletic Directors at the scheduling meeting each November.

West Royalty collected all four of the team titles handed out at the Provincials. The top 5 scores on each event were used to calculate the team standing. Individual awards were also given to the top 3 vault and floor routines and top 10 all around.

On Saturday morning, the competition finished almost 2 hours late. A total of 115 gymnasts participated with 68 Pre Novice girls and 47 Pre Novice boys. Both team awards went to West Royalty Elementary School.

Our computer program which calculated the results came through for us again. Within minutes of the end of both competitions, the results were handed out.

I would also like to thank Garth, Dale and the PEI School Athletic Association for the great support during this Provincial Championship. Also, thank you to our sponsors and PEI School Milk Foundation for their continuous support. They also provided free chocolate milk for all the competitors. Last, but certainly not least, thank you to Chris Meuse, my co-host. He's a great person to work with and did an outstanding job. Congratulations

Garth also found some sub time to allow us to go over our technical package. Thank you Freddy Martin, Kim Gallant, Jamie Lynn Carr, Natasha Moore and Chris Meuse. Changes will be made for next year. Recommendations will be made before the PEISAA annual meeting for approval by the schools.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

The PEI School Athletic Association Provincial Badminton Championships were held on the weekend at various Summerside and area schools Friday night for the round robin portion of the event with crossovers and finals on Saturday at Three Oaks and Summerside Intermediate School.

Championship titles in Novice, Bantam, Midget, Juvenile, and Senior boys and girls categories were up for grabs. Over 200 athletes from 40 schools across PEI took part. These athletes had competed in zone playoffs with the top two from four zones advancing to the provincials.

Blairfield retained its Senior Boys Provincial Championship, winning both the doubles and **mixed** doubles events. Andrew Woods teamed with Chad McQuaid to defeat Mark Brown and Josh MacPherson of

Charlottetown Rural to win the doubles title while McQuaid and partner Sheila Kerry won over Trent MacAulay and Kelly MacDonald of Montague in mixed. In an impressive senior boys singles final, involving two members of the Canada Games training team, Mark Brown defeated Andrew Woods 15-9, 15 12.

The Senior Girls Provincial Championships was won by Colonel Gray, with Elysia Atkinson winning titles in both singles and doubles. In a very exciting singles final, Atkinson defeated rival Chelsea MacInnis of Three Oaks in three games, 11-9, 7-11, 11-3. The doubles title was won by Atkinson and partner Lisa Moerike, defeating Holly MacInnis and Tiffany Burke of Morell.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

The major concern with the 2006 championships was the continued use of the Black Knight plastic shuttles. Many complaints were made by coaches, players, etc. about the obvious poor quality of the shuttle. From the commissioners standpoint, the shuttles seemed to be worse than last year. Some problems are:

- a) the durability of the shuttle is not as good as comparable shuttles.
- b) the speed control tape coming off during rallies.
- c) the cork on new shuttles being dry and cracked.
- d) the flight and speed of the shuttle being inconsistent.

If the PEISAA plans on the continued use of these shuttles, it is the commissioners belief that Black Knight should be contacted with these concerns. If there is a better quality plastic shuttle, perhaps they could be used. If these concerns cannot be addressed by Black Knight, switching to Mavis 300 shuttles should be looked at.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

The 2006 P.E.I.S.A.A. Wrestling Championships were held April 21st and 22nd at Gulf Shore School in North Rustico. Friday night the Bantam (12-13 yr olds) and Midget (14-15 yr olds) championships were held, while on Saturday the Novice (under 12 yrs of age) championship took place. 244 students from 17 schools across PEI took part in the Provincial Championships.

In the Novice Boys Division 81 athletes from 10 schools competed for over six hours before Tignish Elementary emerged as Provincial Champions with 27 points. Second place went to Montague Consolidated with 20 points while host Gulf Shore was third with 17 points. Five points are awarded for a first place finish three points for second and one point for third in determining team points.

A total of 41 girls competed in Novice Girls Division with Montague Consolidated being declared Provincial Champions with 35 points. Englewood was second with 22 points while Ellerslie was third with 18 points.

58 boys competed in the Bantam Boys Division, ME Callaghan repeated as Champions with 32 points Montague Intermediate was second with 25 points while East Wiltshire was third with 20 points. The Bantam girls Division was won by Birchwood with 18 points, East Wiltshire was second with 15 points and Gulf Shore was third with 10 points.

36 boys competed in the Midget Division. First place went to M.E. Callaghan with 22 points while Montague Intermediate was second with 14 points and Hernewood was third with 10 points. Montague High won the girls Midget Division, Morell was second while Montague Intermediate was third.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

2006 saw the culmination of another very successful and highly competitive season. The following are a few of the highlights:

- The league welcomed Morell High to the competition, competing in the Women's AA division. Under the guidance of Marilo Woods and MJ Webster, the squad had a very successful first season, narrowly losing to Montague in the league final.
 - As a result of the ever increasing level of play across the league, parity was at an all time high in almost all divisions. Scores were generally close and playoff positions came down to the last day of the season. 5 of the 6 championship games were decided by 10 points or less, with two going into overtime.
 - The PEI Rugby Union was able to use the league to introduce a couple of new officials to the game, as well as provide several younger referees with a larger number of assignments. A sincere thank-you goes out to all coaches for their patience with this ongoing endeavour.
- Sportsmanship and player discipline was at an all-time high, with only a mere 2 red cards and 6 yellow cards

handed out all season. Considering the large number of games offered over 6 divisions, that is a pretty impressive number. No suspensions were levied other than the automatic 1 game for red cards, and in both of those cases, they were very minor offenses. Credit goes out to the coaches for running good programs, and the officials for maintaining control of the games. -

- The league experimented with a new playoff format for A rugby in which semi-finals and finals were played on the same day. This experiment would have to be considered a success. By eliminating an extra playoff day both the strain on the officials pool and travel costs to the schools were reduced. The two games in one day also stayed consistent with regular season play.

- The league also experimented with new substitution rules. Officials and most coaches seem to prefer this system as it fulfilled its dual purpose of speeding up the game while still allowing for player development.

- Pool player rules were more clearly defined, making it easier for the league to manage and resulting in less confusion and inquiries from schools.

- I would like to send out a round of thank-you's to the following from myself and on behalf of the PEISAA:

- Officials assignor Sean Cain for doing the most thankless job in the league! Well done and very organized.

- The Phys Ed departments at TOSH, Montague and Bluefield for top notch provincial championship hosting.

- All of the players, coaches and officials for maintaining our reputation as one of the best high school rugby leagues in Canada.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

As commissioner, I would like to make the following recommendations for consideration for the 2007 season:

- Future commissioners and officials assignors continue to use and regularly update as needed the PEISAA High School Rugby Policies and Guidelines document. This document was created by past commissioner Sean Cain and is a very useful tool.

- Maintain the modified A playoff format, substitution rules and pool player guidelines.

- I would like the AD's to take a long look at the AA division. Over the course of the season, several concerns were raised over some teams suitability for this level, both from the upper and lower ends. After officiating and watching a number of games in this division, as well as the upper AAA division, I would recommend that rugby adopt a similar league structure to that of the PEISAA basketball league. Under this system, every team would play in the same division and split into AAA and AA at playoff time, whereby the lower tier teams compete for the AA title, and the upper tier compete for the AAA. This system would ensure that teams are competing at a level appropriate for their ability which, in many cases, is very hard to determine prior to the start of league play.

As a final request, I would ask that all schools ensure that they are represented at the annual pre-season coaches meeting. Should a school choose not to be represented at this meeting, I would suggest that they forfeit the right to complain about rule changes made during this meeting.

Recommendations by Officials assignor Sean Cain:

- Move to a two official system for all AAA games whereby the second official would be a touch judge. This second TJ official could also be a junior TJ, which could be an experienced rugby person not necessarily certified to be an official.

- Assignor's fee be raised to \$2/game, considering they have now adopted a centralized billing system.

4. GENERAL COMMENTS

- a) we had 8 boys teams this year - 4 from each zone
- b) we had 4 girls teams participating - 2 from each zone
- c) we increased the number of players by one in each of the boys and girls participants
- d) boys played 18 holes this year as opposed to 9 last year - good move
- e) girls played 9 holes with some difficulty - skill level was the difference
- f) all boys completed their round in under 4 hours and 15 minutes - GREAT!
- g) there existed a wide range of skill levels amongst the girls
- h) students were on their best behavior both on and off the course and should be commended!
- i) all players registered to play showed up on time to play
- j) we utilized an "Andersons Creek Environmental Drop Area" which assisted in players keeping the pace
- k) we decided on "Stroke Control" for the girls - a maximum of 12 strokes/hole. This was successful for 3 of the 5 groups.
- l) Stonepark has team tryouts in the Fall of the year after the students have played all summer - results over the last couple of years indicate that this seems to work. Call Norm!!
- m) too many conflicts with Fall sports to switch golf to the Fall

5. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVING SPORT

Schools need to meet in early April to set their qualifying schedule for the Spring.
All schools/students must participate in a minimum of 2 qualifying tournaments per zone.
The site for the Provincial Championship will be announced prior to the schools meeting.
The date for the Championship could be moved a week earlier to permit a rain date if required.
Is there any support for a tournament for all schools to attend at the site of the championships? This could be a different format - ie alternate shot, best ball etc?

We need to discuss whether to hold both boys and girls championships at the same time and location.
Coaches need to meet early in the Spring to set up the schedule of qualifying tournaments.
Staff or school representatives need to identify themselves to the Site Manager as a preventative measure.

We have had some staff/parents come with the players but due to other commitments had to leave prior to the finish. Other staff/parents may now be in charge but the manager needs to know who to contact in case of an emergency. This personnel must be accessible at all times.

Schools hosting qualifying tournaments are responsible for sending in all results for all schools within 24 hours of the tournament.

Coaches need to ensure that students that they bring to qualifying tournaments possess an adequate skill level. This can be done by conducting practices as in every other sport.

Staff are required to supervise players during the provincials.

There is a need to update the tie breaking formula to be consistent with the RCGA.

Guidelines for etiquette, golf rules and practice requirements need to be developed.

Skill level of girls needs a boost - suggestions?

We need to promote the sport more - an article in the papers at the beginning of the golf season would be beneficial

Schools that hold qualifying tournaments should make the results available to the press - emphasis should be on participation highlighting good scores and the FUN of golf.
